

# PRESIDENT'S REPORT

This season, not only do we have a Premiership to show for our hard work, but three teams played finals. It's been a great 2013/14 season with the highlights being 3rd Grade Premiers! 1st and 3rd Grade Minor Premierships in the regular season and Under 24's making the Semi's for the first time in 5 years. Not to mention MUCC finishing 5th on the Club Championship ladder after finishing 13th last season.

First Grade finished the regular season as Minor Premiers on 62 points with 10 wins 3 losses and 1 draw. A huge effort especially as first points weren't won until round 3. Unfortunately, the boys went out in straight sets after tight losses to Burwood and Warringah, both of whom played in the 1st grade Grand Final. Hopefully, the boys will back up next season and go one step further. The highlights of the season Udit Mehta who snared 42 wickets from 15 games in 1's and Nigel Castelino with 435 runs at 43.50 with a top score of 101\* against Lane Cove.

Second grade finished 8th at the end of the regular season on 38 points which is an excellent result considering that first points were not won until round 8. The highlight of the season was Hari Sankar who topped the run aggregates with 418 runs and a top score of 104\* against Lane Cove. Leading the bowling attack was Giyan Dharmadasa with 18 wickets at 23.06. Well done to Charlie for taking the captaincy and we hope to see all members of the second grade team back next season.

Third Grade finished the season as Premiers! The minor premiership was achieved on the last game of the regular season against Southern Districts. Highlights throughout the season include Greg Brown playing his 400th match for MUCC and taking his 1000th wicket. Browny topped the wicket takers list with 45 wickets at a ridiculous average of 15.09. Another highlight was Ovais Idris taking 10/71 vs. Auburn in Round 3. In the post-season we defeated Strathfield outright, Burwood and Epping in three tight matches to win the coveted J.B Hollander Trophy our first time since 1994-95. On behalf of the committee we would like to thank everyone who came down to help and watch third grade during their finals campaign.

Fourth grade finished 7th on 58 points! How that doesn't get you a semi- final birth I don't know! Well done to Phil and the lads for a huge effort throughout the season! The boys finished with two outright wins and a first innings victory in the last three games to come within a whisker of making sixth place. Leading wicket-taker was Sam Bolton with 20 and special mention must be made of the ex-President Paul Clift with his double hat-trick against Strathfield in Round 7.

Fifth grade had a disappointing season and finished out of finals contention although there were some great individual efforts including club stalwart Tony Barnes century 113\* against the Kirribilli Crusaders and Jacques Visser as the leading wicket taker.

Under 24's finished 6th in the regular season and made the semis for the first time in 5 years, unfortunately losing to Warringah. Well done to John Salmond in his first year of captaincy. I hope all the 24's lads can stick around for the club for several seasons and continue to develop their skills as a tight unit.

Masters had an interrupted season with rain affecting the back end of the draw. They finished sixth and will hopefully get more games with all our regulars returning for another season under their belt next season.

MUCC finished 5th in the Club Championship on 1140 points 20 points behind 4th, a big improvement on last year were we finished 13th. Well the season is over and I am proud to say that the club has exceeded all expectations. However this is no time to rest on our laurels. We need to continue to keep working hard at pre-season training which will be starting in July 2014.

Under 24s came back from a wooden spoon year to finish 6th in the table and play finals cricket. This was all the more impressive given there was not a substantial change in personnel.

4th grade suffered a similar heart break to last season, missing out on finals cricket by 1 point this time around, despite picking up 27 out of 27 in the last 3 rounds. Their total of 57 points was good enough for 2nd place in 1st grade.

Thanks to all the skippers for their efforts during the year too, it's no mean feat keeping things going on and off the field, so well done.

A special mention to Simon Fairlie for organising our biggest fundraising exercise of the year which yielded over \$8,000 for the club. We will hopefully be doing the 'radio ears' thing for years to come, and I highly recommend it to anyone who wants to contribute to the club and get a free ticket to the test matches.

On a personal note, after 12 years on committee, 2 as Secretary, and 5 as President it is time for me to step away from the admin of the club and let some fresh energy lead us on to our next chapter. A few people have my eternal thanks and praise for all their work and help over the past years with me. Tim Morrow, Simon Fairlie, Warren Montford and Ross McIntyre, without you lot, I think I probably would have gone completely insane at some point. A single word doesn't seem enough, but to heap the just praise on you would take volumes, so I will simply say thanks. You all know how much the time you gave to the club meant to me and I look forward to spending some time having beers with you in the future, hopefully celebrating the clubs success. Season 2013-14 saw MUCC's finances go 'back in black'. A great effort from everyone on the Committee contributed to this pleasing year financially.

Prior to the season commencing the Committee highlighted that there needed to be a renewed focus on collecting fees from players prior to the season starting. A new fee structure was trialled this year with significant savings for early payment and easier payment methods via EFTPOS. On a personal note, in my time at the club this was the most successful collection of fees prior to a season starting and members should be congratulated.

Macquarie University also received payment of sponsorship monies owed from previous years and we renegotiated our sponsorship arrangement with our main sponsor The Ranch.

MUCC was fortunate to be given a lucrative fundraising opportunity from MUCC legend Dave Deller. Working with Simon Fairlie, Dave's company gave MUCC members the opportunity to sell radio "ears" at the January Sydney Ashes test match. Other highlights saw MUCC reduce its long term debt by \$5000.00 and an effort to reduce operating costs by a sponsorship deal with Rebel which allowed for the purchase of balls at cost price.

We are well placed to build on this platform in the coming years. My thanks to all on Committee. It was a huge effort this season in which everyone contributed. Special thanks go to fellow Executive committee members Pete Saliba and Paul Clift for their help and tireless efforts and to Stephen Rose for his help throughout the season preparing and recording the accounts.

# **CAPTAIN'S REPORT – 1ST GRADE SHIRES**

Reflecting on our previous season I can honestly say that there has been a massive turn-around in belief and form from the Ones. We had incredibly close last over wins against Strathfield, Georges River (T20) and Roseville which provided the impetus for the batterings we gave Auburn, Epping, Linfield, Georges River (one day), Pennant Hills, Lane Cove and this culminated in an outright win against the hapless South Sydney outfit (first outright win by a first grade Macquarie team for a number of years).

Ending the season as minor premiers from bottom of the table in one year was the crowning moment for this group as by the time finals cricket turned up the jitters set into the batting line up and we were knocked out in straight sets.

There were a number of team and individual highlight performances to note this year including Udit's 42 wickets (including four 5 wicket bags), all top five batsmen scoring more than 350 runs (including two 100s and fourteen 50s) and seven greater than 100 run partnerships.

We came from the cellar dwellers of last year to dominate the round robin phase as a team sharing the load with all individual players stepping up when needed. There will be great expectations for a repeat performance next year.

At the beginning of the season I said that we had the ability to surprise the rest of the competition and that no one would expect us to win a game, let alone make a final series. I was right- our opposition were turning up expecting us to roll over and hand them 7 points. This team showed a lot of fight throughout the 8 games and that makes me proud.

# Rnd1: MUCC 3/102 def Lane Cove 98 (Northern)- Win

Bowled first on a green, underprepared deck and rolled Lane Cove for 98. It was a great bowling performance from all of the boys. Patto (3/20) and Bolts (2/19 bowled superbly up top with UD (4/23) ripping through the middle order. Burfy (1/22) and Giyan (0/10) bowled well without lucky. On the whole the fielding effort was good until the 9<sup>th</sup> wicket well and we started dropping catches. Luckily for us it only cost about 10-15 runs.

The run chase was slow but that didn't matter because we got there in the end. We slumped to 2/10 very early on and Grellman (28) and Dharmadasa (35\*) steered us to our victory target. It wasn't easy batting as the ball was still seaming in all directions, but the boys toughed it out and we ended up securing our first Frank Gray victory not only for the year, but for most if not all of us, our first 24s victory. This was a big boost of confidence for the group heading into the next game against the Rabbits.

# Rnd 2: South Sydney 68 def by MUCC 171 (Alan Davidson)- Win (B.P)

We won the toss and batted on a pitch which was somewhat tacky. This prompted the umpires to halt play for about 5 minutes, because full balls were bouncing over Salmond's head (isn't that standard?) After play resumed UD showed his class as a batsman, holding our batting up. His 92 saw him bat through most of the innings to steer us to a competitive total. The tail ably supported UD as we scrapped to 171.

Even whilst writing this report, it still confuses me as to why the Souths captain opted for the heavy roller in the lunch interval. In this clever attempt to try and roll out the and make the pitch "flat," he ended up brining more moisture to the surface to be utilised by our seam bowlers. Giyan (5/20) was suburb in this game- outstanding effort. The Souths batsman evidently struggled with his late in-swing. Credit to Patto, UD and Bolts as well who also bowled with great discipline and skill. We rolled Souths for 68 in the most clinical fielding performance I have been involved in. There were zero dropped catches, and the whole team was putting in and working hard – a standard which as MUCC players we should take pride in. At this point in the season, I felt like the team had started to gel very nicely and things were looking positive from here on in.

# Rnd 3: MUCC def by Epping (Northern) - Loss

We played pretty poorly this game. Tim Grellman (36) was the stand out with the bat in a low total of 124. Grell was unlucky to be given out lbw and deserved to score more runs that day in tough batting conditions. Epping were aggressive in chasing this small target – a couple of wicket slowed them down, but they very comfortably passed our target in under 30 overs to gain a bonus point.

This wasn't our best day, but it was a good learning experience for the boys to work out what is needed to take on these top teams.

# Game 4: MUCC 151 def. by Warringah 9/152 (Northern) - Loss

Even though this was a close loss, this was a game which made me a proud captain. Warringah managed to expose our batting once again – we lost 5/10 to be all out 151. UD (46), Marto (31) and Frenchy (20) batted well, but it is up to others to step up and to keep building partnerships.

Warringah as expected came out hard and attacked, but the MUCC men kept hanging in there and fighting hard. Warringah slumped to 4/60 thanks to Patto (4/45) who was brilliant early on. They had a partnership and built to 4/110. A team with less character would have given up at this stage and allow an easy path to victory for the opposition. Giyan was thrown the ball and subsequently clean up Warringah's standin captain and then 2 balls later another Warringah man was out. The next over UD took 2 wickets of his own to have Warringah slump to 8/112. Unfortunately, a few very very close shouts did not go our way and Warringah ended up getting the runs with 1 wicket in hand. Giyan (2/43), Shash (0/21) and UD (2/26) all chipped in. Even though we lost this game, it defined this team's spirit and character and it not only held us in good stead for the remainder of the 13/14 campaign but should hold us in good stead for future seasons.

# Game 5: Strathfield 116 def by MUCC 4/120 (Airey) – Win (B.P)

After Christmas we needed a bonus point win against Stratty who were one of the weaker teams this season. We got the job done. Strathfield were sent in an subsequently rolled for 116. Again, the standard in the field was pretty good as everyone put in and worked hard. All the bowlers chipped in with Shash (3), Patto (2), UD (2), Giyan (1) and Burfy (1) with Bolts being unlucky not to grab one.

The target was comfortably chased down with the loss of 4 wickets. Dharmadasa (29), Grellman (21) and Salmond (19) made the major contributions with the bat. This performance was clinical and kept us in the finals hunt.

Simple equation this game. We had to take 7 points and hope that SDs and Roseville didn't claim BP victories as they had superior quotients. With only 10 players, MUCC rolled Auburn for 61. This clinical bowling and fielding display was awesome and exactly what was required. Every player chipped in and did their job with not one particular player letting the side down. UD (3), Burfy (2) and Giyan (2) were the stand outs with the ball with all the other bowlers like Shash, Flanno, Bolts and Hari chipping in.

The runs were chased down in no time at all. Giyan (21\*) and James Salmond (19) led the way. Results went our way and with 4 wins with 3 BPs we were off to Weldon for a QF the following week.

# QF: Warringah 3/92 v MUCC 90 - Loss

A good learning experience despite being well and truly outplayed by the now four time champions, It wasn't our day and I think our finals inexperience as a team really showed as Warringah were able to keep us under supreme amounts of pressure. After being 3/8, Dharmadasa and John Salmond fought hard with a 39 run partnership, but unfortunately it wasn't enough to see us pass the 100 mark. Warringah chased down the target with ease, ending our 2013/14 campaign.

I'm sure next season, we will take a lot from this game and realise that finals cricket is a different ball game altogether.

Despite the bad ending to our campaign, I am truly very proud of this team. Considering that we were smashed in every single game the previous season, to turn it around with a similar playing group is something that we and the club should be very proud of. Yes, there are a number of things we need to improve going forward, more specifically as a batting group. However, a true indication of whether a team will be successful or not is its character. This group of players have an abundance of ticker and courage and if we continue to work as a team then the club's first Frank Gray Shield is not too far off.

Congratulations to Giyan Dharmadasa for winning the 2013/14 MVP award. You had an outstanding season in this grade and deserve to be recognised for that. Honourable mentions to UD and Sean Patterson who performed very well as well.

I would like to thank all the players for their commitment to Sunday cricket – the successes of this season would never happen without having consistency in the line up week by week. I would also like to thank Pete and the rest of the executive for selecting me as captain. It is a tremendous honour and I'd like to think I have learnt a lot about cricket and leadership this year.

Gents, a premiership in this grade is not far off. This IS the playing group that can achieve it. Let's all keep working hard on our games so we can get the job done.

# 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Captains Report

In terms of results 2013-14 was a backward step for 5th grade. We played B Reserve in the Northern Suburbs competition. With the talent we had available we were perhaps one division too high. We did, however, still enjoy our cricket. A tangible benefit that we provided to the club as a whole is sometimes undervalued. In times of club turmoil and, in the case of this year, club success, 5th grade provides a solid base. When players go missing in tough years we provide the cover. This year when numbers were generally plentiful, 5s provided cricket for those who weren't performing as well as they could, a place to regain form. There were also a few rounds this year where we supplied players to cover in the higher grades. This is as it should be, but it is part of our role within the club, a small but valuable contribution to the success enjoyed this year.

Comparing this year to last year, our bowling got better and our batting went backwards and our fielding was the usual shambles with a few exceptions. There is not one player in the squad who could not improve their fielding. But there are some who really need to work hard on basic skills such as getting their body behind the ball or positioning themselves under catches. It's a captain's nightmare (and the bowler's as well) watching fairly simple catches going down so regularly. I can think of a few games this year that we would have won if not for bad catching. I know this is a common complaint every year but it was especially true for us. So I am going to highlight the standout fielders in our team. They were every bit as important as our best bowlers and batsmen:

- Viplav Vadlamani 9 catches (3 as keeper),
- Wayne Travers 10 catches
- Nasser Yussouf 5 catches,
- Jason Tabrett 4 catches and 1 run out,
- Andy Coey 1 catch 1 run out (in 3 games).

These were the guys who were put in the most important positions on the field. Vijendran (Vijay) Jayaveerasingam was also reliable, while Myles Lego (7 catches) improved all year behind the stumps.

Our batting was a little disappointing. While the opposition bowling was probably of a higher standard this year our application fell. This was not true of our best. Veteran and two day specialist, Tony Barnes (301 runs @ 37.63) led the way. Showing everyone else the importance of concentration, Tony provided stability at the top of the order. The highlight of the year was his 80 over effort against Kirribilli of 113\*. Partnering Tony at the top was Ash Singh (149 @ 16.56). His conversion to opening bat almost complete, Ash also sells his wicket dearly. Viplav (229 @ 19.08) showed flashes of what he can do. He is the most talented bat in the side and when he bats with a little more patience and improves his decision making he will be formidable. Nick Wasiliev (102 @ 25.50) was reliable when available, while Jimmy Campbell (60) and Matt Underwood (52) played solid knocks when down from 4s.

Our bowlers were very good this year and got better as the season went along. Their figures are good but could have been great with a better fielding side. The cliché was true that they provided plenty of chances. Nasser Yussouf (17 wickets @ 14.00) was one of the best seamers in the comp for the third year in a row. He was feared and

respected by all the other teams and he is good enough to play Shires. With a lot of explosive bats to contend with, going at less than 3 an over is a feat. Our spin twins both had stellar years. When we needed crucial wickets the ball was invariably thrown to him and he rarely disappointed. Vijay (17 @ 16.65) took a lot of wickets in clusters and was able to fluster quite a few teams this year. He will get better and hopefully will be back next year. Oliver Fraser (7 @ 16.57) bowled a better length later in the season and should aim to be back in Shires next year. He can bat too. Blake Milligan (13 @ 21.85) kept improving. He opened the bowling this year and most, if not all, of those wickets were top order bats. His swing troubled many fine players and with more consistency he will be a very good bowler.

Fifth grade by its very nature has quite a few players go through it every year. Those that made a contribution this season included Ed Aphaiwongse, James Powell, Jas Singh, Andrew Burford, Greg Widders, Brad Denlow and Adrian Lulka. We could not have had an enjoyable time without their input.

Though we only had 3 wins all were memorable. Beating Northbridge in a two day game was sweet and we also beat finalists, The Pigs, in a low scoring one day match. In seasons where wins are hard to come by it can be a trial playing every week. Not so with this side. We just enjoyed our cricket. A memo to next year's side though. It's even better when you win. Thanks to Tony Barnes who was always on hand when help was needed. Thanks also to Ersko who understood the difficulties faced by lower grade captains. He made things easier. Thanks also to the committee and especially Pete Saliba. What a great year.

# **CAPTAIN'S REPORT – SYDNEY MASTERS**

Fresh from the success of the off-season tour to the UK, this season promised to see the Macquarie Uni Masters return to the form of yesteryear but unfortunately, in a season marred by an unusually large number of washouts, this did not prove to be the case. Only six of the eleven scheduled matches were able to be played, with the team recording four wins and two losses to finish in 6th position out of 20 teams.

Of the few matches that were played, the highlight was the match against Mosman, in which we compiled a competitive 8/170 only to see Mosman pass us 8 down in the second last over. To their credit, Mosman achieved another undefeated season and were very deserved winners of the Masters Premiership for the fourth successive season.

Despite the limited number of matches played, there were some excellent individual performances, mainly with the ball in hand. With only limited opportunities this season, we look forward to dryer conditions for next season and a full season of enjoyable cricket.

As always, special thanks go to Helen Rose for her untiring efforts and wonderful support throughout the year and her unsurpassed skill in capturing the highlights of the season on camera.
