REPORTS

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Twelve months ago, when I took over as President the committee set three main goals for 2019/20 season. The first was to improve our playing list and improve our position in the Club Championship. I am pleased to say we achieved our first goal. First Grade and Second Grade just missing out on finals cricket in the last round of the season. Third Grade and Fourth Grade help provide quality players when needed for the higher grades. It was wonderful to see the depth of players MUCC had at our club. A big congratulations goes to Syed and the boys who won the Chappelow Cup competition, MUCC has a long history of winning premierships and I'm pleased we can add another to our Clubs history. I would also like to thank all players who played in Masters and NSCA. Your support and dedication to MUCC has been outstanding.

Our second goal was to work with Macquarie University to improve the facilities at Macquarie University sports field. The ultimate objective was to play at University Oval again, along with access to the change rooms. It was clear early that Macquarie University had no desire to work with on this matter. They also informed us that the cricket wickets had been ripped up and it would cost a considerable sum to install them again. We spoke to them about improving facilities on the two upper grounds. During these discussions we were told that the Uni is putting the whole complex up for tender and Macquarie University would not fund any improvements. Part of the tender deal would be for the winning bid to improve the facilities at their own expense, for which Macquarie University clubs would have access to them in the future. It was also mentioned to us that Northern Oval may be converted into a synthetic playing surface within the next couple of years.

Thirdly, our final goal was to bring the budget back into surplus after a couple of loss-making years. Part of this plan was to reduce spending, increase fees, find new sponsors, and chase up debtors. Unfortunately, we received an unexpected field hire invoice of \$18,000. This one amount was nearly the total amount from the previous year. After discussing the fee with Macquarie University, we were told that our field hire had increased to 20% of the full field hire amount. An increase from 10% of the full fee in 2018/19, 5% in 2017/18 and free before that. As result the club was facing a final invoice of approximately \$36,000. This blew our budget out of the water and the club was facing a huge debt. After several meetings to negotiate the price, the committee successful had the fee reduced. The reduction was a "one off" and 2020/21 would return to the normal rate. At the same time, 2021/22 would see a further 5% increase in field hire. It was disappointing that Macquarie University would price cricket out of the market.

The committee then proceeded to work with NSW Cricket/Sydney Cricket Association on trying to find cheaper alternate venues. After an exhausting search, we were told that no alternate fields are available. We then submitted multiple business cases to Macquarie University on how our club can increase revenue and reduce our costs. Part of the proposal was to cap our field hire at \$25,000 per year (slightly higher than the average Shires Club). All proposals were rejected.

I write this report with sadness, as our great club faces an uncertain future. A future where the Macquarie University Cricket Club may not exist as we know it. I strongly believe that myself and the committee gave everything we possible could to save the club, to preserve the history and to march on for future generations to enjoy Shires cricket at Macquarie University. It's just unfortunate Macquarie University don't share the same passion.

I would to finish off by thanking the committee and in particular David and Ash for their tireless work this season.

There are a number of other things I'd like to write about this particular set of circumstances and the approach by MU Campus Life, but for once I will not operate on the windy side of care and maintain a dignified silence.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Although revenue for the period 1 Apr 2019 to 31 March 2020 increased by \$22,548 from the previous fiscal year, unfortunately the expenses also increased by \$14,633.

This leaves MUCC with bank balances of \$10,709.85 (against \$18,320.04 from the FY18/19 fiscal year). This leaves the club with financial challenges in future seasons, given the substantial increases in venue hire charges by Macquarie University (MU) this season and increases in future seasons (charges could potentially double next season, and double again the season after).

While the Treasurer considers that the losses for 2019/20 season could have been significantly worse, in reality the Club benefitted from a number of committee decisions.

- a. There was an additional \$2K in total sponsorship funding from the Ranch, Aussizz Migration and Boost Juice.
- b. Membership fees were up on last year, partly due to increase in fees, but also constant/consistent following up on outstanding payments, mostly thanks to the Club Secretary. Additional \$7K from last year.
- c. The Club President & Secretary were able to negotiate with the MU to put a freeze on the ground hire fees for a period of 6 – 8 weeks. This allowed MUCC to only pay \$24K compared to what would have been the actual cost of \$36K. A saving of \$12K.
- d. Incentive payments made to players was kept at a minimum. Only \$1.2K spend this year.
- e. The demountables situated on the Northern Oval were returned to EPB Sheds at the end of January as the costs would have been significantly more. Saving of an additional \$3K. This kept the cost similar to FY18/19.
- f. Commission for selling of "Radio Ears" at the SCG (achieving \$2.5K mostly due to the time, effort and hard work of the committee and in particular Simon Fairlie).
- g. Purchases of new balls for the season were lower than anticipated, due to additional purchases made in the previous season (saving \$15K).
- h. No AGM being held at the Ranch due to COVID-19 and its unpredictability. It did not make sense to book and pay for a venue when the deposit may be lost in the current socio-economic climate. There were also no trophies were purchased. Saving of \$5K.
- i. Donation of \$2,750 from a committee member to help assist with the overall financials.

This did not however save the Club from accruing a loss compared to the previous years' financials.

The key items that need to be taken into consideration are:

- a. MU will continually put up their fee structure and even with the 80% discount that they provide we are still looking at over \$36K for next year and more likely a figure above \$40K. In FY18/19 MUCC paid \$9K in ground hire compared to the expected cost of \$36K for FY19/20. This is a significant increase of \$27K. This amount also excludes any demountable costs, which should also be considered by the next committee as they are significant (approx. \$7K - \$10K).
- b. Tim Creer Cup (TCC) and Chappellow Cup have costs for umpires which was covered by the club. This was a \$3K expense that should be factored into next years' fees (although \$500 was recovered by the TCC team). It also needs to be considered if MUCC should have a Chappellow Cup team next year as that is not required to play in Shires.
- c. Pre-season training was \$4K. Cheaper alternatives need to be considered for future seasons, as that cost is unsustainable.

Expenditure previously considered a club responsibility (uniforms etc.) may need to be instead user pays. Perhaps consider "club before self" before committing club funds to "nice to haves" but not "essentials". Greater effort from the whole cricket community is required to bring significant sponsors into the club to ease the financial pressures.

There is no easy answer and it will require a committed and cost-conscious committee to lead the club in the challenging times ahead. I encourage you all to get involved in the running of the club – every little bit helps!
