Season 2014-15 was one of the clubs most productive seasons for a long time. MUCC had three teams play semi-final cricket in their respective competitions.

A big thanks to ex- MUCC member Dave Deller for allowing MUCC to sell radio ears at the Sydney Test match and ODI's. This fundraising exercise yielded over \$8,000 for the club. I would also like to thank the Warringah Cricket Club who also provided man power for the days of the test match. We will hopefully be doing the 'radio ears' thing for years to come, and I highly recommend it to anyone who wants to contribute to the club and get a free ticket to the test matches and ODI's.

I look forward to seeing everyone back and refreshed next year.

HONORARY TREASURER'S REPORT

Before I summarise the year that was for MUCC – I would like to personally thank Stephen Rose for his tremendous assistance in my 1st year as Treasurer. Preparing the accounts and recording all financial transactions – Steve worked tirelessly behind the scenes enabling me to spend my time working on our sponsorship portfolio as well as fundraising activities.

Season 2014-15 saw MUCC's finances go from strength to strength as we moved into our strongest financial position for the best part of a decade. A tremendous effort in fee collection saw us collect \$32k in fees (\$5274 up on our previous year's efforts). Easier payment methods such as the leverage of a portable EFTPOS machine as well as heavy discounts for early payment saw fees hitting our bank earlier in the season than normal – enabling us to gain early season discounts on our bulk ball and clothing orders.

This season saw the continuation of our sponsorship agreement with the Ranch. This yielded just over \$5k in sponsorship. However, the biggest fundraising opportunity was our ongoing relationship with Dave Deller and the sale of his company's cricket radio "ears". Dave's company gave MUCC volunteers the opportunity to sell radio "ears" at the January Sydney Test Match as well as a handful of one dayers throughout the summer. A special thanks to Simon Fairlie for his tremendous effort in liaising with Dave, as well as to the handful of volunteers who gave up their time in raising these essential funds for the club. These efforts saw the club raise over \$8000.

Other highlights saw MUCC finalise its long term debt by \$3000 as well as continue its sponsorship loyalty program with Rebel Sport Chatswood – allowing us to purchase match day playing balls at cost price.

2014/15 saw us strike up an agreement with a new player to the club – Amir Nazir – for the procurement of clothing and basic supplies through his cricket supplies company. Amir's company helped us to achieve 40% cost savings on our existing provider and the quality of the gear increase tremendously. It is due to these cost savings that for the upcoming season we have been able to invest in new hessians as well as replacement netting for our Thursday night training sessions.

Moving into next season, we are in an excellent position to build upon this solid platform. Many thanks to the continuing support of the executive as well as the extended committee. Without volunteers a club like ours simply would not exist.

The challenges were mainly around remaining competitive with the fairly new look team, led by our new captain Rehan Anjum joining us from several years of first grade cricket at Mosman. Rehan brought a professional approach with greater expectation with regard to the side's consistency of batting, bowling and fielding. It allowed the less experience team members to step up and challenge their own capabilities – and the results were some extraordinary and outstanding achievements amongst many of the team.

The 2014-15 season saw some of the best team and individual performances in the history of MUCC first grade. Firstly, a club record of 729 runs at 45.56 by Nigel Castelino, supported by Rehan Anjum with 538 runs at 48.91, Prashant Rai (412 runs at 29.43), Amir Nazir, (412 runs at 25.75) and Chris McPherson with 355 runs at 29.58. There were some commendable performances including two century's and six 50s by Nigel as well as Macca's first 1st grade ton, which was almost followed by another against the premiers in the quarter finals. Batting remained the MUCC's strength throughout the season scoring a combined total run count of 3168 which was at least 200 runs more than any other side in the competition. The side consistently put on scores of more than 250 runs against good bowling sides, and set up many 50 and 100 run stands.

On the flipside, it was perhaps the bowling front where the side had its major flaws, particular the ability to break key partnerships with a fiery spell of bowling, or an outstanding catch / run out. This was evident as the top three sides had taken on average 50 more wickets in the same amount of matches. This is where we probably went down in the Semi Finals, having posted a commanding total of 9/285 declared, and having NorthWest 6/169 and yet losing grip. Nevertheless, there is nothing to take away from the bowlers, who no doubt have much more to contribute to the future of first grade cricket. Aamir (17 wickets), Sean Patterson (16) and Shankar Vasudevan (13) had reasonable success on the bowling front, and Tim Morrow played a key role in the finals to get the side into a strong position.

As we reflect back on the season that was, there is much the club can take from it into the future. Firstly, that we remain a strong first grade side as far as the competition is concerned. The rush for finals cricket was intense with many sides in the pursuit, and for MUCC to progress to the Semi Finals and beat the season premiers at the Quarter Final stage was outstanding. Secondly, the importance of having strength in other grades, particularly second grade remains a key part of having stable and consistent performances week in week out. Finally, the way in which the cricket was played was always in the spirit of the game, something that not all sides can vouch for. The next season will have its share of changes, retirements and fresh blood, but can look upon performances in the past two seasons as solidarity to build upon for a future premiership.

Second Grade Report

Much like last season, 2014-15 promised a lot in the build up for 2nd Grade but failed to deliver. After a very encouraging win in Round 1 with several players missing across the Grades we thought we would be among the top sides in 2nd Grade come the season end. Alas, no... and the next 7 rounds saw us defeated 7 times. Some closely, some convincingly.

It would be remiss to blame one particular component for the poor season we endured, however player availability, injuries and players bypassing grades led to 2nd Grade having 5 different Captains at different stages through the season. A staggering 39 players played for 2nd Grade during the 2014-15 season and that is not conducive to consistency or success, and if the Club as a whole is to succeed then it cannot continue.

There were some good wins along the way, Round 1 v North West Sydney, Round 9 v Roseville, and Round 10 v Epping the sum of our points tally. We should have added Round 2 v Mount Pritchard SD's, Round 5 v South Sydney, Round 6 v Strathfield and Round 7 v Pennant Hills at the very least but it wasn't to be and we suffered for it.

I feel a little embarrassed to report that I was leading run scorer in 2nd Grade this year with 245 runs at 24.5, having missed 4 games with a broken finger and playing 1st Grade. The next highest runscore was Steve Rose with 160 from 7 games at 20.00. Marty Payne deservedly led the wickets tally with 21 wickets at 19.76, ably supported by Shash Sharma with 14 wickets at 27.36. Shash deserves recognition for this because he stepped up into the senior bowling role and took it on very well. During the 2015-16 season I have confidence that Shash will be the leading bowler in 2's and/or breaking into 1st Grade regularly.

There is a wealth of talent and ability at the Club so I see no reason why 2nd Grade cannot make the step up next season. Whether that is through players being more available or players from 3rd and 4th Grade making the step up remains to be seen. James Campbell progressed up from 4th Grade all the way to 1st Grade during the season and held his own in 2's with a few good scores. The nucleus of our U24's side should be playing at least 2nd Grade too, with a mix of experienced players in there to get us over the line.

With 1st Grade making Finals two years in a row and stability in their ranks, I would hope that 2nd Grade can benefit from that next year whether led by myself, Harry Munikrishna or someone else. The last time 2nd Grade made finals cricket was in 2009/10 and it is long overdue. With only one 2nd Grade Premiership to our name in the Club's history I would ask that everything is done to improve on those stats.

Wick also claimed a pewter, an extremely rare occurrence in Masters, having been achieved only six times in our 15 seasons, with a stunning 6/4 v Lane Cove Blue in the final round. Not that he would, but Wick can now boast the two best-ever bowling figures in our Masters, the other being 7/20 against Northwest Sydney in 2011/12.

Wick was well supported by Marty (15 wickets @ 17) and Bob (11 @ 19), with both bowled exceptionally well and turned games for us during the season.

Congratulations to Mosman, who thoroughly deserved to win the premiership for the fifth successive season, and who came agonisingly close to surpassing our record of consecutive wins, coming to an end on 35.

Thanks to everyone for their support during the season and especially to Kenny and Sutts for their captaincy and general support throughout the year. Huge thanks, as always, to Helen Rose for her untiring efforts throughout the season, and who also provided the best afternoon teas in Masters cricket. Helen also skillfully captured the highlights of the season on camera, including plenty of embarrassing moments forever immortalised. Thanks also to Pete, Clyney, Fez and the Committee for their support throughout the year.
