PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The 2024-25 season was a good one for the club. Our performances on the field were commendable, and we increased our playing numbers from 3 teams to 4 teams in summer and 2 teams to 4 teams in winter. I'd particularly like to congratulate our 5th Singh summer team and Macquarie Magenta 22nd Division winter team who both had fantastic seasons by coming Runners Up in their competitions. I'd also like to thank all our captains for the hard work they did in organising their teams, and ensuring they competed with good sportsmanship.

In September the season began with some excitement as our nomination to be in 2nd Grade on turf was accepted by the NCU. Along with this excitement, was some nervousness as to whether we were up to the challenge. However, the addition of several experienced players from Bethel 2nd Grade to our core group of 3rd graders, left us feeling confident that we could compete successfully at this level and for most of the season, we did. It was only in the last round where a close win by North Shore enabled them to jump over us into the four.

The 2024-25 season will also be remembered the incredible number of runs scored by two 5th Grade players - Rajpreet Singh and Farhan Ali. Rajpreet scored 924 @ 84.00 and Farhan scored 918 @ 91.8. This is now the first and second most runs scored in a season in the history of our club.

As you read through the 2024-25 Annual Report you will notice the extensive statistics for each team and grade. For this, I'd like to thank Mr Warrick Folkard for the terrific job he has done in ensuring that our NCU Records are complete.

I know he has spent many hours doing this and I'm sure you will enjoy poring over them in this Annual Report. I'd also like to thank him for proof reading each of the Captains' Reports.

This season we were again sponsored by Angle Finance and I'd like to thank former player, Craig Edwards, for his generosity in making this possible.

As the new season approaches there are two important concepts I'd like to briefly discuss. The first is something that just sits quietly in the background until it is needed. When called upon it quickly differentiates between two teams, placing one above another. This is the concept of quotient, which is a team's batting average divided by its bowling average. The batting average for a team is obtained by dividing the total number of runs scored by it, by the total number of wickets lost. The bowling average for a team is obtained by dividing the total runs scored against it, by the total number of wickets taken.

All players should understand that in our games every wicket and every run counts. So, in simple terms you should try to take as many wickets as possible for as few runs as possible and score as many runs as possible without giving your wicket away. This should be always kept in mind, but particularly after a result has been obtained and you are playing out time. Luckily quotient didn't come into play for us this season, but no doubt someday it will.

The second is punctuality and this is something that has been letting us down for a few seasons now. To put it simply, punctuality is the quality of being on time. It is something that is a highly valued trait in both personal and professional settings. It demonstrates reliability and a commitment to fulfilling obligations. Being punctual at cricket is essential. Our captains have enough to worry about on game day without having to worry whether someone will arrive on time.

Despite this problem, we had some wonderful performances this season including a number of maiden centuries for the club.

HONORARY TREASURER'S REPORT

Financial Year: 1 July 2024 – 30 June 2025

Welcome to Macquarie University Cricket Club Treasurer's Report 2024 – 25. This report summarizes the financial activities of the club for the period 1 July 2024 to 30 June 2025, including income, expenditure, and overall financial position. Revenue for the period 1 July 2023 to 30 June 2024 rose by \$6437 from the previous FY 2023- 24. It is an increase of approximately 38%. The main cause being MUCC introducing the number of teams to 4 in Summer 2024 – 25 NSCA competition and 4 teams in SMCA 2025 Winter competition. The club has shown continuous growth in participation which has resulted in increased number of teams and hence additional revenue through player registrations and other avenues. The club should continue to prosper in Summer 2025-26 season per ongoing participation trends. While the Treasurer considers that the financial statement for 2025 is better than the previous year, the balance sheet gives negative annual outcome and there is scope for further improvement. The key factors governing finances are as below.

Summary of Transactions

- Total Income: \$27505 for the year (including summer, winter and direct deposits to MUCC bank account) which is a big portion of MUCC revenue.
- Total Expenditure: \$28132 (umpire fees, association fees, clothing, gear, nets)
- Net Position: -\$627 (deficit for the year)

Major Income Sources

- Player Registrations -\$23720
- Sponsorship & Donations - \$1000
- Clothing sales - \$2110

Major Expenditures

- Umpire fees - \$2550
- Association Fees (NCU, SMCA)- \$13850
- Clothing & Gear - \$2577
- Cricket Nets & Training Costs - \$1680
- Cricket balls & other gear - \$5456
- Membership refunds - \$1420

Comments

- The club managed significant outflows this year primarily due to training costs, clothing costs, umpire costs and competition fees.
- Recommendation: Increase registration fee, sponsorship targets and fundraising initiatives to maintain positive cash flow next year. Find a more cost-effective clothing supplier.
- Incentive payments made to players & committee was kept at a minimum. Zero.
- Special thanks to our sponsors – Angle finance for \$1000. Thanks to continuous kind efforts of our club president.
- No grants were sanctioned to MUCC this year. We will continue to find ways in coming months for approvals.
- No annual dinners saved on costs too. All other overheads were kept to a minimum.

This leaves MUCC with bank balance of \$257.3 as on 30/06/2025 after incurring all the costs and a few costs due to be paid.

MATCH REPORTS

Round 1 vs North Shore at Northbridge Oval

North Shore won the toss and elected to bat first, getting off to a great start with the openers putting on a 97-run stand, which was then broken by David Willis when he bowled one of the openers for 31. Two more quick wickets fell courtesy of Sunny and Pratham. North Shore ended the innings at 6-250, with their captain scoring an unbeaten 154. The chase for Macquarie did not start the way we would have liked, with a fall of three early wickets that left us at 3-11. Tharun and Kartik then put on a blistering partnership of 90 scored from the next eight overs, until the fall of Kartik's wicket. We then collapsed, being bowled out for 124. Only sometime later did we find out that North Shore had forfeited the game for playing an ineligible player.

Round 2 vs Cammeray at Northbridge Oval

Macquarie University 8/240 defeated Cammeray 6/215

Macquarie won the toss this time, deciding to bat first getting off to a good start with an opening partnership of 68. The second wicket partnership was the highlight of the match with a 107 run stand between Tharun and Mohit, where Mohit was dismissed for a well-made (44). We then went on to finish the innings at 8-240 with the bulk of the runs coming from Tharun who played a fabulous innings of (129). In the chase Cammeray also got a 50+ run opening partnership which was then broken by Kartik. Though the second wicket partnership for Cammeray was not an easy one to break, it was finally ended by Pratham who broke the 96-run stand. The next 4 wickets did not put up much of a fight. Cammeray then went on to finish the innings 6-215, unable to get 36 from the last over.

Round 3 vs Rydalmere Wrens at Upjohn Park

Macquarie University 96 and 6/72 defeated by Rydalmere Wrens 5/322 dec.

Rydalmere Wrens secured a dominant 226-run victory over Macquarie University in this match. Batting first, Rydalmere Wrens posted an imposing 5 for 322 declared, with Ijaz Aziz scoring 112 not out, Dhrumil Shah adding 87, and Hari Vaheesan contributing 55. Macquarie University struggled in response, getting bowled out for just 96 runs in 48.4 overs, despite Priyank Rajvanshi's (24 not out) and Bijay Thakur's (21). MATCH REPORTS

Round 1 vs Macquarie University Yahya at Curtis Oval

Macquarie University Singh 2/141 defeated Macquarie University Yahya 137

In a well-contested match played at Dundas Park on a slow outfield, Macquarie University Yahya posted a respectable total of 137. Despite the challenging conditions, Yahya's batting showed resilience. However, a balanced and disciplined bowling effort from the Singh side kept the total within reach. Abdullah was the standout performer with the ball, claiming 4 wickets and delivering a superb spell that put the brakes on Yahya's innings. In response, Macquarie University Singh delivered a dominant batting display. The chase was anchored by a classy unbeaten knock of (47not out) from Lucky Randhawa. He was well-supported by Rajpreet Singh, who played an explosive innings, smashing a rapid half-century that included 8 boundaries and 4 sixes. The strong partnership and aggressive batting saw Singh's team chase down the target comfortably in just 18 overs, sealing a convincing victory.

Round 2 vs Carlingford Waratahs at Pidding Park

Macquarie University Singh 5/311 dec defeated Carlingford Waratahs 9/164

Macquarie University Singh claimed a convincing victory over Carlingford Waratahs, winning by the DLS method after setting an imposing total and delivering a disciplined bowling performance. Team Singh won the toss and elected to bat first. Despite losing two early wickets, Vicky and Lucky steadied the innings with a solid partnership. The momentum was then taken to another level by a brilliant century from Farhan Ali, who played with class and composure. Valuable lower-order contributions from Sameer helped push the total to a commanding 5/311 before declaring. With the weather proving unpredictable and rain affecting play, Singh had just 25 overs to secure a result. Rising to the challenge, the bowling unit executed their plans with precision. Carlingford Waratahs were restricted to 9/164 in their allotted overs. Lucky led the bowling attack with impressive figures of (3/32), while Vicky supported well with (2/13). The collective effort ensured a comfortable win under the DLS system. Farhan Ali was deservedly named Player of the Match for his outstanding century that laid the foundation for victory.

Round 3 vs North Shore at Naremburn Park

We continued our strong form with a dominant first-innings victory over North Shore. North Shore won the toss and elected to bat first. Despite losing two quick wickets early, they mounted a strong comeback with a resilient 180-run partnership for the third wicket, taking them to a commanding position by lunch. However, the momentum shifted dramatically after the break. Rajpreet Singh broke the stand with a well-executed off-spin delivery, and shortly after, a brilliant direct-hit run-out from the covers further derailed North Shore's innings. What followed was a dramatic collapse, with the batting side crumbling to 218 all out. The key bowling contributions came from Rajpreet Singh (3/53) and Sameer (2/19), as the bowling unit executed a disciplined and spirited performance. In response, we began our chase aggressively. Sahil Jatain set the tone with a brisk (43), while Lucky anchored the innings with a steady knock. By the end of the first day, the team had reached a solid 1/106. Despite heavy rain being forecast for the following Saturday, the team's determination was on full display. Players came together early in the morning, using blowers and mops to dry the pitch and make play possible. Their efforts paid off. Rajpreet Singh - Rajpreet led from the front with an outstanding all-round season. But his impact didn't stop with the bat — Rajpreet was also a force with the ball, finishing as the second- highest wicket-taker of the season with 31 wickets.

Farhan Ali - Farhan had an exceptional season, amassing 918 runs, making him the second-highest run-scorer behind Rajpreet. Known for his ability to clear the boundary with ease, Farhan earned the nickname “Sixer King”, often sending bowlers – and fielders – into the bushes looking for the ball.

Finn Corbett – Finn showed great promise with his off-spin bowling. Unfortunately, a back injury in the second half of the season cut short his playing time, but his performances early on were encouraging.

Ravi Gujjar – Despite joining mid-season and facing NCU restrictions on both batting and bowling, Ravi impressed with the ball and added punch with the bat through quick-fire cameos. A valuable late addition to the squad.

Nitin Gupta – A stand-out new addition, Nitin quickly made his mark with his clever use of variations and control over the old ball. He proved to be a partnership-breaker in key moments and a real find for the team this season.

Abdullah Haseen – A fiery pace bowler who led several bowling spells, including key performances in tight games.

Sahil Jatain- One of the fastest bowlers in the squad, he battled through an ankle injury that sidelined him for parts of the season. However, he bounced back strongly, saving his best performance for the finals.

Alby Joseph - A team-first player who brought energy and dedication both on and off the field.
