#### TREASURER'S REPORT

Profit for the period 1 Jul 2017 to 31 March 2018 was \$19377.15, with bank balances of \$33, 745.37, leaving the club well placed for the financial challenges in future seasons, given the substantial increases in venue hire charges by Macquarie University over the next two seasons (charges will double next season, and double again the season after).

While the Treasurer may consider that the large surplus for 2017/8 was the result of his vice like grip on the club bank accounts steadfastly imposed all season, the reality is that the club benefitted from a number of "one off" credits.

- a. The 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary dinner made an unexpected profit, mostly due to the raffle takings on the night courtesy of great prizes arranged by Craig Edwards and his organising committee (\$5K).
- b. No incentive payments were made to players in season 2017/8 (saving \$5K year on year)
- c. Budgeted one day shirts were not purchased , as SCA withdrew approval for the design (saving (\$3.5K)
- d. Registration payments outstanding from season 2016/7 were vigorously pursued (\$1.6K)
- e. Commission for selling of "Radio Ears" at the SCG in an Ashes year (achieving \$2k more than budgeted, mostly due to the time, effort and hard work of the club president)
- f. Purchases of new balls for the season were lower than anticipated, due to additional purchases made in the previous season (saving \$3K)
- g. Subsidy of the AGM Presentation Night (and Trophy purchases) in May 2018 will occur after the books are closed for audit, and will be deferred to season 2018/9 (\$3K)

Those \$23K windfalls did however enable us to fund the unexpected /non budgeted replacement of the covers at the Northern Oval (\$6.5K). Unfortunately, another set will be required in the coming seasons for the Gwilliam Oval.

The MU venue hire charge increases present a significant financial challenge to the club. Simply increasing registration fees is not the answer. An even tighter rein on club expenditure must be maintained going forward. Expenditure previously considered a club responsibility (uniforms, lunches, pub crawls etc,) may need to be instead user pays. Perhaps consider "club before self" before committing club funds to "nice to haves" but not "essentials". Club results from 2017/8 suggest that reinstatement of incentive payments may be required to draw new talent into the club. Greater effort from the whole cricket community is required to bring significant sponsors into the club to ease the financial pressures.

There is no easy answer and it will require a committed and zealous committee to lead the club in the challenging times ahead. I encourage you all to get involved in the running of the club – every little bit helps!

#### FIRST GRADE CAPTAIN'S REPORT

It is an honour for me to be able to write a report as Captain of Macquarie University Cricket Club's 1<sup>st</sup> Grade side. As a former Captain of our Under 24's and 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade, I cannot express how much pleasure it gives me to be trusted enough by the club with the responsibility of Captaining our Club's Premier grade.

Unfortunately, this will not go down as one of the Club's better seasons in any grade, let alone 1<sup>st</sup> Grade. The club took a gamble in changing the on-field leadership structure at the top and we always knew that this season would be a building block for the future, however the difficulty exceeded our own expectations. It would be easy to look at the ladder and say that we, alongside North West Sydney Hurricanes, were the whipping boys of the competition however that doesn't begin to paint a real picture. In Round 1 we were comprehensively beaten by Lane Cove, however in Round 2 against the always strong Burwood we had them 8 down and with an extra 20 runs we feel we would have got the final wickets. Round 3 we had Georges River on toast on Day 1 before just not turning up on Day 2. The one that really hurt was Round 4 v NWS, where we posted 291 and reduced them to 72-5 before the rain saved them on 115-5. In my opinion, bonus points for bowling and fielding need to be looked at as both sides get nothing from such games, when there was clearly only one side on top.

Mount Pritchard/Southern Districts taught us a lesson, the game v Auburn was in the balance when rain fell and Warringah overpowered us as we reached the Christmas break without a point on the board. We were still on our Christmas break as a 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade (being generous) attack from Balmain South Sydney rolled us for 76 before the following week a gut-wrenching defeat against Strathfield where we dropped the winning catch and they passed us 9 down in the final over. Our response to that with a superb run chase against Pennant Hills gave us our first win of the season, however poor performances against Lindfield and Roseville undermined our quality. Had we taken all our chances we would have had 30-40 points on the board and been threatening a finals existence, this remains the goal for next season.

In order to thrive as a club it is important to have a core of young players who can develop together and help the club reach new heights. I am particularly proud of Ben French and Saurabh Tanpure who both hit a few fifties each through the course of the season, and Nathan Webster who hit a beautiful hundred against Burwood showing much maturity for someone so young. AJ Gray's return to 1st Grade cricket was a positive one, also with two fifties and regular runs throughout the year. Having the quality of Ian Janda after Christmas was a huge boost and he was the lynch-pin of our run chase against Pennant Hills with a commanding knock of 108, and took a great 5 wicket haul against Epping. There were also fifties from our English import Dan Waite, Sean Patterson and three for myself.

With the ball, Ashwin Premkumar led the line with pace and accuracy. He is a talent that we will sorely miss if he decides to pursue Grade Cricket but we wish him luck and hope he stays with us for many more seasons to come. Dan Waite bowled with pace but without luck, the number of dropped catches from his bowling is unknown as it got that high. Nathan Webster is a bowler who likes to get stuck in, and he can become the Club's premier all-rounder in the next season or two if he puts his mind to it. Paul Clift and Simon Fairlie twirled away as Dad's Army, collecting regular wickets and battling off the soreness for another crack at 1st Grade cricket. I must extend a massive thank you to these two for their administrative assistance throughout the season, and congratulate Clifty for being our leading wicket taker with 13, closely followed by Janda with 12 and Ashwin with 11.

Injuries, training attendance and dropped catches ultimately cost us this season but the building blocks for future years are there to ensure the club has on-field success. Names mentioned already will have benefitted massively from their experience of 1<sup>st</sup> Grade this year and will come back stronger next year. It is vitally important that we all value the Club very highly and do what is necessary to make the club successful. That in itself will breed individual success and satisfaction. I wrote an article recently about what the club means to me personally, I hope the club means as much to everyone

else as it does to me. *Club Over Self Every Time* is a motto we should adopt. It remains my dream that we together build Macquarie University Cricket Club back to greatness.

As much as I am grateful to each and every member of the club for their support and respect, I have to save the biggest thank you to the one person who is responsible for my being here today; my wife Jess. Whether it is dealing with my grumpiness after a defeat, my elation after a win or good performance, or any other support I need she is always there for me. She allows me to be absent on a Saturday for 7 months of the year to play this wonderful game, with nothing but love, understanding and support. Thank you, Jess.

To all who have graced the turf for 1<sup>st</sup> Grade this year, thank you for your efforts. Onwards and upwards, lets do everything in our power to make 2018/19 a successful season for all grades.

#### **SECOND GRADE CAPTAIN'S REPORT**

We started the season with a gritty win against Lane Cove, showing that the relatively inexperienced squad were a competitive second grade side. We toiled with the ball to hold their side to 245 as the game swayed either way. A promising start to the season for Anantha P. (15) with the bat showing he could grind out the opening bowlers providing steady support for a rampant innings from another debutant, Nick Pye (61). The chase sealed by Giyan (58\*) and Stephen Rose (52\*) only 4 down.

The highlight game of the year against Georges River saw us collapse early after an explosive start by Ather Saeed (28), until Naji Haider (19) tied in with Dylan Dharmadasa (56) to help us limp to a subpar 172. Despite some early breakthroughs on day 2, Georges were poised for a likely win at 5/144. Enter 16yr old young-gun Avi Bansal (5/14) – tearing through the Georges middle order and tail. The Warriors took the last 6 wickets for just 14 runs - Georges all out 160 and 1<sup>st</sup> innings points to the Warriors.

Across the season it became clear that we were a formidable bowling attack that could create countless chances and defend modest totals. However we were consistently hindered by two things which would ultimately cost us a shot in the finals:

- 1. Failing to bat 80 overs (or 50 in one dayer); and
- 2. Poor fielding and numerous simple dropped catches

At our peak we held the 7<sup>th</sup> spot late in the season with a potential shot in the finals – a massive feat for the young side compared to the previous season. With at least 5 other teams hunting for the 6<sup>th</sup> position it required our best performances. Unfortunately it wasn't to be as we stumbled against Strathfield and Lindfield (rain affected) which sealed our fate to finish the season at #11.

Key standouts with the bat were Giyan Dharmadasa (501 runs @ 45.55) and Dylan Dharmadasa (369 runs @ 28.38). Some honourable mentions for debutants Nick Pye and Prahlad Iyer who both showed enormous talent at various stages through the season with the bat.

Key standouts with the ball were Giyan Dharmadasa (25 wickets @ 22.08) and Prahlad Iyer (14 wickets @ 27.21). A stunning 5fa by Avi Bansal (9 wickets @ 15.89) and 4fa by Butaal Harmass (8 wickets @ 14.5) found them taking #3 and #4 positions – unfortunately their seasons cut short due to injury and other commitments.

Every year the folly of 2<sup>nd</sup> grade has been regularity in the squad and this season was no different with performing players rightfully absorbed into the 1<sup>st</sup> grade team or large numbers of unavailable players leaving many vacancies in the side. Despite this, we were able to establish a strong culture in the squad with most players indicating they have learnt a lot about their game and most importantly have enjoyed their cricket with the boys.

If we can continue to focus on improving our fielding and batting long innings I'm sure we will be a formidable side in the upcoming season. Overall, a wonderful experience in my maiden season as captain developing these young players and I look forward to getting to the finals in 2018/19!

In the next game, Macquarie faced the always tough Briars to whom they lost outright after being forced to follow on. The only highlight of the game was Mr Dependable, Andrew Burford taking 4/39 from 9. Unfortunately, the first two games foreshadowed what was to come to Macquarie Uni Third Grade as they went on for the rest of 2017 without experiencing the sweet feeling of winning. One of the reasons for 3rd grade's lack of success was a lack of depth which meant, often the side they were fielding was not as strong as the oppositions. Furthermore, there was a lack of clear plan made apparent to the players, excluding the common cricketing cliché's such as 'bowl to your field' and 'keep wickets in hand' often thrown around at the start of the day.

The lack of a game plan was a result of the inexperience of the team which is an issue that the club must seek to remedy in order to aid the development of younger players so that they can continue in their winning ways and allow players to reach their potential. In addition, changing leadership and a lack of a core player group in the 3rd grade side hindered their ability to string consistent performances together. In spite of these problems, Macquarie third grade continue to put in 100% on the pitch and enjoy each other's company off the pitch.

2018 meant a new year and rediscovering that winning feeling. Uni played Balmain South Sydney in a one dayer to being 2018. The Macquarie bowlers, led by Sam Osborne (4/19) provided a solid platform for the batsman by bowling the opposition out for 147. The batsman also stepped up, adamant that they would not waste this chance, by producing a solid opening partnership between Desh Hewawasam (29) and Anantha Panchalingam (49), before making way for Aniket Agale (37) to come in and blast the team to victory. However, the problems which plagued the team in the first half of the season, continued to affect the team in the second half of the season, as the team had to endure an embarrassing loss to Strathfield after being bowled out for 48 in the first innings.

Wins did not come by often for the rest of the season. Nevertheless, the team continued to put and found themselves in a good position. After the bowlers bowled themselves to exhaustion, led by Jagath Rajendran (3/75) and Andrew Burford (2/28) and managing to restrict Roseville to 197, they were put into bat at the end of the day. Despite both openers falling cheaply in the finals overs of the game, Desh Hewawasam (70) came out on day 2 and showed how easy cricket can be when played with such skill and such a steely mindset. Desh managed to string several crucial partnerships with Sam Osborne (6) and Aditya Dhankar (18), before getting out and keeping the game extremely suspenseful. However, Nick Wasliev (45) showed the shots he's capable of hitting to power the Macquarie University 3rd grade to victory. Despite the lack of wins this season, it is evident that many of the players to play 3rd grade have what it takes to play higher grades, and if the aforementioned problems are fixed, then Macquarie University 3rd grade can and will return to its winning ways and contend for the Premiership.

#### **Masters Season Report**
