

VALE - ROSS GWILLIAM

Long standing Club members will be deeply saddened by the recent passing (May 1993) of Ross Gwilliam, our Club Patron, after a long illness.

Ross was our second, and longest serving, president, from 1969 to 1979. He was a Life Member and recipient of a Club Colour Award. One of our grounds, the newly resurfaced "original" field is named after Ross as a result of his acknowledged services to the cricket Club.

Ross was easily our most "seasoned" administrator and always spoke in a delightfully slow, deliberate and thoughtful style. In a Club whose administrators have always been notoriously youthful, Ross's eloquent and often lengthy "chats" would entertain, fascinate and quite often infuriate younger, brasher and less experienced Committee members. But Ross's opinion was always valued, especially in dealing with administrative problems in a positive and diplomatic way.

I first met Ross in his capacity as an Educational Officer on campus. Often I would seek Ross's opinion on educational matters only to spend ninety per cent of the time, often a lengthy period of time, talking cricket.

Ross was very much a cricket traditionalist and took a great personal pride in identifying a youthful student of his by the name of R.B. Simpson and his apparent ability in the game.

Ross was an important, if not *the* most important person, in there *being* a Macquarie University Cricket Club. He was there at the Club's humble beginnings, and even played a game or two. In my early years at the Club, Ross was often in residence with his cloth cap and obligatory pipe. He oversaw the Club's growing strength and movement into grade cricket. He was present during the Club's twentieth anniversary celebrations although he was not well. His interest in the Club never waned.

He will be greatly missed.

This has been another great year in the history of the Club.

A Grade in the Final B Grade Premiers Women's XI 3rd

3rd in the Club Championship.

If we continue this progression, maybe we'll crack it in A's next year.

Our team has done a turn around in the three years I've been at the Club. Paul Notaras also captured 24 wickets at 22.04 to complete a good all-round season. Very useful contributions were made by newcomer Paul Howarth and "Gus" Hook is one of the best Clubmen I know. "Linus" McFadden has settled in as A's keeper and had a good year behind the stumps. Two players that deserve special mention are Graham Lego and Jamie Breden. They were promoted on form. Jamie's 40 in the final almost won the game for us. He certainly showed how we should have batted. Thank you to the other players who contributed throughout the year.

Behind every successful Club is a good Committee and at Macquarie we have one of the best. Congratulations to Bruce Hort and the Committee on a job well done.

Finally a word of thanks to the other selectors. It is not easy picking the teams each week, especially if you are selecting the lower grades.

In closing, we have a fine Club and it is getting better each year. We have a lot of very talented players that are backed up by a well organised and enthusiastic Committee. It is important that we maintain the same levels of performance and behaviour, on and off the field. If we do this, then MUCC will continue to be one of the strongest and most respected Clubs in the Shires Competition.

MATCH REPORTS - 'A' SHIRES

vs Lindfield 213 lost to Lindfield 253.

We played away and Lindfield scored 253 after being 6/139. We failed to hold our catches in this game and should have had them out for a lot less. In reply we were bowled out for 213. The honours went to Paul Notaras (4/40 off 16 overs), Gavo (54) and Bruce Hort (51).

vs Wentworthville 182 defeated Wentworthville 167 & 5/98.

Some excellent bowling at home on a rain affected wicket saw us dismiss Wenty for 167. This was largely due to Todd Ritchie's 4/35 off 16 overs. In the chase Nasty scored a very good 75 in the total of 182. This gave us our first win of the season. In Wenty's second innings they were 5/98 with Dave Budge taking 4/19 off 9 overs.

vs Bexley 8/171 defeated Bexley 135.

Winning the toss at home, I asked Bexley to bat and we bundled them out for 135. Budgy (3/26) and Webby (3/47) were the destroyers. We scored the necessary runs for the loss of only 5 wickets and finished with 8/171. Gavo (51x) and Ivan (31) were the main contributors.

vs Roseville 5/116 defeated Roseville 107.

Away at Roseville Chase and Roseville batted first. Some great bowling by Webby, 4/41 and Peter Murphy 3/22 saw Roseville crash to 107. We went for the runs that night to set up an outright win. Then came a great 10th wicket partnership of 51 between Budgy 26x and Wick 29. They at least gave us a fighting chance. The next week the bowlers kept us in the game and Burwood were gone at 6/101. We then proceeded to drop 6 catches before they passed our score. They finished with 8/234 with Budgy, Murph and Gus taking 2 wickets each.

vs Epping 8/272 drew with Epping.

Playing at home we won the toss and batted on a good strip. We scored 8/272 with most batters getting a start. A brilliant innings of 66 by Paul Howarth was the highlight and included 2 sixes and 7 fours. Phantom got 57 and Graham Lego 44. The next week you guessed it, it rained all day!

vs Strathfield 9/198 defeated Strathfield 197.

Strathfield won the toss at their home ground and had an emergency team meeting to decide what to do. They were looking good at 2/156 but all of a sudden we hit a purple patch and took the last 8 wickets for 41 including 7 for 14. Wick was the destroyer with 5/44 off 20.1 overs. He was ably supported by Murph with 3/28 off 15. Our batting faltered a couple of times and we were 6/113 at one stage. Then a great fight back was led by Peter Murphy with 51 and Glen McFadden with 18 saw us pass them 8 wickets down. This was a terrific game of cricket and the result kept us in the race for the semis.

vs Lane Cove 9 (dec) 142 defeated Lane Cove 112 & 4/119.

We won the toss and asked Lane Cove to bat on a good Macquarie deck in an attempt to set up an outright win. Wickets fell consistently and they were 8/68. Their last 2 partnerships added another 44 and wasted precious time. Webby bowled magnificently to finish with 6/40 off 15. In an attempt to secure 1st innings points, the batters threw their wickets away and we finished the day at 6/100. Surprisingly, the sun was shining and we passed their total without much concern. I batted on for a few more overs and we established a 30 run lead in the hope that if we batted again our target would not be all that great. Top score was Murph with 29x. The theory was working well enough when they were 3 for 3. However, they established a couple of partnerships and the game fizzled out.

vs Pennant Hills 3/133 & 4/122 defeated Pennant Hills 132 and 121 outright.

Away at Pennant Hills and good fortune, I won the toss. Hills batted first and could only manage 132 off 59 overs. Dave Webb took 6/55 off 28.1 overs. vs Canterbury 195 defeated Canterbury 128.

I chose to bat on a crusty Bexley wicket. One end played OK, the other at times dangerously. Batted into day 2 and declared at 9/250. Lego showed great concentration and top scored with 57, Brown 35 and Ramsland 34 both made worthwhile contributions in difficult circumstances.

Bexley had no idea how to go about the task of either scoring runs or surviving, losing 17 wickets in 69 overs.

Brown and Folkard both got 5 wickets and Ramsland 4 over the 2 innings. A dominant performance.

v Roseville 3/248 drew with Roseville.

I had no hesitation in choosing to bat on a excellent Macquarie wicket. The day belonged to Lego with an all-day, unbeaten 109. An innings of wonderful application. Mahoney 51, Brown 38 and Breden 36x also contributed. Day two was washed out.

It is not only the players that experience the season. Wives and girlfriends are virtual cricket widows. For their patience, thank you very much. Janette also dealt with many wet weather calls during the year. Her assistance was much appreciated.

I would like to thank the team, particularly those who assisted in the smooth running of the side off the field. Mark Noonan with the covers, Shane Vella with the stumps, Andy Pavlov with animal stories, all helped the side.

Our first taste of home for the year resulted in Wentworthville struggling to 207 with Nick Housman taking 4/73 off 34 and "Mario" Folkard finishing with 4/53 off 29. Both these two bowlers bowled unchanged after tea to complete Wenty's innings.

Chasing 207 we were 1/123 with Matt Edgerton 54 and Paul Chew 40 batting well before a collapse which resulted in Macquarie loosing 9/53, well short of the required target. In this game we saw our first umpire for the year.

vs Bexley 4/182 defeated Bexley 7/181.

This was the start of the big wet. This game was limited overs and at least brought a result. One bowler down after a breakdown in the 9th over, the remaining bowlers - Noonan 1/52 off 21, Deller 0/59 off 23 and Matt Edgerton 1/12 off 7 all bowled very well to limit the Bexley total. Matt's new medium pace helped in the final few overs. Four batsmen were run out by very good Macquarie fielding.

Although losing 3/11 in the middle of the chase we finished with overs to spare. Welsby 74x, and Edgerton 46 were the

pick of the batsmen.

While umpiring, all players need to be alert for even the simplest of things. During the innings a batsman noticed 3 fieldsmen behind square leg, charged the bowler and luckily hit it for four, the umpire remained unaware of the goings on. This could have changed the course of the game had he been dismissed.

vs Roseville 241 drew with Roseville 1/13.

Macquarie won the toss and batted on a flat Roseville wicket. Solid batting by Matt Edgerton 70, coupled with a 40 from Richard Mather and 44 from Nick Housman, including a first ball six which landed on his own bonnet, set the scene for the strong position. An early wicket kept Macquarie on top looking for an easy win next week.

The following week brought rain and no play.

vs Canterbury 9/(dec)279 drew with Canterbury 2/25.

Macquarie were sent in and were soon in trouble at 2/18. Two large partnerships, both involving Richard Mather (116) were to help Macquarie into a good position. Richard's innings started slowly but soon gathered momentum with many drives through cover, mid-wicket and glances to fine leg. An even time 44 by Colin Kendall and 33 by Chris Welsby allowed the imposing target.

After 17 overs, Canterbury were 2/25, both opening bowlers with a wicket apiece, when a storm arrived. Although the umpires restarted play on the main oval, Canterbury decided the outfield of the Northern Oval was too damp and refused

to again take the field, a decision obviously influenced by the state of the game.

vs Warringah 1/39 drew with Warringah 165.

Another game where we were robbed by the rain. Macquarie, playing with 10 players after an opening bowler didn't turn up, easily accounted for Warringah. Housman, swinging the ball both ways, finished with the excellent figures of 5/44 off 18 overs which included the first five wickets to fall. After tea "Silver" Harrison quickly wrapped up the tail taking 4/13 off 8 overs of good off-cutters.

We were in no difficulty until the rain and the second week was completely washed out.

vs Baulkham Hills drew with Baulkham Hills 8/293.

During this game we used three wicket keepers - all due to injury on a typically low and flat Macquarie wicket. After having Baulkham Hills 4/128, 'Hills continued to register quite large partnerships after tea. Fielding was not the best, despite this the best bowlers were Housman 3/77 off 27, Harrison 2/37 off 15 and Noonan 2/54 off 15. Baulkham Hills did to Macquarie what Macquarie normally does to all other sides, grinding out the runs, retaining wickets, with the pitch giving no assistance to the bowlers. We probably did well to keep 'Hills to this score. Yet again the second week was washed out.

vs Burwood 143 & 6/107 lost to Burwood 3/154.

This game was played on a new, underprepared wicket with cracks as wide as the stiches on the ball. At the end of the first week three holes on a good length fitted half a six stitcher. The pitch was very dangerous with a number of batsmen and wicket keepers visiting hospital after play. Representives of the Cricket Association inspected the wicket the day after play - the nature of this particular pitch didn't present the Club in the best of lights.

Macquarie batted first, the only batsmen to register double figures were Housman 38, Edgerton 29, Welsby 26 and Vella 15. Both weeks the wicket settled down later in the afternoon except for the ball pitching in holes. Burwood reached 154

with Jon Shwabsky (3/54 off 22 overs) taking all three wickets to fall.

Despite some retired hurts the next week, Macquarie avoided the outright loss through Pavlov 28x, Welsby 20 and Housman 18. This game showed which batsmen would grit and grind out when conditions were not in their favour. Batsmen cannot be just good wicket batsmen, they should be able to adapt their style to poorer wickets.

vs Epping 258 drew with Epping.

Macquarie won the toss and batted but were soon in trouble at 5/115. Larger partnerships and big hitting by Jamie "Toy" Breden 84 turned it around to have Macquarie finish in an excellent position. Other good batting contributions included Matt Edgerton 53, Pavlov 44 and Welsby 24.

The second week was washed out with Macquarie in another good position.

vs Strathfield 8/319 & 0/(dec.)0 lost outright to Strathfield 5/(dec)131 & 3/193.

Macquarie won the toss and batted on our first Saturday/Sunday game. We were bounced on this wicket and Colin Kendall came to the fore with a swathe of hooks, pulls, cuts and the occasional drive. Col raced to 92 before tea. He gathered himself during the break and continued onto 122 including 17 boundaries. The opening partnership was 120 with Simon Burchett contributing 36. If Kendall wasn't enough, the bowlers then pitched the ball up to Jamie Breden who then took over and smashed his way to 16 boundaries in 98 runs including 5 six's. There was some dispute whether he was actually out, some claiming he was caught over the boundary for what would have been a six.

Strathfield were in early trouble. Macquarie, a bowler short due to injury, offered the double declaration, to earn Macquarie 6 points before tea.

A bowler short and poor catching enabled Strathfield to reach their target fairly easily. The game finished with some very tired players, both sides scoring over 300 runs and sharing 6 competition points each.

vs Lane Cove 7/210 defeated Lane Cove 178.

Lane Cove won the toss and batted without losing wickets early. Jon Shwabsky was needed and starred taking 4/34 off 19 overs, varying his pace very well and extracting some spin. Steve Bateman took early wickets which enabled him to bowl 14 overs and also wrap up the tail to finish with 5/31 - most of these bowled by sheer pace.

A 71 opening stand effectively killed any chance Lane Cove thought they had. Burchett 60, Mather 48 and Welsby 23 all ground out the runs to achieve an easy win.

vs Pennant Hills 3/(dec)104 & 2/30 defeated Pennant Hills 62 and 156.

Pennant Hills won the toss and batted. Their opening batsman was run out first ball. All bowlers achieved wickets the best being Mark Noonan 3/9 off 12 overs, Steve Bateman 2/7 off 6 and Jon Shwabsky 1/0 off 2 overs. Chasing quick runs, we reached the target easily with Kendall 49 and Welsby 51x sharing a very quick 99 partnership. We declared but were unable to take wickets the first evening off the remaining 13 overs.

The next day was a long hard struggle with Pennant Hills batting to avoid outright defeat. The second new ball was needed to finish the innings. The best bowler was Housman (6/25 off 25). Eight runs per over was beyond us, so we settled for a 1st innings win.

vs Auburn 183 lost to Auburn 193.

Auburn turned up without a score book, kit or stumps and batted on an easy paced wicket at Auburn. The figures by tea were 42 calls from cars, 7 wheelies, 4 ambulances, 3 Police cars and 1 car accident. The best bowler was Jon Shwabsky with 4/53. We lost both opening batsmen on the first afternoon.

The second day was wet, but playable. We played to quite an exciting finish. Brendan Fletcher 53, night watchman Mark Noonan 23 and Richard Mather 28 were the best batsmen. Ben Bradley almost won the game at the end with 24 well struck runs. In the end the conditions won out.

CAPTAIN'S REPORT - 'D' SHIRES

A season that promised much ended in the disappointment of not making the Semi-Finals. Of the 13 matches played, 6 ended up with no result due to the second Saturday being rained off. Of the remaining 7 matches, we won 4 on first innings (although 2 were lost outright after declaring 0/0), 2 were lost and 1 drawn.

The bowling throughout the season was of quite a high standard. However, due to continual changes in personnel in this

department no one person managed a high number of wickets.

Three of the top wicket takers were spin bowlers with 42 of the 105 wickets. These were John Shwabsky (15), Mark Smith (15) and Douglas Latto (13). Richard Joyce was the other bowler to reach double figures with 15 in a promising debut season. There were some notable performances with the ball. Simon Wolfe opened the season with 5/52 against Lindfield. Richard Joyce had 5/70 in his debut against Wentworthville. John Shwabsky took 6/107 against Roseville in his first season. Mark Smith showed a welcome return to form with 6/78 against Epping. However, the most impressive single bowling performance came from newcomer Damon Law with 2/11 and 5/34 against Pennant Hills. The latter was off 15 overs when the opposition was batting aggressively.

The ground fielding was much improved over previous seasons with a number of run outs. However, the catching, yet again, let us down both behind the wicket and in the inner fielding positions. It was definitely a major factor in missing

the semis.

The batting showed a great transformation at the end of the season. By round 7 only two players had passed 50, Shane Vella twice with 61 not out and 55, Douglas Latto with 66. The match against Burwood saw our first dominant batting display with 3/257. Simon Burchett returned to form with 90 and Ben Bradley scored his first century with 100 not out. Our next batting display against Strathfield also saw a newcomer, Grant Hooper, scoring 51 not out. However, we lost this match from a strong position and we still had a bit of work to do to make the Semi-Finals.

It is at this point that I realised that our problem was that we were batting too slowly, even when we were in strong positions. Too many of our batsmen played "nets" cricket and forgot to look for singles, preferring to wait 6 or 7 overs for a bad ball to hit for 4. Therefore some major changes to the batting were made with dramatic results.

In the last three matches we made 234 against Lane Cove (which would have been 350 on any other outfield), 9/278

against Pennant Hills and 300 against Auburn. All were made at a quicker rate.

There were some remarkable batting performances in the matches. Paul Chew and Douglas Latto had opening partnerships of 79, 140 and 81 giving a total of 300. The 140 was a D Grade first wicket record. Paul Chew had scores of 44, 64 and 125, his first hundred and a very impressive one. Douglas Latto finished the season with 65, 40, 80 and 38. Simon Wolfe regained his form with 62 not out as did Dave Kidd with 57.

We were looking for outright victories in these matches and lost to Lane Cove and Pennant Hills attempting this, but not before achieving first innings victories and declaring 0/0. In the latter match, a dropped catch off the last ball would have sealed victory, but saw us lose instead. An outright win in the last match against Auburn could also have seen us in the Semi-Finals. This was a real possibility. However, the weather had the last say with the final Saturday being washed out. So we ended up 6th, only 6 points outside the Semi-Finals. I believe that the team that we had at the end of the season was the best in the league. The cricket played at the end of the season was both positive and enjoyable. If this impetus is continued into next season there is a real chance we will win the league.

Finally, I would like to thank all the players who played for "D's" and made this season my most enjoyable in six years at the club.

We had ourselves to blame with a number of straight forward catches dropped early in his innings. R Joyce, in his first match for Ds, took 5/70 off 23 overs with an impressive effort. J Shwabsky toiled manfully for 3/99 off 27 overs. Macquarie lost wickets regularly and at 6/103 it required a rearguard action. This came from S Vella who stayed to the end with 61x and Andrew Doherty with 25.

v Bexley 109 lost to Bexley 9/114.

Restricted to a one day game, we won the toss and elected to bat. The wicket had unpredictable bounce and we were dismissed for 109. Bexley had similar problems with the wicket and were 8/60 with D Poder, W Montford taking 3 wickets each. However, their tail end batsmen saw them home. They were 9/86 and went on to win by 1 wicket. They showed us how to bat on a bad wicket.

v Roseville drew with Roseville 9/303.

Macquarie put Roseville in and at 0/76 things looked bad. However, the spin twins, J Shwabsky and D Latto, bowled accurately to bring Macquarie back into match. At 9/232 they had all the wickets. D Latto took 3/54 and J Shwabsky an impressive 6/107 off 31 overs. Unfortunately the last wicket put on an unbroken 71 runs. The second Saturday was washed out.

v Canterbury 7/60 drew with Canterbury 159.

Macquarie won the toss and put Canterbury in. Dismissing them for 159 seemed to vindicate this decision. D Latto took 3/16 and R Joyce 3/55. The end of the first day saw us at 7/35! The batsmen had only themselves to blame. M Noonan and H Leonard batted 11 overs the next Saturday and took the score to 7/60 before the rain came.

v Warringah 2/25 drew with Warringah 262.

Warringah won the toss and batted. At 4/72 we were looking good but a fourth wicket partnership of 82 put Warringah back into the game. Again, dropped catches let us down. At 7/185 we still could have had a successful day but the tail wagged to see them up to 262. The pick of the bowlers were J Shwabsky 4/38 and S Le Bas 3/73. We were 2/25 at the close. The next Saturday was washed out.

v Baulkham Hills 236 drew with Baulkham Hills.

Macquarie won the toss and batted. S Vella was the mainstay with a solid 55. D Law (35), A Davies (30) and T Barnes (30) got starts but failed to go on with it. A highlight was a last wicket partnership of 45 with J Shwabsky getting 27x. The next Saturday was washed out.

v Burwood 3/257 defeated Burwood 145.

Burwood won the toss and batted. They were 8/92 before staging a slight recovery to 145. R Joyce 3/33 and D Latto 3/43 were the main wicket takers. At the end of the first day we were 1/56. The next Saturday saw us bat slowly, but steadily. S Burchett and A Davies put on 63 for the second wicket and we passed them 2 wickets down. There was not enough time for a second innings, so we had some batting practice. S Burchett was eventually out for a solid 90 and B Bradley scored an aggressive 100 not out, his first ever century.

v Epping drew with Epping 9/229.

Epping won the toss and elected to bat. They had a good start with 60 runs on the board before M Smith caused a minor

collapse. One of their players hit an aggressive 62 but we were well placed at 7/169. The eighth wicket put on 51 runs at about 1½ per over and play ceased at 9/229. M Smith 6/78 showed a welcome return to form and D Whitehead bowled better than 2/34. The next Saturday was washed out.

v Strathfield 234 lost to Strathfield 5/263.

Winning the toss and batting, Macquarie got off to a solid start with a 45 opening partnership and 57 for the second wicket. At 1/102, we were in a strong position but then we collapsed to 8/165. D Latto scored 65. A ninth wicket partnership of 63 between a restrained S Le Bas (26) and G Hooper (51x) saw us reach 234.

At 4/72 Macquarie were getting on top. However, a fifth wicket partnership of 117, saw Strathfield to a 5 wicket win. One of their players scored a century. Again we were let down by dropped catches.

v Lane Cove 234 & 0/0 (dec) lost outright to Lane Cove 5/105 (dec) & 5/131.

Put in by Lane Cove on slow wicket with a slow outfield we got off to a solid start with 79. P Chew (44) and D Latto (40) were the participants. There was a minor collapse to 5/128 but we were 5/196 at the end of the first day. Some quick runs saw us declare at 9/234. Lane Cove did not look like scoring the runs despite an outfield that had quickened. At 5/105 they declared and we declared 0/0 leaving 130 runs to be scored off 26 overs. We opened with our slow bowlers who were hit around the field. However, Joyce and Montford got us back into the game with 2 wickets each and we had a chance for an outright at 5/99. However, they got home with 2 overs to spare. M Smith had the best bowling performance in the first innings with 4/31.

v Pennant Hills 9/278 & 0/0(dec) lost outright to Pennant Hills 9/103(dec) & 8/176.

Winning the toss and batting, P Chew (64) and D Latto (80) quickly put on 140 in a D Grade record opening partnership. The rest of the team went for quick runs and we declared after 77.5 overs at 7/278. S Wolfe (30) & D Law (32) made useful contributions. Pennant Hills were 1/32 off 6 overs at the close and should have been 3 or 4 down. Next Saturday they collapsed to 9/103 (they were one man short). This was despite Macquarie being without their two opening bowlers at the start. We declared 0/0 leaving Pennants Hills to score 176 off 53 overs. The outcome was in doubt right up to the end with wickets falling at regular intervals. They needed 2 runs to win with 2 overs and 2 wickets to go. The next ball was pulled fiercely in the air and dropped. It went for 2 runs - thus losing a dramatic but important game. D Law put in a great bowling effort with 2/11 and 5/34. It seemed an injustice that both sides obtained 6 points. However, we had only our catching to blame.

v Auburn 300 drew wtih Auburn 3/16.

Auburn put us in. P Chew & D Latto (38) had their third successful opening partnership in a row with 81. The second wicket hit 130 with D Kidd showing a welcome return to form with 57. The later batsmen lost their wickets chasing quick runs. P Chew went on to score his maiden century with an impressive 125. In the final 11 overs of the day, Auburn were 3/16. This could easily have been 5/16. We needed an outright win to reach the Semi-Finals and there was great disappointment when we lost our seventh Saturday of the season to rain.
