SECRETARY'S REPORT

On the field this season, we had some success this season with our TCC 5th grade making the GF against Balmain South Sydney, we nearly came home with the chocolates losing by 8 runs against a strong BSS side.

Some records for the season.

Masters came second in their competition and won the Spirit of Cricket award for this season. GB was the top wicket taker this season, taking 17 wickets in 6 matches for MUCC Masters and taking his 231st 5fa for the club, followed by Skipper and MP (16 wickets respectively). Nads was the leading run scorer for Masters Nad's run tally was the 5th-highest in the competition.

Throughout the season, the club had 6 batting pewters and 7 bowling pewters. Andrew Burford and Benny Aitchison both had 2 pewters throughout the season for their bowling efforts. Tim Grellman had the highest score for the club this season with 151 and Umair had our only 8fa.

Training was on the whole was attended respectfully throughout the season. The club was fortunate to use Marsfield Oval on Thursday's when we weren't able to train at University Oval. To compete with the power house clubs in the competition the same number of members need to be attending training in September as well as February.

Social Events were limited throughout the season. Those who attended the "Dishlickers" night out and a good time and the customary Xmas drinks was also well attended by members.

This season our relationship with the University body has not been helped with the high turnover of staff at U@Mq.

There is one piece of information that I need to share with members for the upcoming season. U@Mq who have been in our corner for the last three seasons have fought and lost against paid parking at the grounds. This is a decision which has protested fiercely by all sports clubs. There has been one concession in that the parking has been capped at \$8 for the length of time a member is at the grounds. At the hours that the parking policy is in operation is from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m.

U@Mq acknowledges that this decision was not well received by the clubs. However, they say there is nothing they can do about it. By way of trying to circumvent this new policy. U@Mq have suggested that carpooling is an option to consider as well as parking on Culloden or Talavera Roads on Game Days. Members who decide to run the gauntlet will be fined. I can confirm that this policy does bring us into line as many clubs in both premier cricket who charge players to park at their grounds.

Thanks to all members of all the committee who were involved with club activities throughout the season. Thanks also to Phil who stepped up with Clifty managing some difficult player interactions throughout the season.

Lastly, it has been a pleasure to be involved in the running of the committee since 2007 and the executive for the last 6 seasons. It is my intention to step down from the executive tonight and allow the new committee and executive a chance to develop their own ideas and processes for our own club. I am still happy to be involved in the periphery to provide any help and assistance I can.

So lastly thank you members and I hope to see you at some stage in the pre-season.

There was a loss of 15.4K from the period 1 April 2018 until 31st March 2019.

Loss was due to:

- A large spend in equipment and clothing
- The need to now pay for our own change rooms
- Player payments
- Decrease in money from sale of radio ears

Going forward, ground hire fees will increase for the next season. We will need to control costs carefully. Can we afford to hire 3 change rooms? Can we afford player payments? A challenge for the next committee will be to focus on getting more revenue from sponsorship. The Ranch sponsorship now is negligible, money from radio ears is decreasing. With the increasing cost structure, we cannot just cover it by raising fees. I believe for us to be an on-going proposition we will need to raise an additional 15-20K through alternative sources such as sponsorships.

Second Grade Captain's Report

The end of another season in MUCC's rebuilding stage and there were a number of positives and negatives to come from the season. When all was said and done, we only managed to win one match for the season unfortunately. As a team, we had a pretty consistent core for the year, and this is one of the positives for me. His left arm fast bowling certainly adds another element to an attack, and again, when he was bowling well and had his head up, he was dangerous. Hopefully he can get a longer, consistent run up in 2s in seasons to come and push for first grade selection.

Ather returned for another season and was our MVP at the end of the year. He was the leading run scorer for the team (which is an indictment on the rest of the batting line up) with 169 runs at 24.14 and took 4 wickets. His bowling was good all season, and it's refreshing to have a bowler calling for a change when he knows things aren't quite going his way. I believe Ather probably has the potential to lead a grade at this club if he wants to take on more responsibility.

Our major weakness all season was scoring runs. At the start of the year we had Naji and Ravi opening the innings with Nick Pye at 3. This should have been a recipe for long innings and lots of runs. After Nick tonned up against Penno in our only win, he was lost to 1s for the rest of the season, and after 4 or 5 rounds, both openers were unhappy not contributing to the scoreboard. Naj finished with 129 at 11.73 and Ravi with 123 at 11.18. This left a hole at the top of the order.

For the rest of the season, I found myself at 1, 2 or 3, with Kendall (9.78), Matty Brown (35.33), Anantha, and Phil Erskine filling the other spots throughout. It was unfortunately not an order that was scoring fast runs. We did occupy the crease though. It was pleasing to see time being spent at the crease, and hopefully next season it will be time and runs... I think there were 4 or 5 occasions where we had 80 on the board from 60 overs which certainly wasn't bringing the crowds back.

Karan showed he has some talent with the bat as well ending up with a 13.13 average. Other cameos during the year were Shash scoring 74 from 2 innings, Giyan's 60, Rosie with 38 from

2 digs, Dave Gracie with 22 and Divanshu with 46. But it was the few games that the young fellas played that were the biggest bright light for the future.

Ben Bowie played one game against Roseville and his second innings staving off the outright showed great maturity and technique. Matt Stillen played a few games taking 6 wickets and scoring 66 runs in the process and contributions from Sean Eustace, Jayden Alchin (with some scary bowling too), Brad Denlow, Jags and Robin Atwal all showed that if we can hold on to these guys for a number of seasons we'll be much stronger in the coming years.

Attitude goes a long way in my books. There was a point this season where we had lost on first innings, and the effort started to drop off in the field. An important thing I said that day that I think all players would do well to hear, understand and accept is that you can't only want to play when things are going well. There will always be times when things are going badly, either for you, the team or the club. It's at these times that you can truly show your character. Stand up and show that you are still there for your mates on the field.

The final individual I'll single out in this report is Simon Fairlie. Fez had a tough season, playing intermittently and only managing 50 runs and 7 wickets (not helped by a number of dropped catches his first couple of games!). But despite all this, when he turned up he still showed the desire to do his best for the team and the club. He spent a fair bit of time on the super soakers, a lot of time on the score book, and a number of long innings supporting batsmen and the rest of the tail.

Something that was impressive in such a losing season was that we did not get beaten outright on any occasion. As I said earlier, we did have the ability to bat time even if we weren't piling on the runs, so credit to the guys for that.

Fielding as always was an issue at the club, but I believe there are plans for the coming season to address this. I will say one more thanks to Pete O'Reilly. My catching over the last couple of seasons has been a bit sub par, and Pete (and Tom and Pat) inspired me to improve this. I followed their regimen of simply taking 50-100 catches at training every opportunity I could, and it helped me improve out of sight. I can highly recommend it to you all if you get the chance.

Lastly, I would like to thank the committee for the opportunity to lead 2nd grade this year. It is always a pleasure to lead at this club. Also thanks for all their efforts during and prior to the season. The improvement was evident in the results. Well done to Simon Fairlie for your long effort leading the club, and I look forward to seeing you get back to just playing and enjoying your cricket. Pat Whipps has been huge all season. Thanks for all your efforts mate. To everyone who played 2nd grade, thanks for your efforts, and I hope you come back stronger and better for season 2019/20.

Masters Captain's Report

The 2018-2019 season was the most successful in recent years with the Masters mob finishing a creditable second behind a dominant Auburn team (which had recently merged with the Sri Lankan Lions). Overall, we had 21 players represent the club, with the mainstays being Egerton, Sutton, Pete O'Reilly, Rose, Folkard, Payne, Elliot, Griffiths-Jones, Kelly, Goonewardene, Brown, Elliot, Mohammed and Pasupati. In a season where 11 games were completed, we had 9 victories and our only losses were close run affairs against Mosman and the eventual champions Auburn.

This was a team that had many contributors as is evidenced by the statistics. We had seven different batsmen average over 20 for the season (a reasonable effort in Masters where the retirement score is 40). The standout performer was Nadeem Mohammed who scored 275 runs at an average of 69. He batted with elegance and aggression and was a deserved winner of the season's MVP Award. Peter O'Reilly had the next highest aggregate with 195 at 39, and at the top of the order with the evergreen Stephen Rose set a platform that was almost inevitably rock solid. Mayuran made the most of his appearances, also averaging 39 and definitely topping the strike rate. There were a couple of noteworthy innings that might not necessarily make the highlight reel but were crucial to some of our successes. The professorial Sutton, in the middle of some pretty serious medical treatment, scored a match-winning 40 retired in a tight win over Roseville Navy. Paul Chew, in a rare appearance this year, dug us out of a hole with a likewise match-winning knock of 32 against Hunters Hill. Kris-Griffiths Jones threatened to do damage all year and his 25 minute cameo of 32 against Auburn (before he had to race off to work) gave us a glimpse of what he was capable of. Down the order Folkard's innings of 25 against Cricketers Club rolled back the clock and he also showed his cool head to guide us home in the final fixture.

Likewise on the bowling front, the honours were shared evenly. Marty led from the front with 16 wickets, bowling with his mix of aggression and trickery. Whilst he was not always supported by the field or umpires, he bowled as well as he has bowled for years. Brown topped the wicket takers with 17 and was his usual nagging cunning self. His 5fa against Lane Cove when we defended a total of 92 was a highlight. Egerton and Folkard achieved 31 wickets between them but it was the spin revelation O'Reilly who added to the roster with his 12 wickets at 4.25. His 5-3 against Roseville White in his debut bowl for the year saw him become a regular part of the spin triumvirate. Nad and Craig Elliot picked up some handy wickets but the bowling performance of the year belonged to Savin Goonewardene who picked up 5-21 against the team who had shunned his approaches to play for them earlier in the year, Auburn. Bowling with his MUCC cap on (until he was asked to remove it by the baffled batsman) he cut a swathe through the heralded Auburn middle order. His bowling also sparked terse exchanges between KGJ and their batsmen, the latter being asked to remove his green and yellow shirt.

There were several outstanding catches this year, many in the same game against Burwood. Nad's one hander ankle-high behind square leg off Brownny, Marty's reflex caught and bowled and Mayu's running, diving special at long-on, all contenders for catch of the season. We

could also drop them, including seven in a day against Roseville Navy which made the game a little tighter than it ought to have been.

This was an enjoyable year. Mentioned must be made of Pat Kelly who travelled weekly from Newcastle to be a part of it. Every week there were memorable quotes including KGJ's quip to Wick who was trying to explain the signal for his arm ball: "You do the bowling, I'll do the keeping!" All part of the fabric of Masters Cricket. Maybe we can go one better next year.
