

The senior more vocal members of the Club should look at their current contribution and how they can help the Club go forward rather than dwell on the past.

I would like to thank Jock for his co-ordination of the ground staff and preparation of the Northern Square - the wicket really came good after Christmas. Credit to Jock for the continued wicket improvements - he started in 1990 - the same year as our dramatic rise in M&S. The rewards of the continued negotiations are obvious - we now have ovals that are result oriented not "concrete park". Special thanks to Adam (Sheeran Oval), Peter (Gwilliam Oval and for running the show so capably in Jock's absences) and Troy (the practice squares).

The Club needs to examine its future. We are an aging Club with only 2 regular A graders under 24 and only 2 current students on Committee. Over the past five years a small number of dedicated individuals have run and organised the Club. These people are no longer playing or have other commitments. This is a student Club - we need input from the student members and we need to attract more students. How can we do this? Everyone needs to look at themselves to see what contribution they can make to the running of the Club. So, if you feel you have time to make a contribution for the whole season make it known!

TREASURER'S REPORT

I am pleased to report that the Club's finances continue to be in good shape.

During the 1993/94 year, although the balance sheet demonstrates a drop in accumulated funds of \$6,769.24, that figure does not take into account the funding from the Macquarie University Sports Association for the 1994 calendar year, which has been approved at \$5700. Further, a significant purchase of cricket balls and equipment was undertaken in March, 1994 to cover much of the recurrent equipment expense for the 1994/95 season, and with those two items taken into account the balance sheet demonstrates a fairly even result for the 1993/94 year.

In anticipation of the planned 1994 UK Tour, no club project fund proposals were put to M.U.S.A., for the 1993 calendar year, and the only project put for the 1994 year was the UK Tour which ultimately did not transpire. Despite the lack of supplementary funding from the Macquarie University Sports Association through the Club project funds, the club has continued its commitment to provide quality equipment to all teams, and substantial purchases of covers, super-soppers and the like continued throughout the year to make equipment our largest expenditure item.

Profits from the social events reached a very pleasing figure. While our own social events were a major part of this, additional profits from serving drinks and sausage sandwiches to touch footballers greatly boosted that figure, and I would like to thank all those involved in assisting over several weeks, in particular the three Daves, David Webb, David Folkard and David Budge.

The 1993/94 season saw us paying a player-coach for the women's side for the first time, and the Club commitment in that respect I believe is a large part of the success which the women's side enjoyed. I would recommend that the Club continue and in fact expand, its commitment to payment of senior personnel in particular coaching staff in future years.

The 1993/94 season saw further expansion of the Club with 7 teams being entered in competition for the first time. It is pleasing that the Club has been able to fully equip all teams and manage the expenses involved with all these teams without a severe draining of accumulated funds.

As I retire as "Temporary Treasurer" I would like to encourage the club to commit to providing full equipment to players and to look at payment of senior players as well as coaching staff in an effort to improve performances. The Shires competition is increasingly becoming a professional competition, and we would not wish to look back on relatively unsuccessful seasons in the mid 1990's and regret that our attitude and commitment had not been as professional as the clubs who were successful. Let us not accumulate funds for the sake of it but let us use the funds in a sensible way for the benefit of all club members and the future success of the club in its various competitions.

I would like to thank the Sports Association for its support during the year. Through the efforts of the office staff and ground staff we have the privilege of playing on the best equipped grounds in our respective competitions. That is a privilege I have been most grateful for over the years and one which I would encourage the Club to recognise.

Finally, I would like to record my appreciation for the seemingly inexhaustible efforts of Bruce Hort throughout the last year and in the past. Most club members would be unaware of the mountain of administrative work involved in keeping a club of our size going, let alone expanding as we have over recent seasons. To Bruce for making that commitment and performing above reasonable expectations, and for Pip's support, my heartfelt thanks.

Hope to see you all again next season.

COACHES' REPORT

Congratulations to the Club for third in the Club championship is a great result for the Club. Four teams from seven in the finals with two premierships, a second and third placing, is outstanding. Congratulations especially to the winners. We obviously have been doing something right, not only on the field, but at practice as well.

Firstly, thanks to Jock and his team for putting the effort into the 3 practice pitches. Good preparation of these pitches has a positive influence on the Club. It is easy to think of other Clubs without Jock's support and wonder how enjoyable it would be to play and practice there without it. Our facilities rank among the best in both Shires and Grade competitions.

Secondly, thanks to the earlybirds and stayers at practice, (often members of the Committee) who set up and put away the bowling mats, kit, stumps etc., for the rest of us to use as soon as we drop our own kits. The timekeepers, too, keep things rolling along.

Next Year

The one thing we would like to encourage most in players at practice is a strong determination to improve. The way to tough it out on the field on Saturdays is to tough it out at practice - to go home tired from both days.

The skill we rate "No 1" is the ability to think straight under pressure. Examples of batsmen who bat all day (eg Damon Law in the C Grade Semi), or bowlers who are economical at the end of their spell as at the beginning (eg Budgie), fielders who stop singles no matter what the score (eg Webby) and game-breakers who can deliver results out of the blue (eg Toy) are good to watch and worth copying. How many times have we been frustrated by stubborn batsmen with seemingly limited talent, or been dismissed by bowlers who simply plug away? Players (and ultimately teams) who think straight under pressure, win more often.

We tend to adopt one of two approaches at practice. By turning up and only going through the motions we reinforce both our good habits and our bad ones. When training becomes routine, we may mentally have slipped back to the maintenance mode.

Developing our skills means improving the good habits and minimising the bad ones - getting surprised or tested (by a good ball or dropped catch or lack of rhythm), and then doing something about it. It's at this point that the coaches can help. The difference between the two approaches is cricketers who push themselves, and the results are more runs, more wickets, more enjoyment and higher grades.

We may try some things next season to eccourage this. One experiment this year was to invite Women's Test keeper Chris Matthews to work with our keepers. This worked well and may be something we sample again. We may try structuring a "skills" net so that if you have something specific to work on, you can. Something like this would give me more of a chance to serve the whole club as well.

We would be delighted if players approached us with their opinion of these simple options, or some new suggestions that we could try. Congratulations once again to the Club for your results and for your commitment to practice throughout the season.

CAPTAIN'S REPORT - 'A' SHIRES

Following the near win last year, it's naturally a disappointment that we didn't win this year, let alone reach the semis. Despite the changes in personnel, we had the chances to get there and let them all slip through our fingers...literally. If our catching had been better....well, we all know how this ends, don't we. If.....!

Points of interest:

- Finished equal 8th, with 5 wins, 4 losses and 3 draws.
- + Four of the top 6 batters scored 340+ runs and averaged above 30. It was good to see some batters turn their potential into form. The lower order though didn't get their opportunities to develop.
- + Our bowlers were consistent with three reaching 20 wickets. Only once, though, did a bowler take a good start onto a 5 wicket haul.
- Our fielding was poor catching, mobility in the field and lack of throwing arms cost us wins. Only one opposition batter reached fifty without a "life".
- + Only twice did we miss taking 10 opposition first innings wickets. On the other hand, we were only bowled out 4 times all season. We never lost defending a total. Our chasing of totals lost us 4 games but won us 2, nearly 3.
- Losing Nasty, Gavo, Murph and Craig Bayliss were big blows to us. Only 5 players played every game. 17 others were picked at some point for a total of 22 having played A grade this season! It's hard to build a winning team with such changes. Injury, work and going overseas took their toll.. Without a stronger engine room next year we won't do much better.

In summary, we played ourselves into winning positions but were too often unable to force a win. Patchy concentration let us down. I reckon we've got the skills, but we were not "with it" for long enough periods in a day. Congratulations to Lindfield on yet another A Grade win.

Lastly, a personal note of thanks to the team for their support. After 3 years of semi-finals, I am disappointed (who isn't) that we went downwards rather than upwards on the ladder. Gavo had done a good job. Nevertheless, I do sense that individuals have improved, so hopefully with better teamwork, we'll take two steps forward next season.

MATCH REPORTS - 'A' SHIRES

v Lane Cove 5/221 defeated Lane Cove 219

A great start to the season. Did very well on a super Uni wicket to bowl them out after they were 1/157. Dermie on debut took the bowling honours when all the bowlers were excellent. When batting, had the mother of all horror starts; 2-0 in the first over of our first innings in our first game! Legs (78no) and Phantom (87) resurrected us to 4/153, with Legs (turning on the power) and Murph (22no) then chipping in to see us home late in the day.

v Strathfield 153 lost to Strathfield 202

A one-dayer after day 1 washed out. Overall we performed well in the field, however their total was boosted by their skipper's 92, Webby 3/51. A gettable target on an awkward pitch, we hung in but were never able to mount a good partnership to actually take control. All out with 7 overs to go,- Mono (49), CB (23). Disappointing to lose, but they simply bowled better than we did.

v Epping 204 & 4/215 defeated Epping 132

Won the toss, batted, and ought to have set a larger target having faced only 67 overs! Webby, Mono and Phantom all scored 40's. Bowled brilliantly to have them 3/12 overnight. The next week saw Epping at 5/26 and then rolled for 132. Dermie's "outies" picked up 4 wickets. Second innings belonged to CB - scored 96 in about 60 balls with sensational shots around the ground, 19 boundaries.

v Burwood 7/242 drew with 265

Lost the toss and bowled well on another belter. A poor display in the field. We could have restricted them to 200, hence a win. Toy snared 4/48 and was also the most committed in the field. Wick was unlucky with 2/44 off 23 overs. With 80 overs to bat, Edgo (76) and Legs (43) gave us a dream start 0/133, only to then tumble to 3/133 and struggle from there chasing 4+ per over. There were lots of positives from the game - we created opportunities to win - but then we wasted them while fielding, and batting (by not finding gaps or being content with singles). These misses made the difference in a close game, hence a draw.

v. Lindfield Draw - no play

Rain washed out both days of the whole competition. Lucky it didn't happen next round!

v Pennant Hills 7(dec)/148 defeated Pennant Hills 90 & 8/154

Won the toss, and after having them 5/29, the intensity dropped and a couple of run-outs were missed. At the end we took 4/3 to finish them. Webby and Frankie Avalon each took 3-fa. As good as it was, it could have been better.

Batting was good on a poor wicket - Webby starred with 52. Intense lobbying from a faction within the team, (the bowlers), saw us declare for a final fling at them after a boiling hot day; 2/12 overnight. To their credit, Pennant Hills hung on the next week, on a wet (therefore better than usual) track - Murph and Budgie did well for 3-fa each.

v Auburn 5(dec)/317 defeated Auburn 51 & 3/156

Won the toss and batted. Everyone did well; Phantom (89no), Mono (81), Il Ducè (48), Legs (34), Webby (31no) and Schaafs (23).

Super performances by Dermie (6/25) and Webby (2/20) flattened Auburn. It took 24 overs on a faster Uni deck. Good catching supported them. The outright was on, but Auburn dug in well second time around.

v Holroyd 187 lost to Holroyd 245

Very disappointing to fall short of this target on the "postage stamp". This loss hurt us the most! Solid bowling - Murph 3/26, Webby 3/67, Frankie 2/49. Sadly <u>again</u> one or two costly catches missed during Holroyd's extremely frustrating batting - fortune definitely against us. Our batting was aggressive but careless, except for Webby's 67 holding us together.

v Bexley 5(dec) 241 drew Bexley 9/191

No points for our efforts - the scores showing us the better side. Rain meant everyone else played one-dayers that guaranteed results. Won the toss, batted and left Bexley 4 an over to win in a rain shortened game. Phantom (52), Legs and Mono 43 each, Webby and Toy 30s each in quick time. A tense game where Bexley left it late to mount a serious charge. Wickets fell quickly at the end, and again we dropped catches. We chased the last wicket for three overs without success. Budgie 4/30 and Wick 2/68 the pick, with some good work by Linus with a stumping and a few catches.

v Roseville 119 & 1/88 lost to Roseville 6(dec)254

Humiliating loss in the end. It typified our ability to get into a winning position and throw it away. Won the toss and sent them in on a green, grassy Uni deck. At 4/42, and after a dropped catch for 5/42, their skipper then got a streaky 68 and Beard 102no (dropped 5 times between them). Browny 2/73 and Dermie 3/37.

At 3/98 doing well, being all out for 119 was a disaster losing the last 6 wickets for 4 runs. Phantom (44), Mono (22no). The highlight for Roseville was their opening bowler finishing us off with 6 wickets in 13 balls. Better forgotten,....if only we could! Second dig Ivan smashed them for 59no.

v Canterbury drew with Canterbury 9/234 (under protest)

At this stage, it was "must win" cricket to make the semis having left ourselves a win off the pace. Bowled very tightly to have them 6/150 off 60 overs, however they hung on well. Doc made a sparkling debut in A's with 3/53. All the bowlers did well. It rained the next Friday night and on a sunny Saturday it was clear that Canterbury had failed to lay covers. We protested and "wuz robbed" of 6 points as the rules dictate. CAPTAIN'S REPORT - 'B' SHIRES

1993/94 was a season that started full of promise but ended in disappointment. We set out to defend our premiership but finished equal 5th and so did not figure in the semi-finals.

We talked a lot early in the season about the difficulties that are associated with defending a title and how we would face those difficulties. However, a combination of loss of players to "A" grade, a lack of mobility and fitness, the unavailability of key players and a loss of form and confidence saw us struggle, particularly after Christmas. We won only 1 of our last 5 games and in the end were relying on other teams losing to make the semis. We finished with 6 wins, 4 losses and 3 draws. You cannot drop more than 2 games if you want to be there at the end. Losses to Bexley and Warringah, who both finished well down the table were costly. Significantly, all grades of M&S were, once again, won by the minor premiers. Congratulations to Doug Latto and his "D" grade team and Janine and the women's team for their premierships.

On an individual level, Ramsland had a great season, taking 34 wickets at 17.67 each, including 7 for 47 against Burwood. Pedavoli picked up "B" grade's first ever hat trick. Brown topped the batting aggregate and average with 318 at 53 including 100 not out against Pennant Hills. He also took 23 wickets at 18.13. Brien also took 21 wickets at 22.6. Blyth was the only other batsman to pass 200, making 289 at 36.1. This is in stark contrast to the previous season where 8 batsmen topped 200 runs for the season, including 2 over 400. It is not hard to see where the problems came about in 1993/94. We need to return to that level of consistency next season. I would like to thank my fellow captains and the Committee for their help and support during the season. Also, to the ground staff, congratulations on a job well done.

Finally, I will take this opportunity to express my total dismay at the loss of facilities this season following the take-over of the Blue Barclay Pavilion by the Restaurant. In my 17 years of involvement with the SportsAssociation it has been my understanding that the facilities were for the use of students and Clubs. It concerns me that this no longer appears to be the case.

It goes without saying, that the Club's finances and tradition are effected by the modern day facilities. The after match beer and post mortems form an integral part of our culture. The Committee, needs to ensure that this tradition survives; a great challenge given that we are now offered less than in the past.

MATCH REPORTS - 'B' SHIRES.

Our bowling, with the exception of Ramsland (2 for 28 off 19 overs) was inaccurate and lacked penetration. Our lack of mobility in the field was alarming. The second day was washed out. It would be fair to say that we were over-weight and over-confident as we set out to defend our title.

This was a match reduced to a one day limited over fixture due to rain the first week. Strathfield chose to bat on an excellent Macquarie deck. By the end of the second over they may have regretted that decision being 3 for 1 with the 1 being a wide. They never recovered and were all out for 135. Randall bowled quickly to take 3/9 and Ramsland again bowled well to take 4/35. Brown opened for us because he had to leave early to go to a wedding, this turned out to be a good

tactic as he belted 72 before retiring. The target was achieved for the loss of 2 wickets off 38 overs. This was a comprehensive victory against a team that ultimately made the semi-finals.

v Epping 4 dec/128 defeated Epping 8 dec/123 and 6/190.

Epping batted on another excellent Macquarie wicket. We bowled and fielded well with wickets falling regularly before the Epping Captain made a surprise declaration. The wickets were shared with Brown, the main contributor, taking 3/41. We had 23 overs to get the runs before stumps and did so for the loss of 4 wickets. Blyth remained unbeaten on 68. On day 2 the Epping Captain expressed a desire to obtain an outright result but apparently did not communicate this to his batsmen. Due to injuries and weddings we were reduced to 3 bowlers who toiled away against plodding Epping batsmen. A halt was called after 72 overs by which time Epping had crawled to 6/190. Brown bowled a marathon 33 overs to take 2/79 and Ramsland took 3/51 off 23 overs.

v Burwood 60 &1/80 lost to Burwood 234.

Burwood chose to bat on a beautiful Rothwell wicket. At 4/210 they seemed assured of a big score. We had missed a couple of early chances and seemed set to pay for them. However, the Burwood batsmen lost the plot and became overly aggressive, this combined with Ramsland's patience saw them dismissed for 234. Doc bowled with great control and took the last 6 wickets for 3 runs, he finished with 7/47 off 22.3 overs. At stumps we were 1 for 17. On day 2 we arrived full of confidence: A beautiful fine day, a flat track and one of Burwood's opening bowlers out injured. The first ball of the day was a no ball, we then lost a wicket per over for the next five overs to be reduced to 6 for 19. We were all out for a pathetic 60. Burwood enforced the follow-on and we finished the day at 1 for 80. Burwood went on to be minor premiers. This match had a profound impact upon the team's performance over the remainder of the season, we never fully recovered our self confidence and ability to get ourselves out of tight situations.

v Lindfield - washed out

v Pennant Hills 6 dec 322 defeated Pennant Hills 103

We batted on a good Macquarie wicket hoping to set a big score for Pennant Hills to chase (who had not been competitive up to this point of the season). At 4/83 the match was evenly balanced, however, O'Keeffe (81) and Brown (100 not out) shared a 156 run partnership allowing a declaration before stumps. Pennant Hills lost 1 wicket during the 11 overs they had to bat. Day 2 was interrupted on several occasions due to rain but we bowled enough overs to dismiss Pennant Hills for 103. The wickets were shared between the four bowlers used.

v Auburn 231 defeated Auburn 146

We made the journey to Mona Park for what is always a difficult match. Won the toss and elected to bat. At 4/46 and 5/100 we were in trouble, however, Brown continued his good form to make 83 and Hayman displayed his ability for a hard hitting 54. We continued batting on the second day and were all out for 231. Brien (2/24) and Pedavoli (2/46) opened and bowled well to have Auburn struggling at 4/27, Brown (5/27) finished the job for an excellent win. The numerous catches dropped off Ramsland's bowling was a major concern.

v Holroyd 5 for 303 defeated Holroyd 8 dec 297

This was one of the most difficult games of cricket I've ever played. It was in the middle of the bushfires that ravaged Sydney on two exceptionally hot days. Lost the toss and not surprisingly we were invited to field. The unavailability of a number of players saw Ramsland open the bowling into a strong, hot westerly wind. In a performance of great courage he bowled 39 overs to finish with 4/135. Bateman hurt himself after bowling 1 ball so Brien had to bowl 19 overs. Barry was so tired at the end of the day it took him an hour to change, he finished with 3/54. Hayman toiled away to take 1/83 off 21. The rest of us had nothing but admiration for the 3 of them. Holroyd finished the day at 8/297. On day 2 it was Holroyd's turn to suffer with soaring temperatures, a hot wind, bushfires down the road, a smoke filled day. Blyth (96) and Schaafsma (60) set up a win with an opening stand of 139, Ivan falling short of a well deserved century due to exhaustion.

O'Keeffe, who had come from the Central Coast via a hitched ride across to Palm Beach sealed the win with an unbeaten 50. This was a game that will be talked about over a few beers for years to come.

v Bexley 143 lost to Bexley 7/177

A fixture reduced to a one day limited over match due to rain on day 1. We won the toss and put Bexley in to bat on a good Macquarie wicket. Bexley were 7/120 at one stage and we were looking for an early finish. They rallied to finish at 7/177 off 60 overs. We did not bowl well, however, the highlight of the bowling was Pedavoli's hat trick, the first in "B" Grade. It was achieved by the judicious use of a long hop, a rank full toss and Pedavoli's famous slow ball. A target of less than 3 per over should not have presented any difficulties, but Bexley bowled steadily and our batting was pathetic, all out 143. A lamentable performance which cast serious doubts on our ability to figure in the finals even though we were still in second place.

v Roseville 208 lost to Roseville 7/250

We were invited to bat on a Roseville wicket which featured variable bounce. This game was effectively a match to determine 2nd place on the table. We again batted without conviction and totalled 208 on the small Roseville ground. Roseville were never troubled in passing us 6 down and proved themselves to be a quality team. Randall was the pick of the bowlers picking up 3/61 after a 4 match absence.

v Canterbury 4 dec 97 & 4/88 defeated Canterbury 96 & 6 dec 179

We put Canterbury in to bat on a lively Macquarie wicket. Brien turned in his best performance of the season to pick up 6/41 off 17 overs to out Canterbury for 96. We passed their total for the loss of 4 wickets, Hort batted well for 52. Canterbury batted again to be 3/27 at stumps. Wickets did not come so easily on day 2, due to good batting and rainy conditions which made the ball virtually impossible to grip. Canterbury declared at 6 for 179. The run chase ended when the showers turned into a downpour. We picked up 6 valuable points which kept us in third position on the table.

v Warringah 199 lost to Warringah 263

Won the toss and invited Warringah to bat on a well grassed Macquarie wicket. This was a must win game against a team that had won only 2 games all season. They batted well to finish day 1 at 6/218 off 72 overs following an early finish due to rain. They batted on and were all out for 263 using up 17 overs on day 2. Brown was the best of the bowlers taking 4/50 off 24 overs. This left us the task of scoring 264 to win off 66 overs. At 4/40 we were never a chance and were eventually all out for 199, Wheeler top scored with 42. We were comprehensively outplayed in all facets of the game and now faced the prospect of having to win our last game to qualify for the semi-finals.

v Baulkham Hills drew with Baulkham Hills 7/309

Baulkham Hills chose to bat on a rock hard McLaughlin wicket and we did well to have them 5/111 shortly after tea. We then lost our composure, dropped a multitude of catches and were thrashed all over the park. Ramsland bowled 35 overs to take 6/131. Day 2 was washed out and we did not make the semi finals; what a miserable way to finish the season.

CAPTAIN'S REPORT - 'D' SHIRES

In last year's report I stated that we had the best team in the league at the end of the season. If we could maintain a team of similar standard we could win the league. It was this belief that made me determined to try again as captain. The prophecy proved to be correct.

If you were told the following statistics you probably would not associate them with a winning team:

- * Only one century scored
- * Second highest score 69
- * Only 17 scores of over 50
- * 5 or more wickets in an innings only 3 times
- * Highest average 30.85 for any batsman who played more than 2 games
- * Most wickets by one bowler (22)
- * Conceded 3,107 and scored 2,773 runs.

The major factor was that this was a true team performance and not one of two or three stars carrying the team. Every player could state that they made important contributions throughout the season.

Another important factor was that 14 players played in excess of 4 games resulting in a regular core of players for each match. This engendered a true team spirit.

This season saw only two matches unfinished due to rain. We won our first nine completed matches on first innings. In only one game did we bat first, against Strathfield, who commenced the game with 9 players.

Our bowlers regularly dismissed sides in under a day and our openers must have thought that they were in as permanent night watchmen. However, we never succeeded in winning a match outright. It was due to teams batting twice, to our once, that we had more runs scored against us. However, we took 156 wickets to 104 lost.

In the second last round, against Warringah, we lost. This was our only defeat of the season. We had probably won the league by this point and the team became complacent. This reminded us that turning up was not sufficient for winning. The last round match required a lot of batting resolve to save it. All this came as a timely reminder for the finals.

The team performed to its full capacity in the semi-final and the final. A score of 205 off 113 overs was an excellent effort in difficult conditions. A Pavlov's marathon effort of 53 off 76 overs held us together. The second day saw a day of high quality bowling and catching.

The final was against Roseville who had won from third position in the last two years. Batting for 155 overs was an amazing team effort. S Burchett outlasted A Pavlov to score 57 off 80 overs. A score of 351 off 57 overs was always going to be too steep for Roseville. The result was the first "D" grade premiership for Macquarie University.

My thanks to the other Captains, especially Kenny Dixon, Tony Barnes and Mark Hughes with whom I spent many hours on the phone.

In particular, I would like to thank Bruce Hort for his support through the season and his personal effort in making the finals run as smoothly as they did.

The challenge now lies ahead for the "D" team. Three other clubs have won the trophy twice, two of them consecutively. I am sure Macquarie can make it a hat-trick. Only two years to go!

CAPTAIN'S REPORT - B GRADE G.D.J.C.A.

Our second year in B Grade of the Gordon District Junior Cricket Association offered much for the cricketing thrill-seeker. Runs were blazed in spectacular fashion and wickets tumbled at a hair-raising rate. Many a six (60!!) disappeared into the bushland surrounding the small grounds. The two games played on the turf of Macquarie North provided welcome relief and produced quality performances.

The side finished four points outside the semi-finals without really threatening any of the top sides. Unfortunately our better bowling efforts were followed by uncertain batting endeavours. At times it seemed we were playing a different game to our opposition. They scored 2,204 runs in 418 overs at 5.27 while we replied with 2,112 runs in 653 overs at 3.37. Same runs-different rate. While our opposition lost a wicket every 31 balls we averaged 41 balls per wicket. We gave 10 lbw decisions and received one. The manic nature of the competition often meant that dropped catches allowed teams to get away.

The standard of behaviour in this particular grade of the competition seemed to fall well below what would be acceptable in Shires or Grade cricket. The bush league antics were an occasional hazard and resulted in a report being organised by Stephen Jurd after the Barbarians game. This addressed the need "to generally improve discipline in the competition" and the "consumption of alcohol during games". It was well received by the Association. It was pleasing to note that the players maintained their competitive and sporting spirit in the face of less disciplined teams. Two forfeit wins and the usual downpours and bush fires made for a slightly disrupted schedule.

Thirty nine players passed through fifth grade during the season. Thankfully there were a core of players who played five games or more. The addition of a sixth team certainly added to our playing talent but made for the occasional quick progression through the ranks. Players from the Gordon teams often had an immediate impact when selected in higher grades. Rajesh Govindan and Michael Fitzgerald were two such players. Steve Davis and Simon Burchett had useful spells in 5th grade before taking good form to D grade.

There were a number of notable performances during the season. Matt Barnett and Andrew Nestor combined for dual centuries in our first game to establish a new 4th wicket club record and set up an amazing run chase win. In another match, Kandan Venkataraman hit 82 and took 4-55, showing terrific spinning potential. Mark Briedis modestly went about accumulating wickets at a healthy rate while Stephen Jurd retained an uncanny knack for getting the initial breakthrough. Damien and Ben Roberts turned in eye-catching bowling spells. Ken Wiblin and Bill Congreve added appreciated experience to a team of new faces. Sam Herps maintained a high keeping standard.

The 1993/94 season was a fine year for the club and those co-ordinating the efforts of the SWCA 5th grade and Shires D grade sides should be congratulated. Both the premierships achieved represented the culmination of three years dedicated planning by those involved.

Finally I would like to thank the team for their assistance with the running of the side over half a year of Saturdays. The efforts of Mark Warren and Richard Lawson with the kit were particularly appreciated. Stephen Jurd provided invaluable input and enthusiasm. Mark Hughes proved to be a mercurial recruiter and organising dynamo for Macquarie's expansion in the GDJCA.

The growth augurs well for next season.

The fourth ball of play saw Michael Fitzgerald hold a sharp chance off the bowling of Damien Roberts (4/16). Damien ripped through the top order, a precursor to a fine season as an opening bowler. Fitzgerald (4/28) began his bowling spell by knocking back the stumps of a batter who only six months before had belted us for 150. Andrew Cearns (56) and Mark Warren (44) then combined for some highly entertaining big hitting. Wazza clubbed four very impressive zacs. Roseville replied with 0/32, six of those being a catch that was only just taken over the boundary. Our hopes of applying the pressure to an inexperienced team were thwarted by torrential rain the following week.

vs Lindfield 9/169 drew with Lindfield 233

A game that fluctuated over two days of intense cricket. Having committed to fielding on a scorching day, the bowlers lifted in a superb all-round performance. Seven of the first eight overs were maidens as Mark Warren and Steve Jurd bowled an immaculate line to defensive batters. Wazza's was perhaps the best wicketless spell I have seen. Ken Wiblin reaped the rewards of the early bowling and picked up 3/48. Michael Fitzgerald contributed two more spectacular outfield catches. Mark Briedis cleaned up the tail to take 3/32. The second day was interrupted twice by rain
