

TREASURER'S REPORT

I am pleased to report that the Club's finances continue to remain healthy and don't require any major surgery.

During the 1996/97 season the accumulated funds increased by approximately \$1,800 and now exceed \$18,000. This is very pleasing since at the start of the season the Club had bills totaling \$6,668 to pay before a ball could be bowled.

This year was the first year the Club hasn't had a Club coach since the 1990/91 season. On the whole the Club, on the field, seemed to suffer. It is a problem which the Committee has to address quickly. The money saved from not having a coach was put towards updating clubhouse supplies, past premiership photos for the clubhouse, the clock, the bell and new scoreboards for all three grounds.

This year also saw the resurrection of the Macquarie Seven-A-Side tournament. As expected it rained and a ball wasn't bowled. This forced us to reschedule to December (which reduced our entry of 16 teams to 10 teams) The day turned out to be a success and all teams involved are looking forward to the next Macquarie Sevens. Along with the trivia night a profit of approximately \$650 was made, which was put into the Annual Dinner Presentation to reduce costs.

I would like to thank David Budge, Peter Saliba and Barry Brien for their efforts and input into introducing me to this role and also for answering the questions that cropped up during the season.

Also I wish to thank Tubie, Toy and the Committee for their support and efforts throughout the season. The 'core' of an experienced and enthusiastic Committee is evolving for the coming seasons.

Congratulations to all the captains for their enthusiasm and dedication through a tough season. Also congratulations to all players who reached milestones and personal achievements during the year.

I would like to finish by thanking the Macquaire University Sports Association. The Club is very appreciative of the financial assistance and the continued availability of first rate facilities provided by MUSA. My personal thanks to Margaret and Bob for their willingness to help, their patience, understanding and support during the year.

CAPTAIN'S REPORT: "1st GRADE" SHIRES

Finished 7th, 14 points off the semis. 6 wins, 3 draws, 5 losses and a bye.

Back-to-back premierships don't come along very often in any sport - so in one sense, to not win following our win last year is the common experience of most premiership sides. Nevertheless, we "should" have made the semis. We never got into 4th gear until it was too late. We played patchy cricket due to a disrupted playing schedule because of a bye and bad weather, and a constantly changing team. This year after six rounds, we had played only six full days of the possible twelve. Momentum had proved an asset for us last year as we steamrolled the last few rounds and finals, but we were unable to regather it this year. We enjoyed ourselves anyway.

Perhaps it was a case of the season after the season before...? We would have had to win three more times to make the semis this year. It highlights the value of our four outrights last year. It shows how our bowlers got us there and won it for us, often defending small totals.

This year we welcomed new faces such as Mick Walker (PB), Seamus Ross, and Terry Dorrell, and some older faces as well - Ken and Il Duce. Ashley Stanwell, as keeper, made his first grade debut with flying colours, and it was nice to see the Club acknowledge his success with the 'Most Improved' award. Dave Hayman showed he can mix it at this level too. The other side of this coin is that too many players were rotating through the side (which made life tough for Tony Barnes), which slightly hampered consistency and teamwork.

At Christmas, we were twelve points from a possible twenty-four considering the stop-start weeks, and at the time, a long way out of the top four. Our bowlers consequently had little rhythm, and our batsman rarely converted their starts. Mentally we struggled to focus - couldn't make it translate on the field in spite of our desperation.

Our high spots were against Burwood (always good to beat them) and the last few games. There was tension in the contest, Toy leading the way with the bat, good middle and late order fight-backs (Dermie in particular)... tough, fast opening spells of bowling, rock solid change bowlers, sharp fielding and catching. We finished on a high.

The trophy has moved on - South East Sydney have it now - good luck to them - we didn't get to play them. Thanks to Tubey, Webby and Toy, as the key organisers for the season, to Jock for another year of fine pitches, to all the captains, and to all the others who made their contribution quietly.

This year was our first towards the next premiership.

MATCH REPORTS - "1st GRADE" SHIRES

v Auburn 4 (dec) 345 defeated Auburn 325

Pepper lasted one ball before a back problem sidelined him, and Toy finished off his 35 not out to make 82.

But it was Pete's game, smashing the bowling to all parts of the ground for a sensational 185 not out.

Auburn started slowly but had a good shot at the target, most of their batsmen scoring 30s and 40s. Dermie (4/64) got away to a good start for the season, as did the veteran Ken Dixon, 3/43.

v Canterbury

Canterbury's late withdrawal from the competition led to the bye round, when many of their players went to the embattled Petersham Club. Hmmm.

v Strathfield 124 lost to Strathfield 9/206

Day one washed out, hence a one dayer, and for the third time in a row at Airey in recent years we bowled first, chased 200 and didn't get them on a low, slow turner. We kept Strathfield quiet until the 53rd over, when they exploded with a late burst. Webby took the load onto his shoulders and bowled 27 overs for 3/53, along with Nasty 3/32, and Wick 3/61.

Our batting started slowly, with Linus (22) the mainstay. When we lost 4/14 in the middle to be 6/71, our tail couldn't help on this occasion. Chasing at Airey is always tough, and the toss often decides the game.

v Lane Cove 176 lost to Lane Cove 6 (dec) 203

A poor loss where we bowled without venom, and batted like millionaires. And even then, nearly got up. Losses by 30 runs or less are the games that could and should have been won - with more guts basically.

Lane Cove won the toss and batted on a slowish, flat pitch and took all day to do it. Their pommy No.4 was the worst player of the short ball we had seen for some time - he still got 43 - ouch! Day 2 washed out.

v Lindfield 8 (dec) 254 drew with Lindfield 3/55

Won the toss and batted on a deck with plenty of grass. Toy (30) and PB (47) got us away to a good start, but we slumped to 6/144, before Mono (106 not out) and Budgie (29) put on 90. It was a great recovery considering the quality of Lindfield's attack.

Most of day 2 was washed out with a storm at 2.30pm, when Lindfield had, after 30 overs, already decided to close up shop, hoping for the storm. It came and went, but the umpires wanted to go home at 4.30pm with 45 overs still to play. The umpires thought the pitch was fine, and the outfield was fine with both captains. However the umpires feared legal action against them personally if a fielder slipped and got hurt, and hence refused to go back out. We might have suggested a tennis ball, too, but we didn't.

It was a farce, and a loss of 6 points.

v Burwood 170 defeated Burwood 161

Won the toss and batted. Again found ourselves in trouble at 4/36 until Mono (30) and Webby (41) put on 65, at which point we again slumped to 9/132. The umpiring was not flash either. Dermie (34 not out) and Phil Wheeler (16) put on a late, match-winning partnership.

Thankfully the quality of umpiring continued for us to have them 4/82 overnight, and evenly poised. And in spite of our butter-fingers on day 2, we hung on to snatch a win. Webby took 4/43, Nast 3/50 and Dermster 2/20.

v Holroyd 185 lost to Holroyd 9 (dec) 316

Lost the toss and bowled. Did well to get them to 6/147 on a very plum wicket, before Curtis did it to us again with 131. Everyone got some (even including PB - Pretty Boy or Partnership Breaker) with Webby in front with 3/43.

CAPTAIN'S REPORT: "2nd GRADE" SHIRES

1996/7 season saw second grade fail to perform to our potential, recording only 4 wins with 6 losses (1 outright) and 4 draws (1 wash-out).

At the beginning of the season, when looking at the team, I believed we were on course to win the premiership and indeed at times we played like champions. However this was very irregular and at times we looked very ordinary. The reasons and areas we need to address before next season are:

- Inconsistent availability not for one game did we have the same 11 players. I know it is a long season and commitments are ever present, however to win a competition we need a **real** commitment to the team and Club.
- Responsibility to team at times during the season we struggled to have 11 players at the start of play let alone with the necessary time to prepare for the game. A lot of time you could see the difference in the two teams by the approach they took to a game. Watching the opposition prepare while we were still straggling in, reflected the manner in which the game was played.
- Situation of players the majority of our team are older players who have career and family commitments. Their experience and guidance are invaluable to the younger players and the Club. However, we need them to lead the way in setting a stance and committed attitude to fire up the younger players and push them to play to the best of their ability.
- Pressure on players unfortunately the pressure being placed on people throughout all the grades is minimal. This means the players are content to play lower grades and are not striving to play in higher grades. It has to be everybody's goal to play in the highest grade possible.
- Training we need direction and attendance at training. Our results this year mirrored the attitude displayed at training. We need to set goals, work at deficits and pull together as a team.

To the positives. Thank-you to all players who played in seconds this year. The season produced some good results. Grant Harcourt was the find of the season. He turned the ball a long way and at times completely deceived the batsmen. His 25 wickets was a good haul and a great start to his career at Macquarie. Kenny Dixon bowled beautifully and was always hard to score off. It was unfortunate for our team that Ken only played half the season in seconds because his experience and ability to pull the team together by a performance with either bat or ball was missed. Andrew Slattery really turned his season around. After a very forgettable start to the season Slatts took up the challenge picking up 15 wickets, bowling good line and pace. Dave Smith was the unluckiest of bowlers. He bowled with great pace, often beating the batsman with little result. His attitude was always right and he is committed to winning - the attitude the team needs!

It was our batting that let us down this season. Bruce Hort had a good season scoring 332 runs and could be relied upon to score runs especially when they were needed. His experience was invaluable and he was always there with advice and encouragement. Terry Dorrell scored a beautiful 124, and looked very good at times. Dave Folkard had a good year scoring 245 runs and setting the innings on the right course. His fielding at times was inspirational as displayed in the game against Pennant Hills. He is a hard worker that the Club is very lucky to have steering the ship. Dave Broadfield had an unhappy year with the bat. very enthusiastic cricketer who has the ability to lift those around him. Phil Wheeler also had a good year being very consistent behind the stumps. He is a very knowledgeable cricketer who is always willing to lend assistance.

To my fellow captains, especially Chris (Gus) Hook, the task of getting a team on the field was harder than I imagined, and I thank you for your assistance and support in getting me through.

Thank you to the Committee, especially Dave Webb. Webby puts so much effort into this Club that people should express their thanks to him every day or at the very least buy him a beer or two.

Let's look forward to a good season next year. Go Macquarie!

CAPTAIN'S REPORT - "3rd Grade" Shires

The third grade season could be summarized in one word. However one word reports make for entirely unedifying reading, besides which the Committee would no doubt frown upon the brevity of such a report, and as this is not the sort of publication in which that particular word is used, the gory details shall be gone into in a little more detail than perhaps this writer would wish. So steel yourself gentle reader for a tale so horrible it would surely only be found previously in the dusty pages of old Pennant Hills reports.

Our season emphasised a lack of depth and commitment within the Club. To be successful in Third Grade a side needs several experienced players from higher grades to support younger players keen to move up through the grades. We had neither of these. In fact frequently we lacked even two or three more players to fill the team sheet out from 1-11 as per normal cricket requirements. This resulted in us losing only 11 of our 16 games. (Yes the fifth word in that sentence was losing – not winning as is the usual way in Third Grade). We learnt to empathise this with our cricketing brothers - England!!

But before this author, who is renowned for his sunny disposition and enthusiastic outlook on life, becomes permanently bitter and twisted it is time to reflect on the highlights of our season. These include:-

- A strong morale within the side, something difficult to maintain in a losing side.
- The performance of Jason Ford who developed as a bowler to Third Grade standard and who consumed more junk food than the Hamburglar himself.
- The fielding of Michael Fitzgerald later recognised with the Club's Fielding award.
- The improvement in the wicket keeping of Michael Quodling
- The exciting match against the amiable and eminently sportsminded players from Burwood who unfortunately are all stricken deaf and mute when umpiring!!

My thanks at the end of a long season go firstly to my team-mates particularly Thomas Roch, Paul Sweeney, Daks Whitehead, Michael Fitzgerald and Jason Ford who were supportive and enthusiastic when it was hardest to be so. Secondly to the Committee notably Dave Webb, Jamie Breden and Dave Folkard for all their assistance which was always available. Finally to the groundstaff for the superb ovals and wickets which our opponents fully appreciated.

One Hundred games ago this author lost his first game for the Club outright against Sydney University.
