PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The end of my first year as President, and it has to be said that it was an immensely tough season, on and off the field. A season of administration, captaincy, playing and umpiring has left me pretty drained, and it is clear that there is a lot of hard work to be done in the off season to rectify the clubs standing.

Smithy left me with the on field legacy of a 2nd placing in the club championship, and in the end, I came nowhere near living up to it. Our performances on the field in season 2008/09 were well below par. We struggled to have the numbers to field full sides each weekend in the lower grades, and we struggled to get results all over the park. Of the Shires grades, only the 4th grade old brigade made the finals, but after a weekend of controversy, they succumbed to Burwood in the semi's in what I believe was the first ever 50 over a side finals match.

The Master juggernaught, consisting of a large number of the 4th grade side also continued their dominance, claiming yet another Premiership, and extending their winning streak to well over 24 months. These were the only bright notes of the season from a team perspective.

As I said previously, we struggled to find numbers some weeks, with our total roster, and peoples general availability both being down. The Executive will be working hard during the off season to ensure that our numbers will be better for season 2009/10, and this is already looking very possible with the return of Charlie Carter and confirmation of two other young tourists from England attending the club next season. I have always found in the past that having some overseas talent at the club seems to improve the mood and commitment, so here's hoping that the trend continues.

Attendance at training this season was another factor in our poor on field performance. Each and every week it was the same faces that were there, and the same faces that were not. There has been much talk amongst the membership about the standard of our facilities, and a lot of feedback has made it back to the committee, and in turn been used in discussions with the University.

The most common comment has been that there's no point in training on our pitches because they don't represent match day conditions. There are two things that I'll say on the subject. One, we are working hard to try to ensure that the facilities are of a standard that is not dangerous. This is the primary concern for this committee. As far as likeness to match conditions goes, we never know what kind of pitch we're going to find on the weekend, so being realistic, there is no specific pitch that will always give you the exact match conditions from the previous, nor the next weekends match. My advice to players is to get on with it. I agree that it can be hard batting on those training wickets, but the reality is, if you can handle the conditions on those decks, and take a patient attitude to it, and make sure you don't lose your wicket on them, you'll find that batting on the weekend will be far easier.

From a bowler's point of view, it's pretty simple. I've seen that many bowlers, and a number of non-bowlers, get excited about the pitches at training, trying to hit people and cause as much mayhem as possible. How does anyone think that is going to help you, or the bloke facing up, with their game? The idea for the bowlers is simply practice putting the ball in the right areas; the areas that you'll be bowling on the weekends in a match. Remember that you're there for your own benefit, and to get the most out of it, you need to focus on your own game.

If we are serious about competing for Premierships and Club Championships, it should be pretty clear to most people that we need to start getting to training regularly. There is absolutely no substitute for hitting, catching and bowling balls, and if we as players expect to be able to turn up once a week on a Saturday and be firing on all cylinders, we're kidding ourselves. Our social activities were also fairly poorly attended this season. With the exception of the annual dinner and the BBQ held after the last round of the regular season, there were always the same faces at after match drinks at the Ranch, and at our other functions.

Our relationship with U@MQ continues to strengthen, and we will be looking at using the relationship more and more over the coming season. We are also looking at trying to become an official part of the University again during the off season.

Our focus moving forward is to:

- Improve and increase our participating numbers;
- Make better use of our Alliance with Gordon DCC;
- Continue to improve our working relationship with U@MQ;
- To explore all possibilities to gain adequate facilities on the Northern Oval
- To improve our fund raising initiatives
- To help initiate an improvement in Club Spirit and social participation.

I'd like to congratulate all this seasons award winners, especially Clint Simpson on taking out the M R Gwilliam Shield for season 2008/09. I'd also like to pass on my personal thanks to Tim Morrow for all his efforts in the second half of the season in assisting the committee, especially in his help organising the annual dinner.

As always, thanks goes to the committee for their continued efforts throughout the season, without volunteers, a club such as ours cannot survive, so congratulations to you all for getting us through another season.

To Warren Montford, a huge thank you. You served with Smithy last season, and you were in a great position to help me learn the ropes in my first season as President. I will take a lot of the experience you have passed on forward as I try to forge out my own legacy over the coming seasons.

To the captains, thank you for your efforts over the season. It was not an easy year, but you all kept plugging away, and I hope we have all given the club something to build on in the coming years.

Finally, to all the people who volunteered any small amount of time over the past 6 months to help out, whether it be covers on a Friday night or Saturday morning, setting up for training, cooking a BBQ at an event, setting up for a social event or in the case of the WAGS, giving up your Saturday or Sunday to come an offer support to your partner and our club; all these efforts are greatly appreciated.

HONORARY SECRETARY'S REPORT

Season 2008-09 certainly represented a changing of the guard in more ways than one. With a fresh committee and the undeniable confidence of youth (present company excluded) we set about achieving an ambitious set of goals for the season ahead.

Firstly, we needed to continue the work done and solidify our relationship with the University. Whilst this is an ongoing work in progress, certain aspects of the relationship have moved into the current age and the next two to three years will be incredibly important to our development as the chief facilitator of cricket at the University. The signs are certainly positive that we can be re-admitted as a University Club and we are certainly moving towards that goal with vigour.

Certain aspects of our relationship have changed forever though. We now need to ensure we are a net positive contributor to the University's cashflow as well as the social and sporting calendar. This was the first season during which we were charged for ground hire and we certainly have a performance gap in terms of our ability to replace the \$30,000 per season swing in going from receiving grant money to paying for ground hire. Whilst we improved on this front this season, there still remains a significant defecit that needs to be addressed by the club and it's members as a matter of priority.

On the field we weren't quite as competitive as last season although there were some good performances. Having been involved on the selection committee in what I would imagine was a record year in terms of total player numbers, a new challenge reared it's head. Out of a potential 75 new members this year the large majority were unwilling or unable to commit to a full season of cricket. The core group of regulars could not consistently cope with the changing team numbers and the lack of stability certainly showed in the results of some of the grades. Of what we believed to be a windfall in replacing our player numbers we had somewhere in the vicinity of 50 players play 3 games or less for the season, which made continuity a virtual impossibility this year and certainly the committee has it's work cut out next season to meet the demands of the current generation of player who struggles to be available for a full day of sport on the weekends.

The standout performances this season again went to the older brigade. My congratulations to Greg and the fourth grade lads on another outstanding season, unfortunately falling short at the final hurdle. Without doubt our Rock of Gibralta continues to be the Steve O'Reilly allstars in Masters, continuing their record unbeaten streak through a third successive season and sweeping all before them again. Well done lads.and I look forward to seeing you do it all again next season.

I'd personally like to thank Paul for stepping up and leading the club this season into new and uncharted territory. It will certainly be an enjoyable ride the next couple of seasons. To Tim Morrow for showing that the youth of today is capable of commitment, you were a worthy recipient of the Ivan Blyth Memorial. To Ross for acting as our SCA delegate and continuing to support the club by any and all available means, your efforts are very much appreciated. To Paul Mac, Simon Fairlie, "Corey" McPherson and Wrighty and the rest of the committee, thankyou again for your support this year, your club certainly appreciates you.

Onward to next season and a new set of challenges, I look forward to meeting them with you all next year.

HONORARY TREASURER'S REPORT

2008-09 was certainly a very challenging year financially. Several factors contributed to yet another poor financial performance and require immediate addressing if the club is to have a viable financial future.

As stated last year, one of the major challenges facing the club is replacing the funding previously received from MUSR (now U@MQ) that was in the vicinity of \$20,000 during 2004 and 2005. For the first time this season we were charged for the hire of our grounds, meaning we now have an annual deficiency of around \$30,000 which we need to replace. Whilst work was commenced towards achieving this aim, the fundraising measures we are putting in place such as Bunnings BBQ's, Corporate Games canteens etc are certainly limited in their ability to replace this sort of cash drain.

A tightening of the belt this season certainly helped stem the flow. Player payments were down \$12,000 from the previous years spend of \$20,000 (including the \$1100 paid this season for outstanding University course fees) to \$8,000 for the current season. More work will be needed in this area – player payments past the 2009/10 season are certainly likely to be limited to genuine interest coaches playing fee free for the season rather than any monetary reward once the current obligations are finalised next year.

A secondary element needs to be reviewed that occurred this year. We had an astoundingly transient playing population this season. With nearly 50 players playing 3 games or less for the season charging and collecting fees from these players was nigh on impossible. Whereas we would normally have collected fees from 18 to 20 additional full season playing members, we were only able to collect scant amounts from this transient population and more work needs to be done by the committee next season on accepting only players committed to playing an overwhelming majority of games. As a result, membership collections were down nearly \$6 000 from the previous year although a significant proportion of that money has since been collected.

The club has reached a stage where the balance sheet needs to be rebuilt. I am reticent to allow the savings account balance to deplete below \$5 000 as this start-up money is needed each year going forward. A new fee structure will be trialled next year with significant savings for early payment and payment by direct deposit, rather than using a penalty system for late payments which has rarely been collected in the past. Your assistance in this is appreciated – whilst early payment will void an increase in general fee levels next season it is hoped this will significantly improve cash flow at the beginning of the year to enable new equipment to be purchased which the club now needs for each of it's grades.

By the end of next season it is imperative we have sourced and found a major sponsor for our club for our continued future financial viability. Fundraising activities will remain an important focus and savings will be made on the expenditure front, but for the balance sheet to improve in this new age for Macquarie a sponsor will solve a large portion of the cash defecit to allow fundraising to rebuild our former nest egg.

I hope you are all well rested and look forward to seeing you all next year as we do it all again.

CAPTAIN'S REPORT – 1ST GRADE SHIRES

It was my pleasure to captain a relatively young and inexperienced side this season. After the first three rounds we were surprisingly n a position where we could make a run at the finals, but never consistently got going for two matches in a row and we fell short of what was a realistic goal of making quarter finals this year.

Hopefully this was a good learning experience for most of the team and the building blocks for the next 3 to 4 years were set in place. With only a few of the Parramatta connection from the past couple of seasons left, the pleasing aspect was the number of individuals who stood up at varying stages throughout the season. Individual performers will be mentioned shortly, but to sum our season up we could have made more of our opportunities had we lifted as a group at the critical stages of the games we missed out on. We were never far outclassed, and when we put it together showed we could match it with the best running around, however our general fielding needs to improve significantly if we are to compete week in and week out at this level and every individual needs to take responsibility for their own performance in this area. We can improve as a group by improving as individuals, and this will allow us to win more of the key moments of the tight games.

Highlights of the year included a stellar start by Whippa, who threatened to realise that boundless potential hidden within him. Dave Kelly proved that aggressive intent and heart goes a long way topping the batting aggregate for the year with 421 runs as an opener.

Tossa was certainly a find at the opening position and consistency will be the key to his permanent arrival in this grade. Scott Bratley contributed a pewter to the first grade cause with a masterful century against competition heavyweights Strathfield to save an outright defeat.

Jai Shyam came on as a genuine all rounder at this level and his bowling performances surprisingly exceeded the results of the abundant batting talent at his fingertips. AJ Gray certainly was never short of advice and showed he has the potential to be amongst the leading group of players at this level in years to come.

On the bowling front, Mark Fairlie showed glimpses of the maturity needed to compete consistently at this level and will look forward to his return as a seasoned campaigner next season. CAPTAIN'S REPORT – 2ND GRADE SHIRES

Reflecting on the season makes you want to draw the positives from what was obviously a very disappointing one. I would like to thank all the guys for their efforts during the season and hope that the camaraderie found during tough times will forge a stronger belief in future seasons. I knew it would be tough from the outset, with probably only 3 or 4 regular 2nd graders available from the previous season, it would fall on those players and some young talent to allow us to be competitive, which we were. In the end there were a total of 27 players used throughout the season, always a sign of an unsettled line up.

In most games we needed to play to the best of our ability and make good things happen. The overall results line is depressing, with only 1 victory (in Round 2 at Epping) and one draw, which was fortunate as we were in deep trouble at 4/32 when the rain came. Out of the eleven losses we were in with a good chance to win 8 of the matches. The closest we went to an outright defeat was at Georges River when after being rolled in the first innings for a measly 64 we were able to set a target for GR and have them 7 wickets down chasing the total.

The best team batting performance was 6/284 dec against Strathfield (Chris Savage scoring the only century for the team during the season) and the following game was the worst, a 188 runs loss at Warringah in which we were rolled for 99. Bowling wise Marty Payne had the best individual figures of 4/30 and match figures of 7/79 at Georges River in the near miss for a surprising outright victory.

Statistically the batting average of 19.66 runs for the loss of a wicket compares with previous seasons, but it was the average of 25.68 runs for each wicket taken which points to our inadequacy to hold on to the chances created by our bowlers that cost us. Regularly we would have to create 5 or 6 extra chances to bowl out the opposition.

Individually, AJ Gray was the find of the season scoring 293 runs at the very healthy average of 36.63 from 7 appearances, giving us 3 games in which he provided the backbone of the innings to allow us a competitive score. The innings of 67 at Castlewood on a tough deck with a really slow outfield was my pick of the season and we came within 3 overs of a win defending a small total.

Marty took the bowling honours collecting 21 wickets @ 20.76. He earned his golden arm reputation by regularly breaking any partnerships, averaging 2 wickets in each of his 11 appearances. No reference of Marty can be complete without his masterful 'chat' and commitment, a pleasure to play with and a well deserved MVP for the side.

Finally I would like to outline some of the players' efforts and highlights. In no particular order:

Andrew 'Toss' Tosolini – converting him to an opener was a highlight and we quickly lost him up to 1st grade, but the 388 runs scored over all grades points to a bright future in higher grades, now all we need is a season in which the batting and bowling talents combine.

Anthony 'Choppy' Hale – quickly taken from Brownie's grasp in 4th's Choppy was a revelation with the fitness program (and Skins) creating a reborn man. He was able to repeatedly get the early breakthrough, swinging the ball prodigiously (taking 13 wickets) and proved a handy, lower order batsmen with his patented Choppy style, including a memorable 42 at Lane Cove.

Greg Denlow – moved through 2nd grade quickly bowling. With maturity, speed and movement combining to trouble the best batsmen in our grade, this was borne out in his 1st grade performances. It was too brief.

Yousef 'Rooster' Sethi – quickly found himself in 2's and contributed with the bat and ball, 171 runs @ 21.4 and 10 wickets @ 20 a piece with his wily off spin in 6 appearances and his memorable 'Waiting' call. I hope his work commitments don't end his contributions to the club.

The club stalwarts who performed admirably in 2nd grade, notably Paul McInnes, Warren Montford, Ross McIntyre, Stephen Rose, Richie Cann and Pete Saliba in their all too brief appearances.

Tim Morrow and Simon Fairlie came back into 2's the hard way and performed well taking 8 and 10 wickets respectively.

The young brigade of Chris McPherson, Greg Joffe, Niraj Pathak and Jason Tabrett who came in and provided much needed enthusiasm mostly towards to end of the season and showed glimpses of their potential in a couple of appearances in 2's.

Lastly, Chris Savage, ultimately moving to Brisbane with Penny for work, was a loss to the club not only as a player but as a person. His contribution on the field was notable for the 260 runs @ 29 (including the 100 against Strathfield), and as a regular source for inspiration and a steady calming influence. I wis h him all the best for the future, and thanks for all your help.
