

#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Players amd supports of the Macquarie University Cricket Club can look back on the 1982-83 season with a sense of achievement. At present many of our players are either lost to other clubs or are held back at a standard below their capabilities.

We look forward to the day when the goal of this Club is achieved by promotion to 1st Grade.

On Saturday 28 May, the N.S.W. Cricket Association conducted a "summit" to discuss the future of cricket in NSW. Macquarie University Cricket Club was an invitee to the summit, I attended as our representative. Amongst the many opinions put forward and agreements reached was an overwhelming desire to see the progression and the rationalisation of cricket in NSW. In particular the rationalisation of Sydney Grade cricket. The consensus was for a reduction in the size of the Sydney Grade Competition.

Now, it is a fact that we will again be playing in third and fourth grade in season 1983-84. Beyond that, our future rests with the deliberations of the NSW Cricket Association, given the information that was gathered at the summit.

If this club is not to be cast to the wilderness the season after next, we must make an impact in the coming season in order that we have a case to state for the future. That impact of necessity must start at the top. Any clubman playing sport will know that the success of a club is a direct reflection of that club's senior team. Consequently, our third grade side must succeed next season and success will only come through hard work by all this club's players. To play in the senior team is a goal which each player should set himself from now. It is not good enough to feel satisfied with anything less. With this attitude each team through the grades will be successful.

At Macquarie we have the best facilities possible, we need to prove that as a club we are worthy of them and are worthy of a place in Sydney Grade cricket. Playing cricket for Macquarie should be a pursuit that consumes many hours of practice and commitment through the week, not just a social outing on a Saturday afternoon. There are plenty of other teams around that cater to that attitude. Also, the only reasons for missing a game should be injury, illness or bereavement.

The only direction for Macquarie to travel in season 1983-84 is forward. We need enthusiasm, leadership and hard work. Are you going to be a part of it?
