It gives me pleasure to provide my first report as President of the mighty MUCC Warriors.

I would like to start my report on a sad note, this season we lost club legend Michael "Roy" Denlow. "Roy" Denlow played for MUCC from 1974-2002 and played 234 games. He scored 4745 runs and took 58 catches. His highest score was 110 against Uni. of NSW in 4th Grade Cricket NSWCA (Grade Cricket) when he was captain. Michael captained MUCC at 4th Grade (NSWCA) level and 2nd Grade Shires level. He served on committee for a number of seasons. He was a quiet and undemonstrative player in the field but a fierce competitor with the bat in hand. I would like to extend my deepest condolences to Sandy, Greg and Brad on the passing of Michael. I was fortunate enough to have many a chat and a beer with Roy over my years at MUCC. He was always interested in the fortunes of the club and was always very keen to know how the club was faring. A nicer man you will never meet. RIP Roy.

On the field, our results were disappointing, no MUCC teams made the final series in Shires or the NSCA B/C competition this season. We also finished 12th in the Club Championship table this season. It is hard to put the results down to one reason however the club suffered from several lastminute pull outs on a Thursday and Friday nights throughout the grades. This meant lots of extra work for captains having to rearrange teams often to the detriment of the club. Moving forward members should be mandated to commit to a minimum of 11 games throughout the season.

Several players deserve mention for their wonderful seasons. AJ Gray hit 638 runs at an average of 79.8 this season across all grades. AJ also picked up 3 tonnes in second and fourth grade. His ton against Balmain South Sydney was one of the most tenacious centuries as AJ battled extreme heat stress to bat for near 60 overs. Josh Martin started the season with centuries in third grade against Roseville and Epping. Josh finished an average 46.5 and 511 runs this season with a top score of 129. Charlie Carter hit two centuries this season and finished with 390 runs for the season. Hopefully the lure of umpiring can be put off for another season. Congratulations to all other pewter winners for the season. It is interesting to note that we only had one bowling pewter for the season.

We were blessed with good weather for the club's fundraising efforts this season at the test match and the one-dayers in Sydney. It was disappointing to note the numbers of members who committed to volunteering and then failed to show for the day. We were able to raise just under \$4000 dollars from the sale of radio ears. Thanks must be given to Dave Deller and his company Sound Dec Pty Ltd who gave the club this opportunity. Hopefully more members can take up the opportunity of a free ticket to the cricket next season. An increase in sponsorship to cover the always increasing cricket costs needs to be considered for the new committee.

My congratulations to all MVP's and perpetuals award winners this season and especially Peter Saliba who was awarded Life membership of our great club. Furthermore, I would like to ask thanks all members of the committee for their efforts this season and thank both Clyne Fernandes and Peter Saliba who have both decided to step down from the committee for their contribution to the committee over several seasons.

I hope to see a large contingent of members at the 50th Anniversary celebration in September.

ADMINISTRATIVE ISSUES

MQ Students Numbers

About this time last year, MQ Sport notified clubs of a new banding structure for ground hire. Macquarie University Sport (part of Campus Life or U@MQ Ltd) makes a substantial loss every year which is offset by the revenue made from the Sports Centre. The new structure means that clubs are required to pay a percentage of ground hire based on student membership. Currently, we pay approximately 11%.

The ground hire banding is as follows:

<30% -	30%
30 - 60% -	20%
>60% -	10%

This scheme will not affect the club until next season. Looking ahead, the club needs to continue to make every effort and to engage more students to play. This is not necessarily restricted to the structure that we have at the moment – we can try to enter extra teams such as a Women's team to help our overall percentage.

Registration & Fee Procedures

This year you would have noticed that fees and registration procedures have been different from past years. MQ Sport requires all fees and registration to go through their payment portal and into a bank account overseen by them. This year was its first full year of using the system and despite some teething problem it worked reasonably well. At this current point the system only accepts credit/debit card payment and does not accept partial payments. We do accept that it isn't the most user friendly system and we will liaise with the university to try and make this process smoother next season.

LOOKING AHEAD

Pre Season: With the closure of Silverwater Indoor, the committee will be working on a new structure and venue(s) for the upcoming season.

Uniforms: The University has rebranded again by changing the colour palette. The black and red on our current uniforms has been substitute to charcoal, deep red, magenta and sand. This will affect our one day and training kits and the committee will be working with the university and supplier in due course.

MQ Student Incentive: The new committee will be working on a way to allow the current membership a chance to bring university students into the club. Details to follow...

50th Year Celebrations: The Sub Committee led by Simon has been doing a fantastic job in organising our Jubilee Dinner. It will be held on Friday September 15 at the Marriott.

Again, it was not the year we as a club wanted. If we pull together, work hard and remain committed to the task ahead, we will achieve the results that this great club aptly deserves.

An external audit of The Club's financial statements for the FY 16-17 was completed in August 2017, and the auditor was satisfied that the statements presented fairly the financial position of the club and the surplus attained or FY 16-17.

The audit for FY15-16 was presented to the Club's AGM in May 2017 and accepted.

FIRST GRADE CAPTAIN'S REPORT

The 2016/17 season saw First Grade endure a long and unforgiving season at the lower end of the table. Persistent injury, lack of fitness, and overall listlessness in all forms of the game found us beaten convincingly on many occasions. However, despite the ordinary table result, there were glimpses of high quality individual performance and improvement over the course of the season. The recurring story for First Grade was the regularity and ease with which teams could topple our batting order. Our bowlers faced an ongoing struggle to defend scores consistently below par. Furthermore, they were constantly hindered by the poor standard of fielding that often let teams off the hook at crucial moments. It was definitely a season that we can put behind us as we attempt to learn from what went wrong.

Notable season performances:

- Rehan Anjum (12 matches, 14 innings, 472 runs at 42.91 and high-score 77*)
- Danish Ahmed (12 matches, 170 overs, 26 wickets for 579 runs at 22.27 and economy 3.41)
- Sean Patterson (11 matches, 12 innings, 178 runs at 16.18 and high-score 84*; 91 overs, 13 wickets for 411 runs)

Much to our disbelief, the first half of the season did not unfold as we had anticipated. The side was injected with a host of new faces in what we expected to be a strong side. Although it was still early, the opening round saw one of the most promising First Grade starts for 4 seasons. Our first matchup was against relatively weaker opponent Roseville. The strength of our bowling attack shone through, dismissing them for just 129. However, the vulnerability of our batting also shone through as we crossed the line 9 down. A recurring theme with our batting began to creep into our performances over the next few rounds.

Unfortunately, the draw for the first half of the season set up a string of games against top six sides. Given our start to the season, however, we felt we were up to the challenge. Epping, Georges River, Northwest Sydney and Mounties all made quick work of us with the ball. Facing much stronger batting line-ups, we found ourselves in the field for lengthy periods of time and left with chases upward of 350 runs. Apart from the game against Burwood, we were unable to post much in reply as the top and middle order were regularly dismissed for 50 runs at the first drinks break. Rounds 3, 4 and 5 found us all out below the 150 run mark. Although there were many low team performances, Rehan consistently led from the front with the bat – top scoring in each of these games.

Pre-Christmas Highlights

- Rehan (77*) and Sean's (84*) 160 run partnership against NWS in the second innings to save us from losing outright
- Rehan's 77 runs against Lane Cove when we were dismissed for 136
- Rehan (60) and Sameed's (50) innings against Burwood in our highest score for the season
- Danish's 5/89 in 23 overs against Epping and 4/50 in 24 overs against Georges River
- Sean's 4/52 against George's River

The second half of the season gave us a look at some of the weaker sides in the competition, giving us a chance to redeem ourselves and aim for a chance at a top six spot. Due to injury and unavailability, the side was under perpetual recruitment and reshuffling just to get 11 men at the ground. Having to recruit players from lower grades and elsewhere to make a full team each week put a strain on the already lacking consistency of the team. The lack of consistency bled into our performances as we were repeatedly unable to stand up with the bat. One of the positive aspects that emerged, however, was the opportunity for players – particularly younger players – to step up in a higher grade.

The table for this half of the season didn't reflect the work the boys put in since Christmas. Due to washouts and heatwaves, we found ourselves getting used to the 50 over format. On more than one occasion we found ourselves up against the conditions with wet pitches, inconsistent bounce, and

quality bowling attacks to contend with. Some of the closer games of the season came against Warringah – all out for 160 in 45 overs on a wet and popping deck, chased down in 47 overs with 3 wickets remaining after their top scorer was given numerous chances. Batting on another wet deck against Strathfield put us at a substantial disadvantage as they were rewarded with a hard pitch when the sun came out. We were able to scrape away with a couple of very tight victories against Auburn and Pennant Hills to secure 13th spot on the ladder and avoiding the undesired wooden spoon. Despite a lack of noteworthy individual performances for the second half of the season, our team performances were slightly better when taking into account the circumstances.

Post-Christmas Highlights

- Rehan's 71 runs against Auburn to see us over the line in our second victory for the season
- Sean's 3/22 against Pennant Hills

In a season with more downs than ups, it's tough to reminisce over the fond moments of the season – rare as they were. With some much needed rest and relaxation before pre-season training in July, we hope to rebuild and return next season to hunt for a place in finals contention. In the 2013/14 season, First Grade saw a ladder reversal from wooden spoon victors to minor premiers in the timeframe of a year which is a target we seek to replicate. This season has exposed many players to the high standard of First Grade shires cricket. We can take comfort in the fact that there is still a hunger in those players to succeed, and to succeed at a high level of cricket.

SECOND GRADE CAPTAIN'S REPORT

What a season - difficult to describe. From the high of scoring 300+ totals on a few occasions to the lows of scoring a few 60's, from bowling out oppositions easily to being unable to get wickets, and from only a handful of wins with plenty of draws (6 of 13) to even a tie to show for! The best way to sum up the season is that although we won only two games, one of those was a convincing victory against the eventual premiership winners Burwood Briars – this speaks of inconsistency yet shows the potential and something we can leverage to improve on next season.

The year started with a depletion of some quality resources, not only in two's but also in one's, requiring number of players from our lower grades to come up. And they were up to the ask which is a good sign for MUCC, showing there is fair depth and talent within the club. However, this also meant new playing combinations after settling well last season and being a serious contender, and whilst we tried to re-settle into a new eleven, with further pull outs and injuries the side never really settled. What was heartening though is the good performance from a number of our players in two's meant that they got opportunities in one, and in some cases played the rest of the season there – James Campbell, Giyan Dharmadasa, Mohammed Adil and Ashwin Premkumar being cases in point!

Undoubtedly the standout player of the season was Charlie Carter – what a player, what a character and what a sportsman - role model to all of us! A special and warm thanks to my mate, it made the season a whole lot more fun and gave me the strength and support as we went through a pretty tough six months'. He dealt with personal tragedy, balancing that with his umpiring duties, yet making himself available when we needed and playing for majority of the season and ending up as the top scorer for second grade across all clubs and matches! He has a special pre-match trick which we perfected – take a few throw downs right under the opposition camp so they can see him striking the ball and let me tell you his swing consistently took the ball out of the park – a great mental way to start any game - not with words but action! With his talent, he converted that threat into opposition misery on a regular basis.

The season started with one of the most amazing innings you will witness. In some trouble chasing and then holding out against Roseville, James Jimmy Campbell, played a "light saberesque" innings that took him from 80 to 153* in about 30 balls as he smoked boundary after boundary (most through a swirl of the wrists that took the ball through mid-on) and even hit one of his first sixes! From trying to save that game, we went into a position where we would win it and eventually ran out of time by just a couple of overs! The game also outlined the all-round skills of James Jimmy Herron who took 2 wickets and scored a good 57 in partnership with the other Jimmy. Draw one, to start the season ...

... and draw two it was against Epping in round 2. This time some fighting and dogged batting by Ather Saeed (33*) towards the back end staved off the Epping comeback, this after we were on track to win the game thanks to a classy and elegant innings from Giyan Dharamadasa (80 odd and ran himself out – oh dear!) and a quick 46 from Aqif Khalil – an innings that highlighted a trademark shot of his through the season, a drive on the up over extra cover for six!

Round 3, enter Charlie Carter, and after falling behind at 7-45 and facing humiliation, along with super support from my friend Shabba Nabba (Nabeel Jamal 27) put on a partnership of 135 for the eight wicket and was on course for a double century. He was hitting the ball with will, to parts of the neighbourhood he wanted and residents were at risk around Tantallon Oval. That hitting rubbed off on Nabeel who hit probably an even bigger six onto the road and over. Charlie ended up with a swashbuckling and unbelievable innings of 137 that had 15 fours and 4 sixes, one where the ball went flat and so long that the players didn't even bother going to look for it. Ashwin opening spell was fantastic – quick and unplayable (4-25) and put us in a position to go for an outright – unfortunately a dropped catch on day two over one cost us the outright.

With points on the board, confidence and momentum took us into the game against premier winners Burwood. An all-round batting performance saw us get past 300 and the declaration wasn't taken well by a young bloke called the Double D's (Dylan Dharmadasa 34*) so he took the ball and got 4-41 to put in a performance that gave us points again! A superb win. Credit to the openers for a solid start, to the welcoming of Sharjeel Khanwise and Ben French (both of who's innings meant they would play one's for the rest / majority of the season) and to some good bowling and fielding to see us through.

Spin at the Northern – that's a mantra or rather a no brainer, and my season's spin twins did the job against George's River for us. Presso Simon Fairlie (3-44) and the cool and calm Anirudh Narasimhan (3-15) helped restrict GR to 191 but a "hat trick" and one of the seasons many batting collapses, broke our chase and handed us our first defeat – in Round 5 at that!

The remainder and latter part of the season saw the curve dip and we struggled to win more games. One close, very close game resulted in a tie, but that game was marked by yet another Carter hundred. This time we sat in the pavilion and laughed as Charlie picked the area the fielder had just been moved from, to clear the boundary and he hit some long balls clearing the Northern rope with regularity – that is difficult when you see the size of the ground!

There were a few standout performances, none better than AJ Gray's hundred that not only hammered down the opposition but also took a fair bit out of him on a sunny afternoon. A super final over bowled by Anirudh Narasimhan against Auburn in a tie, keeping cool as a cucumber and showing why he is one of the calmest characters on a cricket field (and off it too!). And finally, the emergence of an old timer in Ali Haider and the ability to hit as clean as Carter was a pleasure to see and we hope that he plays with us next year to score many more!

As I round off this report, I would like to thank the committee for giving me the opportunity to lead the side, Simon for his continued guidance, my fellow captains for making the season a pleasant one, and most importantly my team mates for their support and commitment. A special thanks to a few blokes who captained in my absence – John Salmond, Tim Morrow and my mate and close friend Charlie Carter.

THIRD GRADE CAPTAIN'S REPORT

A very up and down year for 3rds in 2016/17. We kicked off the year undefeated in our first three matches and made it look like we could replicate our 15/16 form of being unbeaten at Christmas, but from round 4 on it became a big task with consistent unavailability and tough opponents.

We defeated Roseville first up in a canter off the back of a Josh Martin century, and then beat Epping in a nail biter with Josh again toning up. A stubborn effort on a great deck cost Lane Cove a win as we drew 9 down after they batted 90+ overs. Then came our big test against last year's premiers Burwood who defeated us in the Semi last season by 3 runs. They put us in our place, unfortunately, and only a stubborn 10th wicket partnership between the skipper and Ben Smith prevented Burwood from putting us back in for a second try.

Playing another tough opponent in Georges River next made it a huge game. We posted a reasonable score, but they proved they had improved from last season where they lost outright to us twice, by passing our score 4 down. Round 6 against North West was probably our best win of the year, Clift and Smith again doing the heavy lifting with the bat as we crawled from 7/41 to post 88. The young NWS side buckled a little under the experienced pressure from Bolton, Burford and Clift to be bowled out for 82.

Season's can sometimes hinge on one game, and so it proved for us. Round 7 was a one day match against Mounties. Had we won this game we would have gone in to the Christmas break in the top 6... as it happened, we lost by one wicket and found ourselves in 9th... The most telling issue with this match was that we had 9 changes from the previous round...

After the break, and needing to win at least 4 if not 5 out of the 6 matches. I thought we were a good chance against Warringah. I have never seen a side so incapable of playing spin bowling. They posted 200 with half of it off the 30 overs of spin along with 8 of the 9 wickets. Alas, they bowled well, and we struggled to get the rate up high enough to make a plausible chase eventually bowled out for 160 with Marto contributing a half century.

It was now all or nothing against the competition leaders Auburn on a stupidly hot day. They were too good for us, and rightly so. They finished minor premiers on 80+ points, 20 ahead of second place. Tom O'Reilly taking 4 wickets including Auburn's first grade individual highest score record holder, and Kendall Hunt's resistance with the bat were the only real highlights.

Mathematics on the table were still on our side, but after a bizarre wash out day one against Souths, we sealed our fate at 5/5 in the first innings on day two. They rolled us for 50, with Karan Patel proving his value as a batsman. Pat O'Reilly's debut yielded him a five wicket haul, so there is still plenty of future in the O'Reilly name at the club! Despite having us 5 for negative 42 with overs to burn, South's pulled up sticks for the day. Rounds 11 & 12 were clinical one dayers for us. We bowled well, fielded ok, and only had to chase 105 against Strathfield and 67 against Pennant Hills. Winning both games with bonus points. Giyan took 5 against Strathfield, and Burf and Ishan Iyer took 3 each against Penno.

The final round was completely washed out, so as it happened, in the second half of the season, we played 4 one day matches and an all day one day match... not a great run when you're trying to build momentum. Last year where we finished second on the table, we had a grand total of 24 players play in 3rd grade for the whole season and 8 of them played 4 or less matches and 9 players play 7 or more. Which means we had a consistent core to the side. This season, we had 38 players, and only one of them made it to double figures in games played... this is a telling stat across most grades this year, and is something we must all work on for next year. Cricket is a big commitment for a whole season, but we need to make sure every grade ends up with those 8 or 9 guys who play 9 plus games a season... it's the only way to have continuity and create a positive culture in the team and the club. I hope that everyone can go away and have a think about that over the off season and come back committed to playing at least 10 games next year.

The highlights for the season were definitely Josh Martin's batting. He is an incredibly talented batsman, and his glove work is great to watch as well. Watching some young guys with the ball like Naba Haider, Ishan Iyer and a couple of other ringers from Mosman and Gordon was great too, and hopefully we can snare a couple of them going forward, as they are all talents that would fit in well around the club.

Another couple of highlights in terms of future prospects for me are Anantha Panchalingam and Kendall Hunt. AP showed he is growing in to a more mature and capable bat, and his keeping will come along. Kendall is a mysterious jack of all trades... the bloke bowls beautiful offies (taking 2 against Warringah), keeps (taking 5 dismissals against Souths) and is a very capable bat (if lacking a little luck sometimes!). More than anything his determination and tenacity are what make him my kind of cricketer. The runs will come mate.

Ben Smith was again a highlight for me. What he's doing doesn't always go right for Ben, but when it doesn't, he pushes himself to contribute in any other way in that match. If he didn't take wickets, he was working his ass off in the field, or showing the top order how to bat patiently, and vice versa. Ben was rewarded with selection in 2s in the latter part of the season.

Watching the Prez tweak away was as pleasurable as always too. The man is a machine with the ball in hand. Actually, he's not too bad with the bat in hand either. Fez nearly won us the Mounties game with the ball, he hung with Marto to get us over the line 9 down against Epping, and he held on for the 9 down draw against Lane Cove, despite playing the ball on to the stumps second last ball of the match. Aside from all his on field talent, he is an under-appreciated worker off the field for us. Yes he volunteered to be President this season, and yes he'd done a couple of years as secretary before that, but with the lack of volunteers at the club, he's had to cover most of both jobs the last two years, and cover the treasury this season. Simon needs help doing all this, his hair is already really thin guys, please, think about nominating for a committee position for season 2017/18.

I'd like to finish by saying thanks to the committee and the other captains for your help and efforts during the season. I guess we just put this one behind us and come back stronger next year.

MASTERS CAPTAIN'S REPORT SEASON REPORT

The season started with a few new names and a few key absences, namely the skipper Steve O'Reilly and his older brother Peter who had chosen to play Grade cricket with his son. Coupled with the absence for the first round of Greg Brown we had lost over a century of cricket experience and significant run-scoring and some potent wicket taking potential. Despite this we opened our account with a win against Burwood, welcoming back Hale and Greenwood after many years absence. Stu Cook, establishing a theme that was to continue whenever he played, dug us out of a hole to score a solid 40. Egerton and Folkard renewed the spin twin association and shared six wickets between them. Another victory in Round 2 against an understrength St. Ignatius Old Boys saw possibly the best shot of the season, a straight drive for 4 by David Gracie, followed by what was universally agreed as the worst shot next ball to be dismissed meekly. As always, entertaining. Rosie, Cook and Egerton amongst the runs and Payne and Cook leading the wicket takers. After 2 rounds we were leading the comp and Round 3 at Lindfield was to test our mettle.

After bowling Lindfield out for 169 with Payne getting 4 sticks, our run chase started well but when Steve Sidhu was dismissed for a violent 27, it was left to new boy Craig Hoskin and old hand Wayne Travers to steer us home. The next game was to be another tight one as Collaroy visited a slow and low Gwilliam. After setting a total of 136 with Sutton and Cook (again) making 40, Collaroy looked well in control until a flurry of late wickets saw them fall just short. Cook again with 3 wickets and Payne taking the crucial last wicket of the returned retiree. 4 wins from 4 and momentum was building.

Round 5 saw us host Lane Cove who won the toss and batted, scoring 162. Folkard and Egerton again shared the spoils but new man of mystery Craig Elliot, although wicketless, bowled a critical spell when things were getting away. As it was, this total was never going to be enough as the top 4 effectively did it on their own with Rose, Sutton, Gracie and Goulstone all amongst the runs. Undefeated with one game to go before Christmas, we hosted CCNSW at Gwilliam. Their performance defied their early season form and they bowled well and, after a slashing start from Sutton and Rose whose partnership managed 76 in 13 overs, restricted us to 152 despite the only half century of the year, 52 n.o. from Sutton. This game also saw the first Masters appearance of Peter Saliba. Despite a valiant effort in the field, and a few dropped catches, the opposition achieved the task with 2 overs to spare. Our first loss.

Christmas came and went and we faced Roseville in the New Year with a fair amount of rust and cheer on show. At 5-42 we were in serious strife before ring-in Pat Kelly (Bob's mate) saved us with a patient and crucial 40 before Coey and Marty Payne finished the innings off with some hefty blows. Roseville were never in the hunt as Folkard and Elliot shared the spoils. Our next game against traditional rivals Mosman was to determine the competition lead and unfortunately they were too strong. The batting of Cook, in what was his final game for the year, probably the only highlight. After heat caused the cancellation of our game against Ryde Hunters Hill, we played what was to be our last fixture of the year against Roseville Navy. This game saw the return of the evergreen Clyne Fernandes and the debut in Masters of Mayu Pasupati. Roseville batted and, after we claimed a few early wickets, they set a total of 182 that was to be way too many for us. The only saving grace was the sublime batting of Fernandes who finished not out 38 in a total of 125. Pasupati, who showed enough to warrant another game, suffered the misfortune of having his stumps thrown down from side on to be run out, a rarity in Masters.

In a year when we played our best cricket prior to Christmas, the final ledger of 6 wins, 3 losses and 2 unplayed (draws) left us in 6th place in a competition of 16. Highlights included the consistent batting at the top of the innings of Rose, Sutton and Cook (when he was there), the occasional grace of DG and Phil Goulstone, and the regular lower order contributions of Coey, Payne and Folkard. New boys Craig Elliot and Craig Hoskin certainly held their own and made significant contributions. Paul Chew played regularly enough to have a statue erected of him at Gwilliam. Our bowling was certainly of high quality with Folkard, Payne and Egerton amongst the top 10 wicket takers in the competition. Whilst it was a struggle to find players each week, the welcome re-appearance of MUCC stalwarts Hale, Greenwood, Saliba, Sidhu, Pasupati and Fernandes (albeit briefly) indicated we may have a slightly

larger pool to draw from next year. All in all we had 22 players represent the Masters and contribute to an enjoyable atmosphere throughout the season.
