SECRETARY'S REPORT

Trying to relive the achievements of the 90-91 season was always going to be difficult. In the 91-92 season we also saw success in other areas. For the first time, the club expanded to 6 teams (5 men's and 1 women's) and over 75 players. Student numbers also increased as a result of a higher profile on campus during "O-week" and throughout the year.

After a slow beginning to the season, due to player unavailability as they attended weddings, parties, anything,... we finished strongly in the Club Championships - 3rd. Even after this poor start (8th after 6 rounds), we could still have won it in the last round.

This represents a slight improvement on last year. It was generally felt, that had the weather not intervened during the finals, the Club would have won at least 2, maybe 3 premierships. This only re-enforces the need for a good start to the season and the importance of finishing minor-premiers. Congratulations to the eventual winners Lindfield (A's and B's), Warringah (C's and D's) and Thornleigh Waratahs (NDCA 4th Grade).

For the first time, a fifth men's team entered the Northern Districts Cricket Association 4th grade. This was so more club members could get a game. Stephen Jurd organised and captained the team in his usual efficient manner. For this contribution, the Committee would like to thank him. In the end, they missed a semi's berth by the narrowest of margins.

Alan Davies was instrumental in developing the women's eleven. This was the first time women have played under the Macquarie banner. However, the team suffered from a lack of players towards the end of the season. For the team to continue, we must ensure that there are eleven players each week.

There were a lot of outstanding performances during the season. These included the B Grade run aggregate (T. Ritchie - 448), most wickets in an innings (B. Brien - 9/63), a hat-trick (M. Warren - 4/20), and 4 Club record partnerships (4th wicket - 158 I. Jessup and T. Ritchie, 5th wicket - 178 G. Gavin and S. O'Reilly, 9th wicket - 105x I. Jessup and B. Brien, 10th wicket - 88 M. Warren and M. Ercelenk). It will take a huge effort to beat these outstanding achievements.

The refurbished Gwilliam Oval will be available for use early in the 92-93 season and this will allow another Macquarie team to play at home. The Club would also like to thank Jock and the ground staff for preparing wickets and outfielders of a very high quality. I would also like to remind Club members that Jock makes every effort to have the wicket prepared for play to start on time.

For the Club to continue with the success of the past 2 seasons, we need a more professional approach towards cricket, both on and off the field. There must also be an increased emphasis on training.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Almost \$2,500 was raised through events such as the Trivia Night, 7-A-Side, Christmas Raffle and through weekly bar takings. The 1991/92 season was another successful year for Macquarie. As we had done the year before, three teams reached the semi-finals. CAPTAIN'S REPORT - 'A' SHIRES

MATCH REPORTS - 'A' SHIRES

vs Epping 7/242 lost to Epping 5/245.

The first round was played at home and I declared at 7/242 after batting all day. Ivan Blyth started the season well with 51, Craig "Edo" Edwards scored 41 and "Gavo" top scored with 63. The total was not quite enough despite great bowling by "Edo", who took 3/58 off 24 overs. Epping batted slowly and ground out the runs, finishing with 5/245.

vs Canterbury 6/104 defeated Canterbury 102 & 5/154.

Round 2 away saw Canterbury sent in and bowled out for 102. Paul "Nasty" Notaras took 3/20 off 11 and "Edo" with 3/34 from 11, were the destroyers. We tried to win that day and the batters launched themselves at the bowling however we fell short by a handful of runs. New boy, Dave "Cob" Webb top scored with 34 and Steve "Phantom" O'Reilly scored 33. The 2nd day was pretty boring with Canterbury batting it out to finish at 5/154. Another debutant, Peter "Murph" Murphy bowled well with 2/15 off 12.

vs Roseville 8/198 drew with Roseville 7/261.

Round 3 saw us play the premiers at home. I sent them in and they batted all day and a little into the next before closing at 7/261 off 89 overs. "Murph"'s bowling was outstanding with 3/83 off 29 overs. Most of the top order batsmen got a start but failed to go on with it. We were 6/106 at one stage before "Murph" savaged the bowling, for a top score of 79. The game ended in a draw when we finished at 8/198.

vs Bexley 6/352 defeated Bexley 235.

The 4th round was played away and Bexley won the toss and batted. We managed to bowl them out for 235. The best of the bowlers was "Cob" Webb with 4/29 off 10 and Warrick Folkard, 3/36 off 14.5 overs. We were 2/10 overnight but the old firm came good to get the points. "Phantom" hit the first ton of the season with 122, "Nasty" smashed them for 74 and "Gavo" got 70.

vs Wentworthville 232 lost to Wentworthville 7/306.

This round 5 game was played away and Wentworthville won the toss and put us in. When rain stopped play for the day we were 3/147. We were soon out the following week for 232. Round 6 and we continued to play badly in a 60 over game. Strathfield were 7/136 and ended up with 263. Warrick Folkard was the pick of the bowlers with 2/57 off 16. Despite a reasonable start of 35, we collapsed to 6/82 before new kid on the block, Mathew Edgerton 48 and "Gavo", with 78, put on 98 to give us a reasonable reply. However our final score of 9/223 was well short of the target. Another loss we could ill afford.

vs Lane Cove 9/269 drew with Lane Cove 1/63.

Round 7 was again a 60 over affair after the first day was washed out. We batted 1st and scored a very creditable 9/269. "Nasty" with 53, "Gavo" 49, Ivan Blyth 41 and "Cobby" 39, all batted well. The storm clouds were moving in quickly. Despite our efforts to bowl the 30 overs needed to make a game of it, we were washed out after 20.2 overs. Lane Cove finished with 1/63, way behind the run rate.

vs Pennant Hills 114 defeated Pennant Hills 8/89 (on run rate).

Round 8 was again affected by rain (surprise, surprise). This game was reduced to 36 overs a side. We batted first on a wet track and at one stage were 5/12 and quite happy to go home. However, "Nasty" with 31, Andrew Harrison 26 and Peter Murphy with 27 pushed our score up to 114. In the conditions, our bowling and catching was great. We had them 7/89 just after the 30 over mark. The heavens opened up and we won the game on run rate. The best performers for us were Dave Budge 5/41 off 15, "Nasty" 2/43 off 15 and Jock the groundsman, who worked overtime to provide us with a pitch.

We were always in control on day 2 and bowled them out for 213. The damage was done by "Cobby" with 4/52 and the veteran offie Warrick Folkard who took 4/36 off 17 overs.

Round 10 was played away and we batted first. This game was a 60 over match and we scored 6/206. The highlight was a fantastic innings of 108 by Ivan Blyth. Ivan scored his runs in an opening partnership of 145 with Graeme Lego who scored 30. Our bowling was great and the catching magnificent. Dave Budge took 3/29 off 17 overs, and Dave Webb took 4/41 to dismiss the opposition for 136.

Round 11 was played at home. The first day's play was washed out and the second day's play reduced to 40 overs again due to weather. Round 12 was played on a wet one at Weldon Park. We batted first after losing the toss. At 6/74, with the wicket getting worse, the batters were told to have a slog so we could get them in on it. Our total was mainly due to Bruce Hort 34, "Nasty" 25, and Richie Mather 23. As predicted the wicket became unplayable and dangerous. Warringah only managed 38 in the first dig and followed on to be 2/7 at the end of the day. The destroyers being "Webby" with 4/16 off 8 overs and Dave Budge 4/8 off 10 overs. Their second innings was little better and they were out for 67. "Webby" was again the destroyer, 4/11 off 8. He was assisted by Warrick Folkard 3/14 off 9. Outright points, you beauty.

vs Burwood 8/150 lost to Burwood 5/151.

Day one of round 13 was washed out. We batted first in a 60 over fixture and were in all sorts of trouble at 5/16. The rot was halted by Richie Mather 35 and Glen McFadden 40x. MATCH REPORTS - 'B' SHIRES

vs Epping 4/246 defeated Epping 224.

First day of the season and having won the toss, decided it was better to get rid of the cobwebs fielding rather than batting. Epping made a very solid start (0/96) against some "early season" bowling and fielding. It wasn't until the introduction of Dixon that the breakthrough was made and by tea we had put ourselves back in the game at 3/100. The second session was much more convincing, with "new" boy Murphy bowling an excellent spell to finish with 4/62 from 26 overs. Dixon finished with 2/24 and Ritchie 3/58. Budge, who looked to have celebrated the beginning of cricket season on Friday night, finished with an inauspicious 0/23.

Day 2 saw us garner the required runs reasonably easily, with Jessup (in a sign of things to come) finishing with 100x and Ritchie 72. The highlight of the earlier batting had to be Dixon's dismissal, caught at gully off a full-fledged pull shot in which he connected the ball the second time facing the Epping Keeper. A solid start to the season.

vs Canterbury 248 drew with Canterbury 8/190.

If there is one side in B shires that we needed to win the toss against this was it - unfortunately it was not to be. Sent in to bat, we made heavy going of it against a solid if unspectacular attack, and were soon in trouble at 6/107. Fortunately the second half of the order fired and we managed to get through to 8/201 at the close. All in all a most unsatisfactory position on what was a very good home batting strip. The second day started better, with McFadden, who had remained 24x totally dominating the Canterbury bowlers, first with Budge and then with Brien to steer the side to 248. McFadden finished with 67, Ritchie 61 and Breden a quick-fire 38.

When Canterbury batted we were once again unable to secure an early break and it was again left to Dixon. From then on wickets fell steadily as Canterbury, in their inimitable fashion, decided that they would play for an honourable (?) draw. This despite the fact that at one stage with 8 wickets in hand they needed less than 4 per over. Eight bowlers were used including Welsby and Folkard, but the match petered out to a draw. Pick of the bowlers were Dixon 2/36 and Budge (not hung over) 2/16.

vs Roseville 204 lost to Roseville 215.

One of the advantages of playing away to Roseville is that it makes you appreciate just how good the facilities are at Macquarie. The Roseville wicket was a belter. Having won the toss, and knowing that B grade is good at chasing runs, I invited Roseville to bat - this is a mistake I will never make again. Despite the excellent state of the track, a fiery opening spell from Brien soon saw Roseville in trouble at 3/23 with Brien 3/5 from 7. However once the shine went from the ball, Roseville soon got on top with a fine fourth wicket partnership of 151. This left them 3/174 from 44 and a target of 300-350 well within sight. The Roseville total is testimony to the standard of the second spell delivered by Barry. Swinging the ball prodigiously and proving almost unplayable, Barry demolished the remainder of the batting, taking the next 6 wickets to give him figures of 9/63 and the possibility of taking all 10 wickets. Budge thwarted this, selfishly picking up the last wicket. B grade had seen a truly splendid exhibition of bowling. Left 17 overs we pushed our score to 2/50 odd, with Sandercock 36, and left the ground feeling extremely confident. The second day was a disaster, with a wicket that looked like it had not been touched since the previous week. It was bone dry so we could not refuse to play, but it was underprepared and b.....dangerous. Wickets fell quickly and we found ourselves 6/96. At this stage it was decided that it would be better to go down swinging, and this improbable tactic almost paid off. Bateman made 24 including two big 6's, Harrison 31 (one 6), Folkard 18 and Budge a fighting 44 (three 6's).

vs Bexley 7/334 defeated Bexley 204.

Back at home, won the toss and put Bexley in. Ahhh! During this match we had the pleasure of watching one of the strangest batsmen in the game. This particular Bexley boy managed to land an estimated 13 pullshots on the same piece of grass at backward square leg. All this time the poor skipper kept commenting that it was impossible for him to repeat the exercise - and becoming more agitated after each shot. With the help of this innings Bexley managed to get themselves into a reasonably strong position at 4/170. However the team fought back very well and with the last 4 Bexley wickets falling for 0 runs, we managed to have them all out for 204. Best of the bowlers were Ritchie 5/26, Brown 3/59 and Dixon with a tight spell of 1/9 off 8.

With a short session remaining, the Bexley bowlers were fired up and managed to grab 2 quick wickets. When this was followed up by another quick wicket on the second day, a relatively easy

task started to look a little more difficult. Fortunately the Bexley charge was snuffed out, with SandercocK leading the way with an excellent 78 characterised by some slashing pulls and hooks. Ritchie compiled 67 and we eventually passed them 5 down. Having forgotten to then declare, Bateman and O'Keeffe tore their bowling apart and finished with 54x and 56 respectively.

vs Wentworthville 3/201 defeated Wentworthville 197.

A one-day game which proved to be almost a carbon copy of the Bexley game. We put them in to bat and a very solid bowling performance restricted their score to a comfortable 197 with Budge, Bateman and Ritchie taking 2 wickets apiece. After the loss of some early wickets, a partnership of 133 between Lego and Ritchie set the platform for victory. Harrison with a swift 35x provided the finishing touches to a satisfying win.

vs Strathfield 219 & 0/0 (dec.) defeated Strathfield 8/75 (dec.) & 8/91.

The unfortunate coincidence of a number of injuries and "other withdrawals" saw a late Friday night re-jigging of sides. Into B Grade came Fletcher, Cole, Deller from C grade and Mather on the come-back trail. We elected to bat on a very slow looking wicket and thanks to excellent contributions from an in-form Lego and a back-to-form O'Keeffe managed to make our way to a more than respectable (given the wicket) 219. The "lowlight" of this innings was an unbelievable 4 run outs and 1 stumping, not one of which could reasonably be put down to good fielding on Strathfield's part.

Day 2 began slowly with the first 30 minutes spent waiting for someone to arrive and mark the pitch. When play commenced, Strathfield made their way to an apparently comfortable 1/51.

We then turned to spin, and Ritchie and Mather managed to take the next 7 wickets for 21 before Strathfield declared at 8/75. We then declared 0/0, leaving Strathfield to score 144 for victory. Again spin was used extensively in the second innings, with Ritchie and Mather again taking wickets cheaply. With Strathfield at 8/61 we looked a good chance for outright victory, but the ninth wicket for Strathfield batted sensibly and held us out. Ritchie finished the match with 9/63 and Mather 6/32

vs Lane Cove 6/131 defeated Lane Cove 7/249 (run rate).

Against last-placed Lane Cove an easy victory was anticipated. However, after sending Lane Cove in to bat, some ordinary bowling saw them accumulate 7/249. The run chase began disastrously. We were soon 4/12 with O'Keeffe, Ritchie and Jessup all falling within the space of 4 balls. Following some fortunate rain intervention and with the Macquarie innings in tatters, Lane Cove were happy to play a reduced-over match. This left us a target of 125 off 30 over in total. When play resumed we found that Lane Cove were without their opening bowler who had left the ground with figures of 4/27. Some excellent batting from Lego, Harrison and Brown saw us through to the target with one over to spare.

vs Auburn 202 lost to Auburn 255.

Another Auburn game, another B grade loss. Following the example set by the Australian captain, it was decided to alter the batting order to enable some of the middle and lower order bats to spend some time in the middle. This proved as disastrous for us as it did for Australia. After a solid opening stand between Hort and McFadden, wickets fell quickly and we soon found ourselves 6/129. Some later order resistance saw us push this total through to 202, with Ritchie finishing with 50, Bateman 27 and Mather 26. Some dropped catches during Auburn's innings and one particular batsman who rode his luck well saw us never really in the hunt, and Auburn passed our meagre total 5 wickets down. The only bowler to make any impression during the Auburn innings was Mather, who finished 4/56. When Auburn decided to bat on, this enabled Breden to regain some form with the ball and he finished with 4/36. Maybe next year!

vs Baulkham Hills 5/144 defeated Baulkham Hills 9/137.

Some water under the covers and a fortuitous toss enabled us to put Baulkham Hills in to bat. With Lockett making a welcome return to B grade we managed to restrict Baulkham Hills to 9/137. Lockett finished with excellent figures of 4/20, Dixon bowled well for 2/39, and Ritchie took 3/36. Some good bowling from Baulkham Hills made the run chase more difficult than anticipated, but good innings from Mather (53x), Fletcher (23), and Hort (22) saw us comfortably home.

vs Lindfield 8/123 lost to Lindfield 143.

Following early morning rain it seemed unlikely that any play would be possible during this game,

but with Lindfield producing a super sopper and sundry other devices to dry the ground (most of which apparently conveniently disappeared during the remainder of the year) we managed to agree on a 33-over game. We won the toss, and were feeling very confident with Lindfield 3/11. But some sensible and aggressive hitting from Lindfield saw them through to a reasonable but very gettable total of 143. After an excellent opening partnership between Hort and McFadden we lost our way, and some slow batting and some inexperience saw needless wickets lost and the required run rate increased. With the wicket drying and a 3-foot rut developing in the wicket, run scoring became very difficult and despite a valiant attempt by the lower order, the game was lost.

vs Warringah 183 & 2/34 won first innings/lost outright to Warringah 5/32 (dec.) & 7/188.

After the loss to Lindfield, this represented a desperation game for B grade. We now needed to win both our remaining games to be assured of making the semi-finals. After losing the toss and being asked to bat on a wet wicket, we were soon in trouble at 3/39. However, some sensible batting from Sandercock, O'Keeffe and Brown saw us through to 6/169 at the close. Visions of a declaration around 220-230 were soon in tatters on the second day and we were dismissed very cheaply for 183. Defending a very ordinary target on an excellent batting wicket, the bowlers responded very well and we had Warringah 5/32 at tea. Within this total Deller had 2/13, Brown 2/12 and Breden 0/3 off 7. Warringah declared at this total and after batting on for 4 overs ourselves we set Warringah a target of just over 4 per over for victory. They made a solid start and with luck on their side were always in control and achieved the required runs for victory 7 wickets down. While losing outright was disappointing, this game was a commendable fight-back after the Lindfield debacle.

vs Burwood 214 defeated Burwood 187.

Last game of the season and a very congested competition table made this a must-win situation for both sides. Once again the wicket was wet and we were asked to bat and were again in early trouble at 2/10. Some good batting by Ritchie and Sandercock in particular saw us recover to be 2/69, but the middle order let us down and we tumbled to 9/130. At this stage our best policy appeared to be to look for some quick runs, declare and try to take some Burwood wickets late on day one. However, no-one counted on Breden and Deller (arguably the best 10 and 11 seen in B grade), who managed to put on 84 for the last wicket. If not for Deller walking from a catch to a bumped ball, this partnership could have been even higher. On the second day Burwood were cruising along at 6/142 and one batsman was well-set. Things looked bleak. The reintroduction of Breden and an excellent catch by Deller saw us turn the game around to record an excellent victory with Burwood dismissed for 187. Deller finished with 4/42. Breden 1/19 from 14 overs, Brown 2/42 and Ritchie 3/44.

Semi Final

vs Warringah 6/306 drew with Warringah DNB.

The start of the semi-final saw perhaps the best Macquarie batting strip of the year and after winning the toss, we had no hesitation in batting. With Mahoney (recalled to the B grade side for this game) and Lego in excellent form, Warringah soon realised they were in for a long day in the field. Lego went on to make a well compiled 51 and Mahoney was unfortunately dismissed 5 short of his century. Good follow-up batting from Brown (19), Ritchie (62), Dixon (24x) and Harrison (14x) saw us through to 6/306 from 136 overs. Warringah were offered the chance for some batting practice late on the second day, but respectfully declined.

Final

vs Lindfield

Unfortunately but predictably the final was washed out after a brief frolic on Saturday afternoon. This was indeed a pity as by any reckoning the two best sides in B grade had fittingly made it to the final and an excellent game of cricket seemed likely. While Lindfield had triumphed in the game earlier in the year the B grade side had changed appreciably since then and were playing at a much higher standard. Accordingly we were quietly confident of victory. Nevertheless Lindfield had beaten us fair and square after having the worst of the conditions in this earlier clash. They then went on to finish minor premiers and as such must be applauded as deserved winners of the B grade premiership.

CAPTAIN'S REPORT - 'C' SHIRES

My appointment as Captain of C's was both a privilege and a formidable assignment after the success of the previous season's C Grade team under the Captaincy of Al Mahoney. From the start of the season I was determined to retain all the competitiveness and desire to win that Al had instilled in his players. I also wanted to emphasise the need to preserve the spirit of cricket which I perceive to embody the principles of sportsmanship and team spirit. My aim was that despite possible outcomes, everyone should enjoy their cricket. This did not imply a complacent attitude to the game but merely kept in perspective the purposes to which team sport at this level of competition should be directed.

As the season developed, it was evident that the team spirit was somewhat harder to maintain than expected as a result of the 28 players who floated in and out of the C Grade ranks. Nevertheless, a number of players who came to form the core of the year's effort must be applauded. I would especially like to thank Mark Noonan and Chris Welsby ("Pizzle" and "Grizzle" respectively) for their on and off field efforts in maintaining a good level of morale.

A number of individual performances must also be highlighted. Two newcomers to the club, Matthew Edgerton and Brendan Fletcher both contributed heavily with the bat. Matt's 89 against Canterbury and Brendan's 76 against Bexley were both outstanding innings. Colin "Granny" Cole proved a stalwart in a number of matches, not least for his memorable 94 against Roseville. Ian Jessup scored two marvellous unbeaten hundreds in consecutive games, the latter providing C's with the impetus needed to get us into the semi-finals. Our economical figures with the ball are a credit to all concerned; Barry Brien, Mark Noonan, Darren Welsby and Dave Deller all displayed consistency and application when required. On a personal level, the discovery of left arm orthodox (which I am determined to persist with) and my wicket tally of 42, was immensely satisfying.

In the end, however, I believe, with the possible exception of Jess' efforts, that no game's outcome was determined by individual performances. In cricket you play as a team, win as a team or lose as a team. I would therefore sincerely thank all players who played with C Grade for whatever period in 1991-92.

Thanks must be extended to the Committee, in particular Alan Davies, and to the other Captains for their support.

C Grade came third in the competition this year and the effort thus ranks as the most successful season for a number of years. Nevertheless, like us, A's and B's had a final's birth and failed to clinch a premiership. Without entering into a discussion into the reasons for this I would suggest that if we can iron out those remaining problems that the coming year could well be the most successful in the club's history. I know that we as cricketers have learnt the lessons of the season and will return with new vigour and competence to face the challenges of the next. See you all in August.

MATCH REPORTS 'C' SHIRES

vs Epping 7/195 defeated Epping 138.

My first foray as Captain was made with some trepidation and this was further compounded by losing the toss and being forced to bowl on a glassy hard Macquarie pitch. However, an excellent bowling performance by Darren "Buckets" Welsby (5/40), ably supported by Dave "Bus Stop" Deller (2/33) and Mark "Dr. Death" Ramsland (2/29) saw Epping crumble to a meagre total of 138. A solid opening partnership between Simon Burchett and Matthew "Chances" Edgerton ensured that a win would never be in doubt. Dave "Lurch" Butler (40), Simon Burchett (37) and Bill Congreve (30x) contributed to a satisfying first round win.

vs Canterbury 8/189 defeated Canterbury 156.

A toss win and a decision to take the new ball paid dividends to the tune of 5/65 at tea. Some extremely questionable decisions and poor fielding in the final session saw our position slip somewhat, dismissing Canterbury for 156. After 84 overs this was not what you could call aggressive batting. Bowling credits went to Chris "Gutter" Hook (2/33) and yours truly chipping in with 6/39.

At tea on the final day we were cruising at 2/99. A succession of indiscriminate shots by the middle order saw us lose 4 wickets in quick succession. However, the lower order stabilised, supporting newcomer Edgerton who ended the day with a fine 89 ensuring a victory. A special thanks to the army of female Canterbury supporters who ensured that our on-field efforts were anything but subdued.

vs Roseville 264 defeated Roseville 171.

As defending premiers, Roseville presented stiffer competition than encountered in the first two rounds. Despite a toss win on the hard no.2 track we fell to 3/56 and later 6/162 which left the "tail" with some work to do. However, Ramsland (33), Shane Vella (22) and Deller (16x) batting 8, 9, and 10 respectively ably supported Colin "Granny" Cole. "Granny", who batted sensibly and with aggression, ended the day on 94 runs. At the close of play we were 8/254.

Batting on the following Saturday Vella and Welsby fell quickly on a damp pitch. Roseville's upper order looked secure until a spate of wickets saw them collapse to 6/64 at tea. A seventh wicket partnership of 60 runs re-introduced some competition to the game but the result was never really in doubt. Hook 3/43 and Deller 3/40 were the pick of the bowlers but the win must be attributed to an enthusiastic fielding performance.

vs Bexley 165 lost to Bexley 192.

Another toss win. I decided to be aggressive and sent Bexley in on a track that offered the bowlers variable bounce. However, this didn't seem to be the best option as at tea Bexley were 3 for a hundred odd runs. However, Hook (2/44) and Welsby (2/55) took vital wickets and bowled well with a ball that had miraculously come to life during the tea break. "Bus Stop" Deller also contributed with a fine spell but was terribly unlucky not to pick up more than his one wicket. I brought myself back on to wrap up the tail and was lucky to end the day with the flattering figures of 5/29. If vital catches had been taken, Bexley would have been dismissed for much less than 192.

Our batting, however, was nothing short of dismal. With the exception of Brendan "Chevy" Fletcher (76) and Lotsa Sundries (54) the performance was well below par, leaving us fall well short of the required target.

vs Wentworthville 192 lost to Wentworthville 197.

A hard fought bowling and fielding exhibition saw us dismiss Wenty for a gettable score, in this a one-dayer. Ramsland (5/58), Deller (2/49) and Noonan (2/58) were aided by some fine catching. "Chances" Edgerton took two exceptional catches in our best fielding effort to date.

However, once again the middle order came undone after an 88 run 3rd wicket partnership between the two newcomers to the Club Matthew Edgerton and Brendan Fletcher, both scored 58. "Grizzle" Welsby made the comment that he could no longer see the ball. I suggested that the same went for all of us. An appalling and disappointing result!

vs Strathfield 175 lost to Strathfield 7/179.

Once again the batting woes surfaced, this time at Macquarie no.2. No excuses. Several batsmen got a start, Ramsland (37) and Hook (32). Generally we failed to show enough maturity or application to continue against what was, I thought, a pretty ordinary bowling attack. This was not helped by the fact that the game had again been reduced to a one-dayer.

Nevertheless, it was a gutsy performance that got us back into the game, having captured 6 wickets for 103. In the end however, the hard pitch wearied a limited bowling attack and we fell to a third straight loss. Mark Noonan (3/49) was the shining light with the ball and in the field. I convinced myself that if we could only get it right with the batting then we would start to notch up some decent wins.

vs Lane Cove 203 drew with Lane Cove 2/14.

The prospect of batting first, as Cove could only field eight players at the start of the one-dayer, despite the imminence of rain, proved too great a temptation for me to resist. After the initial loss of both openers including "Hacksaw" Hort in his return to the international arena, Hook (30) and Fletcher (64) hammered the Cove for around twenty overs to have us circa 120 runs after 20 odd overs. Unfortunately, "Grizzle" Welsby's maiden appearance in glasses caused him to call a halt to proceedings as the Cove bowlers tied us down for 20 overs at around 2 an over. However, a last ditch effort by the two tall men "Pizzle" Noonan and "Buckets" Welsby saw our score increase to 203.

Lane Cove lost two quick wickets to "Buckets" (2/5) before the heavens opened and 6 points were stolen by the God of Cricket.

vs Auburn 7/226 defeated Auburn 224.

Back at Macquarie. A two day match. Pressed for points, we found ourselves faced with the daunting task of a rock hard track and oppressive heat. Having included no spinner in the team, and with Todd Ritchie's words burning in the back of my mind I decided to give the ball a tweak. Left arm orthodox proved inordinately successful in my spinning debut and I was lucky enough to grab 5/96 of 39 overs. We managed to wrap up Auburn for 224 with a competent fielding performance, taking all catches that came to hand. For once, our batting looked fairly solid. This had something to do with the return of Al "Gnome" Mahoney (43) to the fray as well as the return to form of "Grizzle" Welsby (33x). "Granny" Cole was the best, scoring 58. A solid win.

vs Baulkham Hills 7/169 defeated Baulkham Hills 164.

In perhaps our best fielding effort to date, including one miraculous, never to be repeated run out by Andy "Where have all the flowers gone?" Pavlov, we humbled the Hills, bowling them out for 164 on astro turf. "Buckets" Welsby returned to form (3/69) with the disheartening news that he was unavailable for the following round due to his peculiar fetish for dressing up in a bear suit. "Pizzle" also captured two vital wickets (2/24) and yours truly's tweakers again worked (4/63). I will not divulge how many overs that I bowled. Note that I did not bowl Jessup.

Our batting line-up was the strongest to date. "Grizzle" (40) returned to his accustomed opening spot and along with Craig Sandercock (71), humiliated the Hills' attack. From then on in it was all

a cake walk. A crushing victory. Baulkham Hills need to work on their afternoon teas.

vs Lindfield 2/92 defeated Lindfield 91.

An all-star C-Grade bowling attack saw Lindfield dismissed for an abysmal and undisciplined total. Baz "Damage" Brien took 4/35 in 17 straight overs. Steve "Link" Bateman (3/18) and Greg Brown (2/6) completed the decimation. Note that we had a very large slips cordon; "Grizzle", "Brownie" and Bateman would add weight to any forward pack.

In reply "Grizzle" Welsby (28x.) provided the foundation for any easy win. Mahoney (29) and Bateman (22x) ably supported to end the game without hiccup.

vs Warringah 7(dec)/264 lost to Warringah 8/265.

Faced with a damp track at Weldon no.2 I lost the toss for the first time since game 1. Warringah sent us in but a superb effort from the first six batsmen provided us with a competitive total. Of note was "Link" Bateman's hard hit 61 at no.6 which improved an otherwise slow run rate. Honours went to Ian Jessup, batting as a stop gap opener, who scored 100 not out in nearly as many overs.

In reply Warringah, the competition leaders, batted with aggression, and succeeded in unsettling our bowling attack and our fielding. A number of "sitters" were put down and they cost us dearly. At 4/236 we looked in real trouble. However, Steve Bateman (4/24) found a new lease of life and captured four quick wickets to keep Warringah honest. Unfortunately, the damage had already been done. A disappointing loss. We needed 6 points to ensure a spot in the finals. As it turned out, a win against Warringah would have made us minor premiers.

vs Burwood 8/243 (dec) & 0/0 (dec) won 1st innings / lost outright to Burwood 7/161 (dec)& 3/90

For the second game running latecomers forced a change in the batting lineup. A series of quick wickets saw us fall to the precarious position of 8/138. Only "Pizzle" Noonan and Ian Jessup showed any fortitude. Then "Damage" Brien strode to the crease to join Jessup. The ensuing 9th wicket partnership lasted 40 odd overs resulting in an unbeaten partnership of over 100 runs. "Damage" ended with an unbeaten 26. This ended speculation that he was a more qualified no.11 than Trevor Lockett. Once again Jessup was the guiding light, scoring 146x in 130 overs.

Needing 6 points to have a shot at the semis and with only 50 odd overs to get the runs, Burwood were up against it from the start. We almost let it slip but Brien (2/37), Lockett (3/65) and Ramsland (2/33) ensured that a first innings win was in the bag. I offered the Burwood captain a declaration and he accepted. Six points were ours. A final note that Jessup did bowl in the second innings and got hit for 1/43 off 4.4 overs.

Semi-Final

vs Baulkham Hills 148 lost to Baulkham Hills 185.

Positioned third on the table we were forced to play the Hills away at McLaughlin which is notorious for its rained out matches. All week rain threatened but Saturday dawned clear and we were away on time. We fielded a completely transformed side from previous matches due to unavailability in higher grades. The late withdrawal of "Granny" Cole, due to a hamstring injury, considerably weakened the batting side. Nevertheless all bowlers used contributed effectively. "Damage" Brien (3/41) was the best in a long spell. Ramsland (4/69) and Hook (3/24) combined to spin out Baulkham Hills for the gettable total of 185. At the close of the day's play we had lost just the one wicket and needed only 140 odd runs for victory.

Rain, combined with a less than waterproof cover, caused a late start to proceedings, leaving us just over 40 overs to chase Hills' total. Unfortunately a collapse, contributed to by the muddy pitch and a lack of maturity in the batting line-up caused us to fall well short of the posted total. A disappointing result both on a personal level and because of the hard work put in by so many of the guys who played in C grade over the season.

CAPTAIN'S REPORT - 'D' SHIRES

This season saw an about turn for the 'D' team. Last year we put in some strong batting performances with little support from the bowling and catching departments. The opposite applied this year.

I would like to thank Ken Wiblin for captaining in my absence and the support given by the team members during this year. I would also like to thank Al Davies and the Committee for their support throughout the year.

We ended up in mid-table. We suffered only two bad defeats (by Roseville and Strathfield). We had more than our fair share of close finishes. The last four games being particularly close. In all of them we were in a strong position to win but let too many get away.

I have great optimism for next season. If we can be more positive in our batting, we have the bowling to win matches. I believe that we are good enough to win the flag next season.
