

U@Mq is requiring all sports cubs to lift their university student participation rates to ensure we retain use of the Macquarie University grounds at the highly subsided rate we enjoy. The cricket club's use of grounds at Macquarie University is significantly subsided compared to other Shires' clubs. Furthermore, the University is losing money on the use of grounds and all sports clubs have been asked to become more sustainable. The new committee will as a matter of priority will need to increase our student engagement.

I'd like to take the opportunity to thank Pete Saliba and Chris McPherson for their work through the season on the MUCC executive. Also, a big thanks to the committee especially John Salmond this season, without volunteers like yourselves, a club like ours cannot function, so all your help is greatly appreciated. #### **Treasurer's Report**

Season 2015-16 saw MUCC maintain a strong financial position – namely from continued success with fee collection - \$29555 collected (though \$8000 below forecast). Easier payment methods such as the leverage of a portable EFTPOS machine as well as heavy discounts for early payment saw fees hitting our bank earlier in the season than normal – enabling us to gain early season discounts on our bulk ball and clothing orders.

This season saw the continuation of our sponsorship agreement with the Ranch – tho not to the levels past seasons had yielded us – receiving only \$2052.33 to date (down just over \$3k from the previous season). However, the biggest fundraising opportunity was our ongoing relationship with Dave Deller and the sale of his company's cricket radio "ears". Dave's company gave MUCC volunteers the opportunity to sell radio "ears" at the January Sydney Test Match as well as a handful of one dayers throughout the summer. A special thanks to Simon Fairlie for his tremendous effort in liaising with Dave, as well as to the handful of volunteers who gave up their time in raising these essential funds for the club. These efforts saw the club raise \$4238 – a significant chunk of change!

2015/16 saw us continue our agreement with Amir Nazir's cricket supplies company. The previous season saw Amir's company help us to achieve 40% cost savings on our existing provider and the quality of the gear increase tremendously. It is due to these cost savings that during the season we rolled out new One day playing shirts to the entire playing body.

Investment in Marquee players increased to \$5750 for this season – however didn't result in the outcomes on the park we were expecting from this flagship side. A review will be scheduled.

Investment in Cricket balls increased dramatically this season to \$14103 – taking advantage of heavy bulk discounts – to set us up for the upcoming season.

Moving into next season, we are in an excellent position to build upon this solid platform. Many thanks to the continuing support of the executive as well as the extended committee. Without volunteers a club like ours simply would not exist.

#### **MUCC 2015-2016 1st Grade Captains Report**

The first grade 2015/2016 season was a season of two halves. Our performances didn't start off on the right track and very quickly we found ourselves near the bottom of the ladder apart from two hard fought wins against Balmain South Sydney and Roseville. In general, we as a team did not perform up to a first grade standard in batting, bowling and particularly fielding which cost us what would have turned out to be crucial wins.

In the midst of a disappointing first half however there were some scintillating individual performances. Rehan's 74 against South Sydney was pivotal in taking us to victory and his 141\* against Lindfield was one of the best individual innings you will ever see combining solid defence with some expansive shot play getting MUCC out of tricky situations in both matches. Harshith weaved his magic against South Sydney to return impressive figures of 5/16. Luke showed us his all-round skills against Roseville with an elegant 78 and 2/22 of his 10 overs. Hasana showed how dangerous he can be with the bat in a belligerent 74\* against Warringah.

The post-Christmas period showed more of what we are capable of accomplishing as a team winning against the top two teams in the competition in Burwood and Georges River. Our bowlers really came to the party in the second half of the season and were instrumental in putting us in a position where a quarter finals berth was a possibility. Some notable performances came against the top teams with Sean Patterson picking up 4/44 and Tarun 3/39 leading the charge against Burwood and allowed us to defend a paltry score of 100 and brought us our third win of the season and with it confidence that would see us win the next two matches and put us in equal 7th position. Luke jones starred with the ball against Georges river taking 4 scalps and followed it up with his first five wicket hall for MUCC against Norwest. Rehan again scored a brilliant 84 to lead us to victory against Georges river in a tense match with some heated exchanges between the two teams.

We beat Norwest in the penultimate round as expected but required an outright win to ensure a greater chance of finishing in the top 6. As it turned out, other results were not favourable to our march towards the top 6 and ultimately all but ruled us out before the last preliminary round match against Southern Districts. We ended up losing the last match to Southern districts which left us with 5 wins for the season.

All in all, it was a disappointing season for MUCC first grade given the team on paper and although we were resurgent in the second half of the season, it took too long to hit our strides as a team and unfortunately it proved to be too late in the end. There were certainly positives to take out, in particular the heart and fight that we showed towards the end of the season. As with everything however, there are plenty of learnings we can take away from this season as a team and as individual players and ensure that we come back stronger for the 2016/2017 season.

As the season started, the first ask for us as a team was to build a squad by getting to know one another, fill specific roles and start developing a team spirit that I see as the corner stone to ones' success. It took us a few games to settle in, have everyone available including movement between grades, to form a core group that ended up playing through the season. A victory in the first round was a helpful start to this!

At the end we were bitterly disappointed, not that we lost in the quarters, but that we saved our worst day of cricket all season for a knock out game! We knew we were not only good enough to get to the grand final but even win it and hence the way the season ended hurts even more! But that said, given where we were at the season start, I am really proud of the boys for the cricket we played and camaraderie we displayed.

We had a talented bunch of cricketers each with a distinct role, who played together well and most importantly enjoyed their cricket. As a captain this is what one strives to achieve, so one can extract the best out of the player. Whilst highly competitive and yet playing tough hard cricket, we made sure we enjoyed our time out in the middle and played like a close unit.

We had some highlights through the season, none more than two outright victories! Whilst these were thanks to our bowling effort let me provide some highlights with batting first.

Sameed played the latter half with us consistently and whilst he is a hard hitting all-rounder it was his bowling that stole the show. Always provided us an early wicket and sometimes a few more, he swung the ball and hit the deck hard (18 wickets in 6 games with us in the season). Tim, what a club man, played consistently throughout and bowled his heart out (21 wickets). Pace and bounce, when he was on fire like a spell on Day-2 in the QF, I'd rather be in the pavilion or watch from the non-strikers end. Tim also can hit the ball a mile and showed that in the very opening game of the season. Finally Shash, the young lad, got the new ball and made it talk. He was a consistent wicket taker (18 in all). However, it was his spells with the old ball in the latter part of the season that stood out. Against North West Sydney on a hot afternoon with an old ball he got the ball to reverse and move, taking two wickets in a spell that I will remember for some time to come!

This was the core, but thanks to the others who played with us too – Abbas, Charlie, Kieran, Sam, Luke, and his truly Simon. Simon bowled superbly and batsman found it hard to score off.

One thing I'd like to call out is that we went into Christmas placed second on the ladder only to come out the other side with one loss and a couple of washouts that pushed us back down! That was a disappointment but we fought back with two wins as we comfortably qualified for the quarters.

In closing I'd like to sincerely thank Peter, Simon and the committee for both their welcome, and their support. To our coach Sanjeev for his constant inputs, to my fellow captains for your support and understanding (especially Rehan and Paul as selections were never an issue) and to my dear friend and VC – Abhishek, for being my sounding board, my strength and source of advise.

#### Third Grade Captain's Report 2015/16

What a season we had in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade this year. It was a truly tremendous effort to find ourselves as the highest ranked side left with just one match to go to reach the Grand Final. Alas it wasn't to be.

The season started with murmurs in the Shires community about how poor we must be having spent some 75 overs accumulating 125 on day one of the season with debutant Satpreet making a half ton and VC Howie 40 odd, but this was the first of many building blocks to our hugely successful season. We defended that total bowling Auburn our for 61 with the introduction of the returning Simon Fairlie the pivotal moment. He finished with 5/8 including a bowled on his first delivery that rivaled Shane Warne's 'ball of the century' to Mike Gatting.

We moved on to Warringah where a solid and persistent bowling effort on day one saw us dismiss the MIG for 192 with Sameed being the star taking 3. He starred on day two along with Tim Grellman making 91 and 52 not out respectively to guide us home by 4 wickets. I think this was the day we realized we had a strong squad capable taking this season all the way.

Round 3 against a weak South Sydney could have been a disaster. We created enough chance to bowl them out more than twice, but we dropped a grand total of 13 catches on day one to see SS make a formidable and some what lucky 235. We then found ourselves 9/191 in response when junior Fairlie joined Kieran Pradeep at the crease. The two batted superbly, Simon unmoving in his solid defense and taking every opportunity to work a single to get KP on strike. Kieran plundered perfectly, taking advantage of every loose ball bowled and made a super star 83 not out to get us over the line by one wicket. If belief was high after beating Auburn and Warringah, it soaring after this win when we had played two of our worst days of cricket for the season.

We made short work of the chase with AJ Gray making a half ton before a declaration before stumps paid off seeing Lindfield one down second time around at the end

of the first day still trailing by 40 odd. Day two was very hard work, and in honesty we were outplayed by Lindfield almost to serious detriment. Clift claimed his first 10 fa in his career, but Lindfield batted perfectly leaving us 142 to chase off 28 overs. It was just enough time for both sides to have a sniff, and our final total of 7/36 was abysmal even taking into account the fact that we weren't trying to score off the last 15 to 20 overs we faced, but merely survive. Unfortunately, this set the tone for most of our batting performances for the remainder of the season.

We did put in a clinical one day batting performance against Roseville in the last round before Christmas, amassing 219 from our 50 overs with Giyan making 57, and Dylan and Saurabh 43 each, but in reality, that ground and against that attack, par should have been 300, so we even under cooked ourselves. Fez and Burf claimed three each and young Benny Smith took 2 to help dismiss the Roses for 95 and get us a bonus point. The win saw us sitting undefeated at the top of the table over the Christmas break, which was a great feeling for everyone involved in the squad.

The first game after the break was a rain affected one dayer against eventual Grand Finalists Epping that saw the stand in skipper sent in on a wet deck, and promptly bundled out for 101 with Epping taking a bonus point off us chasing it 3 down. It was bad enough to only have a one day game against Lane Cove, but to have it washed out as well saw 7 points go begging.

We then faced eventual premiers and our semi final opponent Burwood. An inspired century from Charlie Carter, his first for the club, saw us make a very respectable 169. Burwood batted very carefully against us and a number of lapses in captaincy judgment saw them pass us 5 down with only one half chance being missed. The way the game was played, and the caution shown by Burwood meant that we knew we could beat them if the opportunity came up again.

We then took on Georges River in what was to be a big rivalry for both sides. This first encounter saw one of the greatest come backs I have ever been involved in. We made a paltry 110 the first time around with Ben French the stand out with a half century. In response we had them 5/69 overnight. They passed us 8 down and declared 9/115. We knew what we wanted to set, but the gods didn't appear to be on our side when all we could do was hang around to make 102 with Satty hammering 32 at the death. Bolts and Burf set about their work having GR 4/6 at one point, and Clift and Simmo did the rest, bowling River out for 82 off the first ball of the final over of the match to take an unlikely outright.

We took on another finals contender in North West Sydney in round 12 and found ourselves in a familiar position being dismissed for 111 with Rosey the only one to make a mark on the scoreboard with 31 not out. Again we had the opposition 5/70 overnight, but they passed us 8 down. They had seen what had happened the week before and promptly shut up shop to make our lives difficult, batting well to end up all out for 183, Sam Bolton the pick taking 5 fa.There was little joy in the second innings, the game finishing with MUCC 6/113.

The final game of the season saw us needing to win with a bonus point against Southern Districts to guarantee second place and a home final. We played a great game that day bowling SDs out for 105 with Burf taking 4 and Dylan 3. The chase was done to perfection with Satty making 42 and the finishers Saurabh and Ben French bringing it home within the 30 overs to get us the BP. One of the best things I heard was of an SDs player asking one of ours where we were on the table. When the response was '2<sup>nd'</sup> the SDs player was surprised. He couldn't believe how relaxed we were for a team that high up the table about to play finals cricket and how much we just seemed to enjoy going out and playing the game and playing with this group of people. This I think was the key to our success all season; it was an amazing group of people to be involved with.

13 rounds done and we found ourselves second on the table only a few points behind minor premiers Burwood. We had performed well, especially with the ball and in the field to find ourselves here, and there was huge belief that we could go all the way.

Our QF appointment was with none other the Georges River, and their attitude to the game hadn't changed a bit.

Losing the toss, GR did what I hoped they would and batted first. We rolled through them just after lunch for 111 with Mark Fairlie cleaning up the tail to take 3/7. Our batting was a little shaky, but solid enough to get the first innings win on day one. We found ourselves 9/131 at sumps. A very important 30 runs and 25 overs was taken up by the skipper and Simmo on the morning of day two that took time and runs away from GR and from there they were always struggling. At 5 down when they finally drew level, the result seemed to be a foregone conclusion. GR were eventually all out for 91 the second time around with Dylan taking 6. We chased the runs needed for the outright 2 down and celebrated hard that afternoon. We were even louder when news filtered through that Burwood had been beaten outright in their QF meaning we had a home ground appointment with them in the Semi.

We did everything right come the semi, winning the toss and sending Burwood in, and then watching them make hard work of it for just over two sessions to make 132 losing their last 3 wickets for 0. Dylan again claimed the best figures taking four. We batted well in short bursts and found ourselves 3/70 at stumps with the Dharmadasa brothers at the crease. We steadily scored as we steadily lost wickets to be 8/124 at lunch with Rose and Mark in. Rosey fell and we needed 8 to win (7 to advance) with one in hand and a fairytale ending of Clift and Mark Fairlie at the crease to see us over the line was the prospect. Alas a horrible decision saw us fall 3 runs short of going through and rain put an end to any chance of an outright. It is the most gut wrenching loss I have ever taken at the club, and it is fair to say that over a month later I am still not over it...

Thanks to the committee for asking me to take charge of this grade this year, I always appreciate your confidence in me, and a special thanks to Simon for all the work he took on

this year at the club, you did an amazing job mate, and the club would be in a terrible state if it wasn't for your tireless work.

A big thank you to the guys who played multiple games for 3s this season but didn't get a run in the finals series; Kieran Pradeep, John Salmond, AJ Gray, my ever reliable VC Chris Howie, and Ben Smith who will be a star at this club in the coming seasons. Thanks also to Ben for doing the 12<sup>th</sup> man duties in the finals.

To the 11 who took on the finals games, Satpreet, Bolts, Burfy, Fez, Tinkerbell, G-spot and double Ds, Rosey, Saurabh, Frenchie and Chuckles, thanks for an amazing effort guys. As I said, we will all reflect once we get over that Burwood game on what a great season it was, and I really hope to be able to spend a lot more time on the park with you guys, or at least with guys who take the same attitude and perseverance on to the park each week.

To my fellow captains thanks for the cooperation through the season, and congratulations on what was a really successful MUCC campaign as a whole.

My final huge thanks goes to Helen (and Stephen) Rose for all their efforts during the season. These two deserve a medal for all the work they do for this club, and most of it seems to go unseen, and some underappreciated. But again, on behalf of myself, this squad, and the club THANK YOU VERY MUCH for making the experience of playing at MUCC so enjoyable and easy. Your support is so important to me and us, so much so that it can't be fully expressed in words.

This has been such an enjoyable season on and off the field and the people that have been around me for it are what made it so. I really hope that if we're not together as a group next season that we can instill the passion and attitude we had across the club. Thanks for everything guys, it's been a privilege to lead you this year.

Here's to a successful season, and bring on 2016/17!!

It was pleasing to see his continual improvement as a keeper throughout the season. Hopefully he'll keep at it. As the season progressed he also more settled into the opening bat role. He also has a bright future and is a future MUCC leader. Tony Barnes was, well....Barnesey. Always stoic, always giving 100% with the bat and in the field. Marty Payne joined us in the 3<sup>rd</sup> round and, as usual put his heart and soul into everything he did, taking 20 wickets at a strike rate of 36.

At various times we fielded probably the youngest sides a MUCC team has ever put on the paddock. In Rd 11 against George River, our side had three 14yr olds, a 16yr old, a 17yr old, an 18yr old and a 19yr in our team. Georges went into the match unbeaten at that stage, They sent us in on a grassy wicket expecting to run through us quickly. The young guys showed a lot of courage against probably the most hostile attack we faced during the season. Again we got ourselves into a position to win but weren't able to finish G.R off. We lost but it was a very creditable performance.

Our results could have been better but the young players gained a lot of experience which will hopefully benefit them in the future. Overall I was pleased with the enthusiasm and effort of the team.
