There was never a lack of want and hunger in the second half of the season, with a number of players making useful contributions to 3rd grades push for finals, and others performing consistently in 2s, pushing the first grade squad for a finals berth.

As I said, one win does not look like a spectacular season, and winning is a far better feeling and more enjoyable experience than losing. One of the most important things to note from the season is that we lost 5 games by small margins. Losses none the less, but they all showed that we were competitive:

SDs we fell 7 runs short in a chase, NWS passed our 250 for 9dec 7 down, we fell 9 runs short in a one day chase against Georges, were passed 8 down by Auburn, and 9 down by Roseville. Turn 3 of these results around and we finish 9th, 4 of them and we're 8th, and all 5 would have had us 2 points outside the 6. But a season can't be built on close losses and 'what ifs?'

In short, some mental toughness needs to be gained, and I think this season will have gone a long way towards doing this. The aim at the start of the season was to start preparing a new wave of first grade players, guys who have talent and potential to filter up the grades. I firmly believe that each and everyone of the guys who played 2s this season gained valuable experience about what it is to play higher grades in shires, and my hope is that they will all persevere next season and beyond and that MUCC 2nd grade will once again be making a push for finals cricket come March 2013.

Some notable performances for the season were:

Abhishek Sharma – Abhi stood tall most of the season with the bat, coming in at number 3, he was almost always a rock around which an innings can be built. It was not a great season for batsmen across the competition, so the stats are never going to tell the full story, but with some more mental toughness, Abhi can lead a batting line up in the seasons to come.

Javed Khan – I've said this to a few people now, so I figure I should say it out loud... Javed is a good opening batsman... but he's a great middle order bat! Javed had a good season spent mostly at the top of our batting order, and has managed to get rid of 'that shot' that he used to get out to a lot in previous seasons. His undoing this year was simply good bowling. In terms of his middle order batting, he shined batting at 5 and 6 setting us up for a couple of close games in the latter stages of the year.

Mark Fairlie – As has been the case for the past three seasons, Mark lead the bowling attack throughout the season. He was the leading wicket taker for the side, and relishes the challenges set at this level. Chances are Mark only has one season of cricket left in him, and I'm sure when he returns for the 2013/14 season, whichever grade he plays will have strong finals claims come March.

Laz Kariyawasam – Laz has great potential to guard the top of the order in 1st grade in the coming years. He doesn't take a backward step against the new ball, generally knowing when he can attack, and when it's best to see off the new pill. Again, the top of the order was difficult in the conditions this season, so good bowling brought him unstuck as much as a loose shot, but next year will probably prove his quality as an opener.

Hari Sankar – this man has come of age in the last season and a half. Hari's bowling is top quality all the way, and would have made a formidable combination with Mark for a full

season, but his batting ability has really shone through this season. He made two half centuries for us, including a 92, and was justly rewarded with a 1st grade finals spot against Burwood. This is a guy who will be rattling some first grade oppositions on a regular basis next season.

Niraj Pathak – Raj's return to MUCC was a good one. It was great to have a left hand bowling option most of the season, and when he was on song, oppositions struggled to cope with him in partnership with FB. Next season will see greater numbers in the wicket column for Niraj, and hopefully he can also finally prove his self-proclaimed batting ability too.

Larsen Rungwerth – Larsen was a surprise packet for me. He came into the side during a lull in availability, and never left. He stuck to his task the whole season, bowling to his fields, and showing his genuine frustrations when he strayed off line. At 18, he has a big future ahead of him at MUCC, hopefully leading a 24s attack next season... all he needs to do is work on his fielding!!

As always, I would like to thank the committee for the faith in me this season, it was great to be given this opportunity to lead what was essentially the future first graders of this club. The most important thing for MUCC now is that we continue to pursue this course of selections in a bid 'blood' these players for the future. As I said, despite the results, there was always an air of positivity about the guys this season as they learnt to deal with the negative side of cricket. All in all, they will be better for the experience, and come next season will have a hunger for wins to make up for this season that has passed, and hopefully they will have learnt how to get over the line in those close games.

I'd also like to pass on my thanks to Mayu and Jehan above me, and Ross below me. The top three grades were selected efficiently this season, and it always makes our lives easier when there are such open channels of communication.

Congratulations to 1st grade on their finals appearance, as well as Brownie and 4s getting to the business end again, as well as Asita in his first 5th grade campaign making finals. Bring on 2012/13!
