

#### SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

- 1. These financial accounts have been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account changing money values.
- 2. Interest has been brought to account as it is credited to the various accounts.
- 3. Expenses incurred but not yet invoiced have been accrued on the basis of best available information.
- 4. Funds provided by Macquarie University Sports Association for use by Macquarie University Cricket Club are accounted for on a calendar year basis.
- 5. Equipment purchased by the club is expensed in the year of purchase.
- 6. Stock on hand as at 30th April, 1984 consist of Clothing and Drink Cans.
- 7. The cost of the covers and nets will be charged as a cost against various seasons, based on their estimated life spans.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT

The preceeding reports show that the club maintained the previous years growth and recorded a surplus of \$ 1497.94.

From the Income and Expenditure Statement it can be seen that we relied on the increased cricket associations rebate to offset the effect of decreased social receipts - traditionally our largest income item. The Annual Dinner continues to lose money despite its popularity amounst the attendees. The large raffle raised \$ 207 despite a number of washouts immediately before its draw.

The Balance Sheet discloses little movement from the last year except that this year's surplus paid last year's liabilities. For the first time in a number of years the Sports Association is up to date with their invoicing.

The Statement of Receipts and Payments only reflects the flow of cash through the Cricket Club for the year. There is no allowance made for uninvoiced charges which we are still awaiting.

With the Cricket Club now in a healthy financial position consideration perhaps should be made to improving various playing conditions around the ovals. Perhaps the Cricket Association grant could go directly towards new covers or sightscreens for the top oval. Moderating this thought however, is the future of the top oval. It is of little use spending thousands of dollars on sightscreens if the top oval will only be used for two more seasons.

A slight change in treasurer's policy has occured over the last couple of years. Previously when most people were at the sports centre after a match the price of beer was a little inflated. However, due to the fall-off in trade only the regulars currently breast the bar. It would be unfair to have this few financially supporting the rest. As a result of this, for the last three years, beers have remained at \$1 a can and I hope this status will be maintained this year.

Finally, I would like to thank all those who worked behind the bar and helped at functions during the year. In particular to Allan Mahoney who we must not "burn out" with overwork. I wish everyone every success in 1984/1985 and may we give out many performance trophies next year.

Next season with restructured sides and everyone playing on the same day, it may be easier to hold more social functions which generally increase the coffers.

#### UMPIRES AND SHIRES GAMES REPORT

Due to the demand for grounds by the C Shire side and other hirers of the University grounds, only a limited number of social games were played during the year. The four Sundays where cricket club were directly involved were the Shires Representitive games and the social game against the umpires.

It was a surprise to turn up at Macquarie early one Sunday morning to find many middle aged gentlemen already seriously practising. After being invited to toss by the umpires captain, Dick French (the current test umpire), and Dick having called heads, the Macquarie captain found the coin to be a double headed coin. Is this what happens in test matches?

The home team batted first and rattled up 247, with credit due to our top order batsmen of Steve O'Reilly, 47 and Steve Campbell with over 80. Umpire "W.G." batted eleven for Macquarie and exclaimed "That's the first time in about ten years I've hit a boundary".

Once bowling, Macquarie made early inroads with a few batsmen asking for the bowling to slow down and be directed at their bats (no Laurie Ager was not one of the bowlers asked to slow down.) Ron Aitken and Steve Campbell (again) did well with the ball. Dick French with over 50 not out excelled in the umpire's batting order.

Our thanks must be extended to the two lady umpires who completed their task under extreme pressure from their collegues. The game was enjoyed by all who played in it and will no doubt be a prime date on our calendar next year.

On 10th December, 1983 two Shires North v's South of the habour games were played at Macquarie. One being an under 21 game and one open game. Unfortunately about noon, a torential downpour occurred. The cover floated off the wicket and the cover pole had to be retrieved after it had floated across the ground and was heading towards the Lane Cove River.

The games were replayed on the 17th January with the South of the harbour sides winning both games. As these ocasions are ideal ways of raising finance it was disappointing to see only two Macquarie representives help with the organisation.

From the regional sides a combination Shires side was selected and played the N.S.W. under 19 side at Macquarie on 7th March. The cricket association side scored in excess of 250 with only Ian Hinton (Wentworthville) and Laurie Monaghan (Roseville) causing the batsmen trouble. In reply, the Shires side were soon in trouble and only a blazing 43 by Ian Hinton allowed the Shires side to top 175.

This type of game is a very good "P.R". excercise with both the Cricket Association as well as other Shire clubs. With a little more help from club members this day can become a show-piece for Shires cricket, and a financial bonanza for Macquarie.

With a forthcoming reorganisation in Macquarie sides this perhaps is the opportunity to set up a series of social games as was done seven years ago by Peter Clark.

#### TOOHEYS SEVEN -A- SIDE REPORT

On Sunday 4th December, 1983 Macquarie University Cricket Club hosted the Sixth Annual Tooheys Seven -ar Side knock out competition. Entries were received from ten Municipal and Shires Clubs, Meadowbank C.C, "Typhoons 7" and the "Country Specials".

Torrenhal rain the previous day forced the abandonment of the repercharge round and some hasty improvisation on the oval in order that the main draw could proceed. However, with the bowling all coming from the northern end into a wicket placed halfway down the original pitch play commenced only a little behind time. To everybodys credit all teams joined in the spirit of the occasion and a successful day resulted.

Following their success of the previous season the "Country Specials" started as favourites. They looked good as they progressed to the final to meet a young and impressive Wentworthville-Blacktown side.

The "Country Specials" batted first and scored 2 for 75 in their six overs (Nev Castle 31 n.o. and Dave Glasson 17) with four wides from Wenty eventually proving very costly. Wenty at bat always looked to have a chance, particularly after 2 overs when they were 1/32. However, tight bowling and good fielding saw a final that the Australian Cricket Board could not have asked for.

With one delivery remaining the last Wenty batsman made his way to the crease with his team requiring 6 runs to win the game. He took guard to the strains of "How Do You Feel", the crowd came to silence as the bowler moved in, the batsman swung and connected, result: caught one metre inside the midwicket boundary. "Country Specials" had got up by 5 runs, Wenty being all out for 70 off their 6 overs.

A marvellous finish to a great day.

#### vs Southern Districts

In reply Bankstown were generally in control, eventually passing us five down. Craighead (2/44) and Lindsay (2/72) got through alot of overs.

#### vs Northern Districts

Macquarie University 5/213 defeated Northern Districts 5/210

In the first of the numerous one day matches Northern Districts batted well to make 210. Craighead (2/36) was the pick of the bowlers. In reply we were always going to score the runs thanks to magnificant batting from Welsby (78) and Lindsay (76).

#### vs Waverley

Macquarie University 150 lost to Waverley 7/234

On a disgraceful ground we bowled badly to let Waverley slog up 234. Edwards (2/44) was the best of the bowlers. In reply we scored a miserable 150 with only Mahoney (44) getting runs. A match to forget.

#### vs Gordon

Macquarie University 8/318 defeated Gordon 229.

On a good wicket we bowled well to restrict Gordon to 229. Walker (3/48), Lindsay (3/57) and O'Rielly (2/62) were the best of the bowlers. Lindsay (54) and Welsby (44) steered us towards victory, but it was a powerful 78 from Gold that finally got us there. Gold received good support from Walker (45x).

#### vs Sutherland

Macquarie University 221 and 4/113 dec. defeated Sutherland 152 and 5/95.

On a sub-standard pitch we were given a good start with a grafting 54 from Welsby, but the rest of the top order failed and we were in trouble at 6/116. Adcock came to the rescue with an excellent 43 and he was given support from Gold (26) and Walker (22). Sutherland were always struggling in reply with Walker 4/52 bowling well. Edwards (3/4) cleared up the tail.

Welsby was again the top scorer in the second innings with a flashy 47 and we were able to set a target of 182. Sutherland was struggling at 5/58 but held on for the draw. Craighead (4/26) bowled well.

#### vs Mosman

Macquarie University 3/199 defeated Mosman 7/197

Mosman were restricted to 7/197 in this 60 over match, with Craighead (3/61) and Lindsay (2/26) bowling well. Welsby (36) again got us off to a good start, but the honours were with Lindsay (69) and O'Reilly (63 not out) whom both batted brilliantly to give us an easy victory.

#### vs Balmain

Macquarie University 170 lost to Balmain 9/234

We did well to restrict Balmain through the early part of their innings, but they really got away from us at the end to finish with 234. In reply we lost wickets regularly and only a brilliant 72 not out from O'Reilly kept us in reach of our target. Eventually he ran out of support and we were dismissed for 170.

#### vs Manly

Macquarie University 59 and 7/140 lost to Manly 7/154

On a bad track we only put up a token resistance to some genuine fast bowling and were dismissed for a paltry 59. Manly had no trouble passing us and were only restricted by some well controlled bowling from Lindsay (6/60). We showed much more resilience in our second innings and avoided outright defeat thanks to a classy 69 from Lindsay and a patient 18 not out from Scotter.

#### vs Sydney

Macquarie University 136 lost to Sydney 158

Sydney were always struggling against tight bowling and were dismissed for 158. Ager (4/58) and Lindsay (3/34) were the pick of the bowlers.

In reply we were given a reasonable start by Welsby (28) and O'Reilly (30) but the middle and lower order failed miserably with only Schaafsma (30 not out) showing resistance. This is a game we should have won easily.

#### vs North Sydney

Macquarie University 8/183 defeated North Sydney 181 and 5/96

We saved one of our better bowling performances for the competition leaders and dismissed them for 181 on a good batting wicket. Craighead (4/49) and Lindsay (3/43) did most of the damage.

Lindsay (47) gave us a good start to our innings, but a middle order collapse saw us struggling at 5/106. Gold quickly swung the match back our way with an aggressive 54 and the victory became a formality.

#### vs Petersham

Macquarie University 7/309 defeated Petersham 142 and 3/115

On a good batting track Welsby provided us with the batting highlight of the season in scoring a fine 108. O'Reilly (38) and Lindsay (32) also batted well to give us a great start to the innings. Late in the day Walker (50 not out) and Craighead (44 not out) finished the attack off to enable us to declare at 7/309.

In reply Petersham were always struggling against good bowling and could only manage 142. Ager in particular bowled well to take 4/35.

#### vs Parramatta

Macquarie University 89 and 4/36 lost to Parramatta 5/90

Another match to forget. There were no highlights in our scoring a miserable 89. Parramatta were struggling at 5/43 in reply, but we didn't have the runs to take advantage. Lindsay (3/37) again bowled well.

# vs Penrith

Macquarie University 80 lost to Penrith 126 and 2/118

We put in our best effort in the field for the season to dismiss Penrith for only 126. Lindsay (4/16), Ager (3/41) and Edwards (2/18) did most of the damage. We were very disappointing in reply and could only muster 80.

#### vs Parramatta

Macquarie University 213 lost to Parramatta 241

In a meaningless redraw played on a sub-standard ground Parramatta slogged up 241 with Craighead picking up 5/79. In a cavalier reply of 213 the main scorers were Welsby (47), Maskey (43), Gold (30) and a personal best of 36 not out from Edwards. #### CAPTAIN'S REPORT - A SHIRES

The 1983-1984 season in A Shires was not a good one performance wise. There were numerous reasons for the lack of success on the field. Practice must be well attended and relevant. There is no value in practising leg-spin if you're an opening bowler and vice-veosa. Also, if the practice wickets are a bit 'dodgey' there are no kudos to be gained from making batsmen duck and weave from "inspired" bowling. All it does is ruin fellow players confidence. During the game itself, attention must be focused on the game on the top oval, not events on the bottom ground. It is also wise to arrive at least half an hour prior to the start of the game.

During the season, Andy McShane, the Epping opener who has accumulated many runs against Macquarie sides over the years, complimented us on our fighting attitude when playing them. "not many smiles, and you could see everyone was trying hard". This attitude must be maintained.

Bill Congreve's performances deserve special recognition. Bill not only broke the A Grade Record aggregate but was responsible for getting the side away to a rapid start and many sides felt the sting of his powerful driving. Bill's consistency in making over 500 runs was matched by his consistency at practice. I'm sure there's a lesson in there somewhere.

Nine players in A Grade represented the club at Fourth grade level. Singelling one out, it was especially pleasing to see Dave Baker, after yeoman service in Shire's cricket, do so well. It's up to these players to consolidate their position in the coming season. Hopefully, the competition will be keen as this well also help the A's. Generally, the fielding in the A's was quite sound.

A Shires cricket is vitally important to this club while the side is the third in the club's hierarchy, it is the top side in the Shire's Competition. This year was an improvement in the competitiveness of the previous couple of seasons. Let's didicate ourselves to improve upon that competitiveness by not only unloading the wooden spoon but lifting the club higher in the cricket championship.

Let me thank Bill Congreve and Steve Campbell for taking charge in my absence, and Michael Denlow and Barry Keast, the captains on either side of me, who either delighted or disturbed me, depending on their news over the phone. Thanks also to the A Shires players who were generally consistent in their availability and extremely supportive. It was greatly appreciated.

#### CAPTAIN'S REPORT - C SHIRES

It was a disastrous season in many ways for the "C" Shires, but with a defailed explanation it would almost appear in some ways a success. The wooden-spoon was retained although more points were gained this season including an outright win at Canterbury; something Macquarie sides in the past have only dream about. Two possible wins against Wentworthville and Warringah were interrupted by rain, many losses though were not. The largest number of players to play in one Macquarie side did not allow any stability to be established, and this perhaps was the cornerstone of our troubled season.

The performances on-field were inconsistent in both batting and bowling, assisted by poor umpiring and little luck. Too few batsmen relished easy paced wickets and the opportunity of batting first to build big innings. Indiscretion on the part of many brought apart many promising partnerships and the result was constant pressure upon lower order batsmen. The fact that twenty-five per cent of our innings were ducks did not assist the cause at all. Consistency lacked in many batting displays with a number of middle-range scores never built upon. The result was that eight team scores were below one-hundred and seventeen of the eighteen team innings were below two-hundred.

Lack of depth and variation in bowling saw many opponents take full toll on us and meant only three times did we dismiss a whole innings. Also any bowler showing potential was quickly promoted and this resulted in bowlers with little experience and consistency being called upon to bowl for long periods.

Our fielding was good with many fine catches taken including a couple of extraordinary ones which lifted team morale better than any motivational speech. If an acceptable standard is to be maintained a committed attempt by all players has to be made to practice.

Nevertheless, despite many difficulties some players had an enjoyable season. There are many changes that have to be made in administration before Macquarie can seriously consider itself being a full grade club. Selectors must be appointed and meet each round and once a player is selected in a team only exceptional circumstances should result in a change. This means "poaching" of players which happened to us continuously on a Friday and Saturday would not occur. To be told "it is better for C's to go inthout than B's" is into lerable and against the club spirit. Spirit needs to be built up or Macquarie will appear to be "two clubs within one", a situation which arose this season. Performances in administration and on the field must improve, by full commitment for a season this can be a reality. To those who endured 1983-1984 with "C"'s, let it be a lesson that firstly the club as a whole comes first and let us work together in 1984-1985 to make Macquarie the club it should be.

Macquarie University 53 and 85 lost to Lindfield 0/56 dec. and 2/86 outright

The loss of key players and the beginning of "guest players" appearances heralded a mid-season change for 'C' Shires. Losing the toss we were put in on a sticky wicket and with accurate bowling we were never at ease going from 6/17 to all out for 53. Lindfield quickly notched up the runs against a depleted attack and all we could do was avert an outright in a one day game. At 5/19 we knew we were gone with only A. Hooper (35) providing any resistence. Better bowling did not prevent Lindfield from taking outright points.

#### vs Strathfield

Macquarie University 91 lost to Strathfield 224

A Sunday game on Macquarie Oval proved too big a hurdle as 'C' Shires succumbed to nerves which saw Strathfield cowboy their way to 2/96. After lunch we came back strong with J. We found the different batting surface difficult to handle although R. Clarke (38) and S. Fisher (22) got amongst the runs. We lost 5/33 and lost any chance of victory. Burwood found our bowlers in full flight with R. Clarke (3/16) off 12 overs creating plenty of trouble sending Burwood to 3/41. Poor fielding let them off the hook and they declared to go for the outright. We were very obliging to their wishes collapsing to 6/36 and with plenty of time left outright seemed highly probable. C. Kitching (33) and R. Nugan (29) ably supported by J. Campbell (17 not out) batted out the last hour to save Macquarie further embrassment.

#### vs Warringah

Macquarie University 0/39 drew with Warringah 7/243 dec.

A depleted attack had difficulty in dismissing Warringah and thankfully they declared instead. Inaccurate bowling, poor ground fielding and generally an air of laziness dominated our performance on the first day. When we appeared to be coming back into the game we could not sustain pressure long enough and thus even on an easy Macquarie wicket a big score was against us. K. Wiblin (12) and Folkard (24 not out) posted our highest opening stand of 39 and gave us every confidence of batting all the second day for victory. However, rain ruined any chance of play although it took almost two hours to persuade the Warringah captain that we could not play.

#### vs Lindfield

Macquarie University 13 and 59 lost to Lindfield 7/265 outright

This was the blackest day of the whole season. Only eight players decided to turn up giving us little chance against the semi-final contenders Lindfield. They batted first butchering our attack on the small pottery green ground to amass 7/265 off 50 overs. G. Dignan was the best bowler with 3/37. Our weakest batting line up all season in terms of batsmen and talent saw us fail for a dismal 13 and then improve somewhat to 59 with G. Dignan completeling a good double scoring 26.

A black day for Macquarie to finish the season and for the immediate future competiting in 'C' Shires. Blame for this is not just upon the 'C' players but the whole club.
