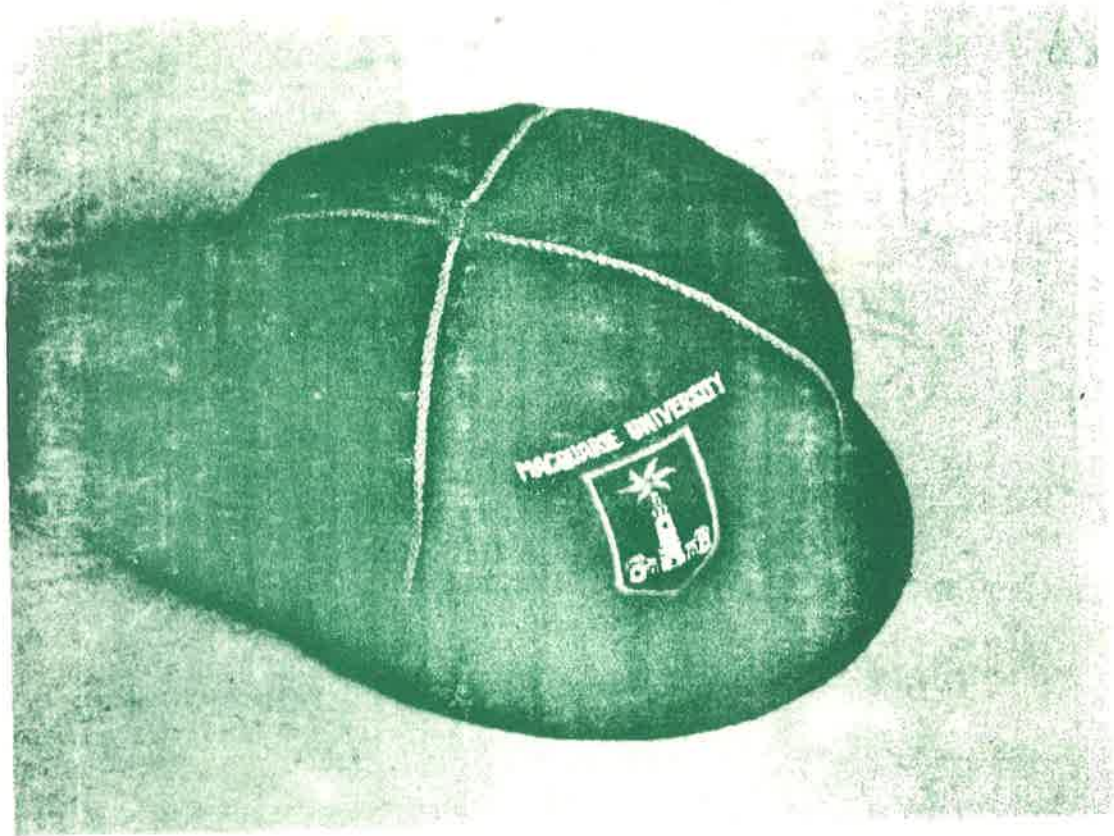

Those of us who have played from the mid 1970's have experienced the good and the bad seasons. Unfortunately some recent players have not been so lucky. With a strong nucleus of experienced players there is justified optimism for much better results.

As President I have been extremely pleased with club administration this year. Our case for continued grade acceptance was recognised by the Cricket Association as being "impressive". The club's Treasurer, Chris Welsby, received a University half-blue in recognition as a club player and administrator. Well done Grizzle. Al Mahoney, our Secretary of four years, was nominated as being one of the Uni's best club administrators. Players will also reap the benefits of a second heavy roller to be used exclusively for the bottom oval. It has recently been purchased. Administratively the club is in capable hands.

Once again we enjoyed the presence of Bob Lawton, Sports Association Secretary, at our Annual Dinner, a very enjoyable event. Head groundsman, Charlie Seaton and his staff, did their usual fantastic job with the standard of the pitches, often the envy of visiting teams.

On behalf of the club let me thank the New South Wales Cricket Association for our participation at Grade level. Our best wishes also to Hawksbury Cricket Club. As a new club to the challenge and rigors of Grade Cricket, we wish them well.

Finally, let me extend our congratulations to Randwick, Penrith and Burwood cricket clubs for their successes in their respective grade and shire competitions.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

It gives me little joy in presenting my fourth report as Secretary of Macquarie University Cricket Club to relate that the close of the 1984-1985 season marked the end of an era for the club.

The New South Wales Cricket Association has, after considering the recommendations of its Review Committee, voted that the Sydney Grade Cricket Competition should consist of twenty teams in the 1985-1986 season. Regrettably Macquarie University Cricket Club is not to be one of those teams despite having served a six season "apprenticeship" in Third and Fourth Grade.

The Cricket Club made an "impressive submission" for inclusion in the competition, however the Cricket Association, in its wisdom, has chosen to ignore our claims. The most galling aspect of the matter is that the decision was based on numbers rather than merit.

To compound the insult the Cricket Association Executive has not had the courtesy to favour us with written advice as to which competition the Club might compete in during the 1985-1986 season. The word from the chairman of the ACB is "I imagine Macquarie University will continue to play in the Municipal and Shires Competition."

The Cricket Association has clearly reneged on its undertakings of 1979 to see Macquarie University Cricket Club to first grade.

However, at this point, it would be remiss of me not to thank the Cricket Club Committee for its dedication in endeavouring to have Macquarie University gain first grade status. It has not been lack of administrative effort that has seen the Club ignored.

To reflect on our performance on the cricket field in 1984-1985 gives some insight as to why our claims for first grade could be ignored if indeed performance had been a criteria. The season saw our four teams win a combined total of 8 out of 68 programmed fixtures. Third grade finished last with 3 wins, neither Shire team won a match and finished unchallenged wooden spooners in their grades. Fourth grade won 5 games and managed to beat a couple of teams home, To be generous, a miserable result for the club.

Enough of the past. The 1985-1986 season presents an opportunity for Macquarie University Cricket Club to re-establish itself as a force in Municipal and Shire cricket. The club desperately needs success after a long period of mediocrity. The chance is now available.

Finally, to those of you who decide to pursue a grade career elsewhere. I would like to wish you, on behalf of the club, every success. To those of you who decide to stay on, thanks.

We didn't capitalise on this start and dropped one incredibly lucky batsman three times, he scored 97. They finished with 265 very lucky runs. Grunter was the pick of the bowlers with 5/58 after bowling from tea to stumps without a break. Brian King made a welcome return to Macquarie University with 3/49 and was unlucky not to get more. Tiger O'Rielly was bit astray and Laurie Ager bowled well early.

Our top three wickets went for 21, we lost it here but our "young uns" Jessop and Sidhu gave us great hope. Steven Sidhu hit a fine 65 and Ian Jessop 35. "Indoors" was one short of a P.B. with 35. Five top order bats left the crease with less than 10 on the board. Nothing more need be said.

vs Bankstown

MATCH REPORTS - FOURTH GRADE

vs Fairfield

On a bitterly cold, windswept day, the season began with a totally unsatisfactory total against an attack best described as tidy. Folkard (35) and Schaafsma (29) were the only batting "highlights". In a potentially dangerous situation, Schaafsma (33 not out) and Folkard (34 not out) steadied the situation and saw us through to the close with few alarms.

vs Sydney University

Macquarie University 178 and 2/55 lost to Sydney University 204.

In a batting display in which the top half of the order failed to take control, a sick total of 8/109 was kicked along by some fine batting by Notoras (52) and Garty (33 not out). Paul's innings was highlighted by some powerful driving, particularly straight down the ground. Had a few early chances been accepted, or a leg-side catch been allowed, a very determined and accurate bowling attack may have won the side a victory. All the bowlers bowled well, with Watkins (3/34) and Walker (3/43) taking the figures. Their opening stand put on 97. We then proceeded to take 10/107. In our second innings, Schaafsma (22 not out) took the honours.

vs Bankstown - Canterbury

Macquarie University 39 and 1/9 lost to Bankstown 168.

A tremendous bowling and fielding effort in which Walker took (4/29) and Watkins (3/36), was entirely wasted when an all-time record low score was recorded. Although nineteen of the twenty one players dismissed scored below double figures on a pitch that played diabolically low, a total of 39 is a disgrace in grade cricket. The second week was washed out.

vs Western Suburbs

Macquarie University 7/96 lost to Wests 9/214.

In the first of the one-day games, the bowlers did well to restrict Wests to about three and a half runs an over. All the bowlers did their jobs efficiently with Folkard (3/37) and Norton (2/51) taking the figures. Our batting effort was greatly influenced by an approaching storm and in an attempt to beat their average run-rate, we lost wickets too consistently to present a real threat. McVey (30) hit the ball with an ominous assurance only to be bowled by a Macquarie "odddity" - a grubber. After 35 overs the approaching storm materialised.

vs Balmain

Macquarie University 8/251 beat Balmain 7/246.

Our first victory of the season was to be memorable for a number of reasons. Firstly, the first major individual score for the season was recorded. Secondly, the manner in which the victory was achieved showed a maturity all too frequently shown in the club. A game limited to one-day because of consistent rain, the bowlers held Balmain to 1/112 after 38 overs at lunch. After the lunch break, the bowling and fielding buckled under sustained batting pressure. Walker with no wicket, but with only 37 runs of his 15 overs did an excellent bowler's job in limited over cricket. In our innings a terrible start of 4/29 was firstly revived by a stand of 70 between McVey and Adcock (34). The major turning point was a new record sixth-wicket stand of 109 between Walker (45) and McVey. By refusing to panic and waiting for the loose ball, these two showed what 60 over cricket was all about. The undoubted backbone of our victory was Danny McVey's first fifty plus score for the club, a tremendous century. Danny's innings of 105 was all the more meritorious as the last 60 were scored "on one leg". The remaining batsmen also did their bit by getting us home with two balls remaining. A great victory.

vs Sydney

Macquarie University 7/137 beat Sydney 132.

In a substandard pitch the bowlers again did a professional job in dismissing Sydney for 132, even though they weren't always assisted by sound fielding. Ager, in a return to fourth grade, took 3/25. Walker 2/22 off 16, Norton 2/20 also bowled well. Our middle order batting again came to our rescue with good contributions from Adcock, Walker and English. However, at 7/95 the game was still in the balance. An unbroken stand of 42 between Milligan (25 not out) and Norton (11 not out) saw us through to victory.

vs Waverley

Macquarie University 110 and 143 lost to Waverley 137 and 5/64.

An embarrassing score line of 9/69 was boosted by a resolute last wicket stand between Milligan (18) and Ager (16 not out). As low as our total was, 110 should have been enough but vital chances were missed. Our chances of facing the issue the second week were spoilt by a delayed start. Some dubious umpiring saw us slump to 8/93 before another Ager partnership of 41, this time with Garty (36 not out), held Waverley at bay. Ager had a fine match with match figures of 7/67 and a batting average of 35. Six points down the drain.

vs Penrith

Macquarie University 8/241 lost to Penrith 8/242.

A solid batting effort highlighted by Phil Walker (50 not out), in his last game for the club, Andrew Harrex (46) and Ian Jessop (48). We had Penrith on toast at 8/175 but missed opportunities cost us dearly. A missed six points against one of the strongest sides in the competition.

vs Mosman

Macquarie University 9/101 lost to Mosman 7/211.

A very disappointing batting performance, notable only in Jessop's (25 not out) and Schaafsma's injury. An "asking rate" of three and a half an over seemed well beyond our capabilities on this particular day.

vs Petersham

Macquarie University 9/300 beat Petersham 211 and 2/31.

Good early order batting mixed with some solid lower order contributions allowed us to reach a very satisfactory total. Schaafsma's (81), highlighted by some very powerful driving, and McVey's (61) were the pick. All the bowlers made contributions in dismissing Petersham on a very flat pitch. A good comeback after the disaster of the previous match.

vs Parramatta

Macquarie University 9/195 lost to Parramatta 4/197.

After a useful start, 1/112 at one stage, the innings lost direction and momentum. In a limited overs game this should have been a marvellous platform for a good score. Parramatta achieved the score line with relative ease.

vs Randwick

Macquarie University 149 lost to Randwick 163.

Without doubt one of the most disappointing defeats I've been associated with. Ager's 7/84 with solid support from Norton saw Randwick reach 163. The bowling and fielding effort deserved a better fate than the batting effort to follow. After an opening stand of 55, the batting disintegrated. Not in so much as we lost wickets but batsmen failed to keep the run-rate moving thus building the pressure on the lower order batsmen. At one stage we needed 6.7 runs per over when the overall asking rate was $2\frac{1}{2}$. Please learn from this situation.

vs North Sydney

Macquarie University 124 lost to North Sydney 1/126.

A feeble batting display, notable only for a determined last wicket stand of 38 between Aitken (22) and Lewis (21 not out). We were bowled out with ten overs remaining. North Sydney completed their victory in the twenty ninth over.

vs Northern Districts

Macquarie University 123 and 70 lost to Northern Districts 4/126 and 2/71 outright.

Our first innings debacle was highlighted by a ninth-wicket stand of 55 between Ager (33) and Lewis (21 not out). Earlier Harrex fought sickness to make a solid 32. We fared worse in our second innings, on a pitch that "stopped" at times. Unfortunately in District's second innings we should have been "allowed" further inroads into their innings, it wasn't to be.

vs Manly

Macquarie University 176 beat Manly 142.

Hard - hitting innings from Steve Sidhu (40) and Denlow (33) saw the side off to a brisk start. Dave Martin (34) and Garty (28) also made important contributions in giving us something to bowl to. In a reversal of the situation in the Randwick game, we contained Manly and they crumbled under the pressure. Ager, with 5/69 and Folkard 4/22, were assisted by some keen and enthusiastic fielding. It made all the difference.

vs St. George

Macquarie University 5/203 lost to St. George 7/326.

Under intense pressure from the heat and St. George's batting, our fielding fell away disastrously to allow St. George to build an enormous score. Trevor Norton suffered terribly from poor catching behind the wicket in his initial spell. Dave Lewis bowled steadily to take 5/104. Without a rapid start the run chase was not on. Harrex (62) and Folkard (73) gave the score some respectability and at least St. George had to suffer in the same uncomfortable blustery conditions as we did.

vs Sutherland

Macquarie University 7/173 beat Sutherland 171.

All the bowlers bowled well in dismissing Sutherland for 171 in the 46th of the allowed 60 overs. It would have been even less had catches been accepted. A SHIRES CAPTAIN'S REPORT

As has become customary while Macquarie fields sides in both the Grade and Shires Competitions, the Macquarie "A Shires" team struggled in the 1984-1985 season. Although in winning positions on several occasions, the team failed to win a game during the season, missing out on wins because of poor finishing, lack of killer instinct, bad luck, rain and/or just not knowing how to win.

As has occurred consistently in recent seasons, Macquarie suffered from numerous middle order collapses and the inability to bowl sides out. The early order batting on the whole was quite sound, with Ivan Blyth and Andrew Harrex featuring in several 50 run opening partnerships early in the season. Simon Burchett maintained the solid starts when these two moved up to Grade, showing a determination not to get out that many could learn from. Further down the order Steve Wiblin and Dave "Sticks" Lewis frustrated many bowling attacks with aggressive hitting and staunch defence respectively. Hunter Leonard's early season form with the bat was spectacular to say the least, clobbering many boundaries off opposition bowlers.

On the bowling side, several players performed well, although no-one dominated sufficiently to enable us to bowl sides out for low scores. Hunter Leonard has improved dramatically since coming to the Club, and was one of our chief wicket takers while in the side. Mike Cashman bowled tightly when given the chance, and will be a much improved bowler next season in his second year on turf wickets. Spin duo Steve Wiblin and Dave "Sticks" Lewis became a formidable combination with Sticks bowling flat and tight from on end, and Steve tossing it up at the other end enticing the batsmen into rash shots. Roy Denlow tells me he bowled well when he took over the side.

In looking at the players named above, it is far from coincidental that they were all regular attenders at training. Players cannot expect to perform when they do not pick up a bat or a ball between Saturdays. While on the subject of training, members should work individually at making them as valuable as possible. Firstly, "Batsmen" should not be bowling in the nets at the expense of recognised bowlers, and we should be limited to three bowlers a net. Secondly, batsmen should be batting to the field the respective bowlers would be likely to employ. Too many times spinners are being lofted out of the nets into the outfield. In a match, these shots go straight down fielder's throats. At training, it annoys bowlers who have to retrieve balls, and reduces the number of balls faced in the allotted time. Finally, each player should participate in the fielding sessions while at training. Fielding is one aspect of the game that improves significantly with training, yet we have several people who go out of their way to avoid fielding while at training. A big thank you to Trevor Norton for his help at training and to the groundstaff for preparing what were on 95% of the time, excellent practice wickets.

I would like to thank Ron Aitken, Michael Denlow and others who took over the captaincy when I went up to Grade. Above all, I would like to thank Jim McCoy for his assistance during the season. The B Grade Captaincy has to be one of the toughest jobs in the Club, with players dropping out at the last minute and replacements having to be found. Through it all Jim offered only quiet words of complaint and still managed to enjoy his cricket.

Many thanks to all those who played with Macquarie this season, and I hope to see you back next season.

In the last hour of play on the first day Lindfield started shakily, with Hunter Leonard taking two wickets and Laurie Blackman looking decidedly unconvincing.
